Sec. 61501. Unless the context requires a different meaning, the words defined in this section have the following meanings when

- **18 (F)** (e) "Illegal container" means a receptacle that contains
- 19 illegal oil or gas or illegal products.
- 20 (G) (f) "Illegal conveyance" means a conveyance by or through
- 21 which illegal oil or gas or illegal products are being transported.
- 22 (H) (g) "Illegal oil or gas" means oil or gas that has been
- 23 produced by an owner or producer in violation of this part, a rule
- 24 promulgated under this part, or an order of the supervisor issued
- 25 under this part.
- **26** (I) (h)—"Illegal product" means a product of oil or gas or any
- 27 part of a product of oil or gas that was knowingly processed or

- 1 derived in whole or in part from illegal oil or gas.
- 2 (J) (i) "Market demand" means the actual demand for oil or gas
- 3 from any particular pool or field for current requirements for
- 4 current consumption and use within or outside the THIS state,
- 5 together with the demand for such amounts as are necessary for
- 6 building up or maintaining reasonable storage reserves of oil or
- 7 gas or the products of oil or gas.
- 8 (K) (j) "Oil" means natural crude oil or petroleum and other
- 9 hydrocarbons, regardless of gravity, that are produced at the well
- 10 in liquid form by ordinary production methods and that are not the
- 11 result of condensation of gas after it leaves the underground
- 12 reservoir.
- 13 (l) $\frac{(k)}{(k)}$ "Owner" means the person who has the right to drill a
- 14 well into a pool, to produce from a pool, and to receive and
- 15 distribute the value of the production from the pool for himself or
- 16 herself either individually or in combination with others.
- (M) $\frac{(l)}{(l)}$ "Pool" means an underground reservoir containing a
- 18 common accumulation of oil or gas, or both. Pool includes a
- 19 productive zone of a general structure that is completely separated
- 20 from any other zone in the structure, or is declared to be a pool
- 21 by the supervisor of wells.
- 22 (N) (m) "Producer" means the operator, whether owner or not,
- 23 of a well or wells capable of producing oil or gas or both in
- 24 paying quantities.
- 25 (O) (n) "Product" means any commodity or thing made or
- 26 manufactured from oil or gas, and all derivatives of oil or gas,
- 27 including refined crude oil, crude tops, topped crude, processed

- 1 crude petroleum, residue treated crude oil, residuum, gas oil,
- 2 naphtha, distillate, gasoline, casing-head gasoline, natural gas
- 3 gasoline, kerosene, benzine, wash oil, waste oil, lubricating oil,
- 4 and blends or mixtures of oil or gas or any derivatives of oil or
- 5 gas whether enumerated or not.
- 6 (P) (o) "Supervisor" or "supervisor of wells" means the
- 7 department.
- 8 (Q) (p) "Tender" means a permit or certificate of clearance,
- 9 approved and issued or registered under the authority of the
- 10 supervisor, for the transportation of oil or gas or products.
- 11 (R) (q) "Waste" in addition to its ordinary meaning includes
- 12 all of the following:
- (i) "Underground waste", as those words are generally
- 14 understood in the oil business, and including all of the following:
- 15 (A) The inefficient, excessive, or improper use or dissipation
- 16 of the reservoir energy, including gas energy and water drive, of
- 17 any pool, and the locating, spacing, drilling, equipping,
- 18 operating, or producing of a well or wells in a manner to reduce or
- 19 tend to reduce the total quantity of oil or gas ultimately
- 20 recoverable from any pool.
- 21 (B) Unreasonable damage to underground fresh or mineral
- 22 waters, natural brines, or other mineral deposits from operations
- 23 for the discovery, development, and production and handling of oil
- **24** or gas.
- 25 (ii) "Surface waste", as those words are generally understood
- 26 in the oil business, and including all of the following:
- 27 (A) The unnecessary or excessive surface loss or destruction

- 1 without beneficial use, however caused, of gas, oil, or other
- 2 product, but including the loss or destruction, without beneficial
- 3 use, resulting from evaporation, seepage, leakage, or fire,
- 4 especially a loss or destruction incident to or resulting from the
- 5 manner of spacing, equipping, operating, or producing a well or
- 6 wells, or incident to or resulting from inefficient storage or
- 7 handling of oil.
- 8 (B) The unnecessary damage to or destruction of the surface;
- 9 soils; animal, fish, or aquatic life; property; or other
- 10 environmental values from or by oil and gas operations.
- 11 (C) The unnecessary endangerment of public health, safety, or
- 12 welfare from or by oil and gas operations.
- 13 (D) The drilling of unnecessary wells.
- 14 (iii) "Market waste", which includes the production of oil or
- 15 gas in any field or pool in excess of the market demand as defined
- 16 in this part.
- 17 SEC. 61502B. (1) THE OIL AND GAS COMMISSION IS CREATED WITHIN
- 18 THE DEPARTMENT.
- 19 (2) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:
- 20 (A) THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT.
- 21 (B) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR BY AND

- 3 (iv) TWO INDIVIDUALS WITH ACADEMIC AND TECHNICAL EXPERTISE IN

- 5 (v) TWO INDIVIDUALS WITH ACADEMIC AND TECHNICAL EXPERTISE IN
- 6 GEOLOGY OR HYDROLOGY.
- 7 (vi) TWO INDIVIDUALS REPRESENTING PRIVATE ENVIRONMENTAL
- 8 PROTECTION ORGANIZATIONS.
- 9 (vii) THREE INDIVIDUALS REPRESENTING THE GENERAL PUBLIC.
- 10 (3) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THE FIRST MEMBERS TO THE

- 9 (10) A WRITING PREPARED, OWNED, USED, IN THE POSSESSION OF, OR
- 10 RETAINED BY THE COMMISSION IN THE PERFORMANCE OF AN OFFICIAL
- 11 FUNCTION IS SUBJECT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT, 1976 PA 442,
- 12 MCL 15.231 TO 15.246.
- 13 (11) THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SERVE WITHOUT
- 14 COMPENSATION, AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SERVE
- 15 WITHOUT ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION. MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION MAY BE
- 16 REIMBURSED FOR THEIR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE
- 17 PERFORMANCE OF THEIR OFFICIAL DUTIES AS MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION.
- 18 SEC. 61502D. (1) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS
- 19 PART, THE COMMISSION SHALL EXERCISE SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY OVER ALL

- 4 (4) IN RESPONSE TO A COMPLAINT UNDER SUBSECTION (3), THE

- 6 (A) REQUIRE THE SUPERVISOR OF WELLS TO TAKE INVESTIGATORY OR
- 7 ENFORCEMENT ACTION AS PROVIDED IN THIS PART.
- 8 (B) REQUEST THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO COMMENCE AN ACTION IN
- 9 COURT AS PROVIDED IN THIS PART.
- 10 Sec. 61503. (1) The supervisor of wells shall designate
- 11 suitable assistants as are required to implement this part.
- 12 (2) The commission shall act as an appeal board regarding the
- 13 issuance, denial, suspension, revocation, annulment, withdrawal,
- 14 recall, cancellation, or amendment of a permit under this part.
- 15 When IF a producer or owner considers an order, action, inaction,
- 16 or procedure as proposed, initiated, or made by the supervisor to
- 17 be burdensome, inequitable, unreasonable, or unwarranted, the
- 18 producer or owner may appeal to the commission or the court for
- 19 relief from the order, action, inaction, or procedure as provided

- 25 salaries, shall receive their reasonable expenses while away from

- 27 member of the commission shall not receive compensation for

- 2 to reasonable expenses while traveling in the performance of a duty
- 3 imposed by this part. Salaries and expenses authorized in this part
- 4 shall be paid out of the state treasury in the same manner as the
- 5 salaries and expenses of other officers and employees of the
- 6 department are paid.
- 7 (4) The department of **TECHNOLOGY**, management, and budget shall
- 8 furnish suitable offices for the use of the supervisor and his or

- Sec. 61510. (1) If a person fails or refuses to comply with a
- 11 subpoena issued by the supervisor UNDER SECTION 61509, or if a
- 12 witness refuses to testify as to any matters regarding which he or
- 13 she may be lawfully interrogated, any circuit court in this state,
- 14 or any circuit court judge, on application of the COMMISSION OR
- 15 supervisor, **RESPECTIVELY**, may issue an attachment for the person
- 16 and compel that person to comply with the subpoena and to attend a
- 17 hearing before the COMMISSION OR supervisor and produce documents,

- 26 a civil matter or proceeding. The fees and mileage of witnesses
- 27 subpoenaed at the instance of the COMMISSION OR supervisor shall be

- 1 paid out of the general funds of the state treasury upon proper
- 2 voucher approved by the COMMISSION OR supervisor, RESPECTIVELY. The
- 3 fees and mileage of witnesses subpoenaed at the instance of any
- 4 other interested party shall be paid by that party.
- 5 Sec. 61517. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), the
- 6 circuit court of Ingham county has exclusive jurisdiction over all
- 7 suits brought against the department, COMMISSION, the supervisor,
- 8 or any agent or employee of the department COMMISSION or
- 9 supervisor, by or on account of any matter or thing arising under
- 10 this part. A COURT SHALL NOT GRANT A temporary restraining order or
- 11 injunction shall not be granted in any suit described in this
- 12 section except after due notice and for good cause shown.

- (D) (c) "Oil and gas" means oil and gas as such in combination
- 18 one with the other and also means oil, gas, casinghead gas,
- 19 casinghead gasoline, gas distillate, or other hydrocarbons, or any
- 20 combination or combinations of these substances, which may be found
- 21 in or produced from a common source of supply of oil, gas, oil and
- 22 gas, or gas distillate.
- **(E)** (d) "Pool" or "common source of supply" means a natural
- 24 underground reservoir containing or appearing to contain a common
- 25 accumulation of oil and gas. Each productive zone of a general
- 26 structure that is completely separate from any other zone in the
- 27 structure, or that may for the purposes of this part be declared by

- 1 the supervisor to be completely separate, is included in the term
- 2 pool or common source of supply. Any reference to a separately
- 3 owned tract, although in general terms broad enough to include the
- 4 surface and all underlying common sources of supply of oil and gas,
- 5 shall have reference thereto REFERS only in relation to the common
- 6 source of supply or portion thereof included within the unit area
- 7 of a particular unit.
- 8 (F) (e) "Supervisor" or "supervisor of wells" means the
- 9 department. as provided in part 615.
- 10 (G) (f) "Unit area" means the formation or formations that are
- 11 unitized and surface acreage that is a part of the unitized lands,
- 12 as described in the plan for unit operations that is the subject of
- 13 the supervisor's order as provided in section 61706.
- 14 (H) (g) "Unit expense" means any and all cost, expense, or
- 15 indebtedness incurred by the unit in the establishment of its
- 16 organization or incurred in the conduct and management of its
- 17 affairs or the operations conducted by it.
- 18 (I) (h)—"Unit production" means all indigenous oil and gas
- 19 produced and saved from a unit area after the effective date of the
- 20 order of the supervisor creating the unit, regardless of the well
- 21 or tract within the unit area from which that oil and gas is
- 22 produced.
- 23 (J) (i) "Waste", in addition to its ordinary meaning, means
- 24 physical waste as that term is generally understood in the oil and
- 25 gas industry. Waste includes all of the following:
- 26 (i) The inefficient, excessive, or improper use or dissipation
- 27 of reservoir energy and the locating, spacing, drilling, equipping,

- 1 operating, producing, or plugging of any oil and gas well or wells
- 2 in a manner that results or tends to result in reducing the
- 3 quantity of oil and gas ultimately recoverable from any pool in the
- 4 state under good oil and gas field practice.
- (ii) The inefficient production of oil and gas in a manner
- 6 that causes or tends to cause unnecessary or excessive surface loss
- 7 or destruction of oil and gas.
- 8 (iii) The locating, spacing, drilling, equipping, operating,
- 9 producing, or plugging of a well or wells in a manner that causes
- 10 or tends to cause unnecessary or excessive loss or destruction of
- 11 oil and gas.
- 12 SEC. 61702B. (1) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS
- 13 PART, THE COMMISSION SHALL EXERCISE SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY OVER ALL
- 14 OF THE FOLLOWING UNDER THIS PART:
- 15 (A) MAKING FINDINGS THAT PLANS FOR UNIT OPERATIONS HAVE BEEN
- 16 APPROVED.
- 17 (B) PROMULGATING RULES AND ISSUING REGULATIONS.

- 3 (B) DIRECT THE SUPERVISOR OF WELLS TO COMMENCE AN ACTION IN
- 4 COURT AS PROVIDED IN THIS PART.
- 5 Sec. 61730. The action of the supervisor shall be IS final
- 6 with respect to jurisdiction for an appeal before any regulatory
- 7 agency of this state, but any person may seek relief before the
- 8 commission or in the courts as provided under the laws of the THIS
- 9 state, and the taking of an appeal as provided in this part is not
- 10 a prerequisite to seeking relief in the courts. The place of
- 11 initiation of proceedings for review shall be limited to the
- 12 circuit court of the county of Ingham , which shall have HAS
- 13 exclusive jurisdiction of all suits brought against THE COMMISSION,

- 23 excused from obeying any subpoena for the reason that BECAUSE the
- 24 testimony or evidence, documentary or otherwise, may tend to

- Sec. 61733. Any witness summoned by subpoena or by written
- 24 request of the COMMISSION OR supervisor and attending any hearing
- 25 called by the COMMISSION OR supervisor is entitled to the same fees
- 26 and travel expense as provided by law for attending the circuit
- 27 court in any civil matter or proceeding. The fees and travel

- 1 expense of witnesses subpoenaed at the instance of the COMMISSION
- 2 OR supervisor shall be paid by the persons filing the petition.
- 3 Sec. 62501. As used in this part:
- 4 (a) "Artificial brine" means mineralized water formed by
- 5 dissolving rock salt or other readily soluble rocks or minerals.
- 6 (b) "Brine well" means a well drilled or converted for the
- 7 purpose of producing natural or artificial brine.
- 8 (C) "COMMISSION" MEANS THE OIL AND GAS COMMISSION CREATED
- 9 UNDER SECTION 61502B.
- 10 (D) (e) "Department" means the department of environmental
- 11 quality.
- 12 (E) (d)—"Disposal well" means a well drilled or converted for
- 13 subsurface disposal of waste products or processed brine and its
- 14 related surface facilities.
- (F) (e) "Exploratory purposes" means test well drilling for
- 16 the specific purpose of discovering or outlining an orebody or
- 17 mineable mineral resource.
- 18 (G) (f) "Fund" means the mineral well regulatory fund created

- 20 (H) (g) "Mineral well" means any well subject to this part.
- 21 (I) (h)—"Natural brine" means naturally occurring mineralized
- 22 water other than potable or fresh water.
- 23 (J) (i) "Operator" means the person, whether owner or not,
- 24 supervising or responsible for the drilling, operating, repairing,
- 25 abandoning, or plugging of wells subject to this part.
- 26 (K) (i) "Owner" means the person who has the right to drill,
- 27 convert, or operate any well subject to this part.

- 1 (1) (k) "Pollution" means damage or injury from the loss,
- 2 escape, or unapproved disposal of any substance at any well subject
- 3 to this part.
- 4 (M) $\frac{(l)}{(l)}$ "Storage well" means a well drilled into a subsurface
- 5 formation to develop an underground storage cavity for subsequent
- 6 use in storage operations. Storage well does not include a storage
- 7 well drilled pursuant to part 615.
- 8 (N) (m) "Supervisor of mineral wells" means the state
- 9 geologist, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 60101.
- 10 (O) (n) "Surface waste" means damage to, injury to, or
- 11 destruction of surface waters, soils, animal, fish, and aquatic
- 12 life, or surface property from unnecessary seepage or loss
- 13 incidental to or resulting from drilling, equipping, or operating a
- 14 well or wells subject to this part.
- (P) (O) "Test well" means a well, core hole, core test,
- 16 observation well, or other well drilled from the surface to
- 17 determine the presence of a mineral, mineral resource, ore, or rock
- 18 unit, or to obtain geological or geophysical information or other
- 19 subsurface data related to mineral exploration and extraction. Test
- 20 well does not include holes drilled in the operation of a quarry,
