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HOUSE BILL No. 4427

March 28, 2017, Introduced by Reps. Runestad, Lucido, Chirkun, Chang, Howrylak, Barrett and Gay-Dagnogo and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to exempt from disclosure certain audio and video recordings recorded by law enforcement officers with a body-worn camera in certain private places; to describe certain individuals who may request disclosure of those audio and video recordings; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain local and state law enforcement agencies.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "law enforcement body-worn camera privacy act".
 - Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- (a) "Body-worn camera" means a device that is worn by a law enforcement officer that electronically records audio and video of his or her activities.

- 1 (b) "Evidentiary audio and video recording" means an audio and
- 2 video recording of an incident or encounter recorded by a body-worn
- 3 camera, including, but not limited to, a crime, arrest, citation,
- 4 search, use of force incident, or confrontational encounter with a
- 5 citizen, that is useful for investigative or prosecutorial
- 6 purposes, including, but not limited to, criminal and internal
- 7 investigations.
- 8 (c) "Private place" means a place where an individual may
- 9 reasonably expect to be safe from casual or hostile intrusion or
- 10 surveillance but does not include a place to which the public or a
- 11 substantial group of the public has access.
- 12 Sec. 3. (1) The disclosure of any audio or video recording
- 13 recorded by a body-worn camera is subject to the protections
- 14 provided for crime victims in sections 8, 19, 19a, 21, 34, 38, 48,
- 15 62, 68, and 80 of the William Van Regenmorter crime victim's rights
- 16 act, 1985 PA 87, MCL 780.758, 780.769, 780.769a, 780.771, 780.784,
- 17 780.788, 780.798, 780.812, 780.818, and 780.830.
- 18 (2) Except as otherwise provided in section 4 and subject to
- 19 section 5, a recording recorded by a law enforcement officer with a
- 20 body-worn camera that is recorded in a private place is exempt from
- 21 disclosure under the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL
- 22 15.231 to 15.246.
- 23 Sec. 4. Except for an audio and video recording exempted from
- 24 disclosure under section 13 of the freedom of information act, 1976
- 25 PA 442, MCL 15.243, and section 1 or 5, any of the following
- 26 individuals may request a copy of an audio and video recording
- 27 recorded by a law enforcement officer with a body-worn camera in a

- 2 (a) An individual who is the subject of the audio and video
- 3 recording.
- 4 (b) An individual whose property has been seized or damaged in
- 5 relation to, or is otherwise involved with, a crime to which the
- 6 audio and video recording is related.
- 7 (c) A parent of an individual who is less than 18 years of age
- 8 described in subdivision (a) or (b).
- 9 (d) A legal guardian of an individual described in subdivision
- **10** (a) or (b).
- 11 (e) An attorney who represents an individual described in
- 12 subdivision (a) or (b).
- Sec. 5. (1) An audio or video recording from a body-worn
- 14 camera that is retained by a law enforcement agency in connection
- 15 with an ongoing criminal investigation or an ongoing internal
- 16 investigation is not a public record and is exempt from disclosure
- 17 under the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to
- 18 15.246, but only to the extent that disclosure as a public record
- 19 would do any of the following:
- 20 (a) Interfere with law enforcement proceedings.
- 21 (b) Deprive a person of the right to a fair trial or impartial
- 22 adjudication.
- (c) Constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
- 24 (d) Disclose the identity of a confidential source or, if the
- 25 record is compiled by a law enforcement agency in the course of a
- 26 criminal investigation, disclose confidential information furnished
- 27 only by a confidential source.

- 1 (e) Disclose law enforcement investigative techniques or
- 2 procedures.
- 3 (f) Endanger the life or physical safety of law enforcement
- 4 personnel.
- 5 (g) Disclose information regarding a crime victim in violation
- 6 of sections 8, 19, 19a, 21, 34, 38, 48, 62, 68, and 80 of the
- 7 William Van Regenmorter crime victim's rights act, 1985 PA 87, MCL
- 8 780.758, 780.769, 780.769a, 780.771, 780.784, 780.788, 780.798,
- 9 780.812, 780.818, and 780.830.
- 10 (2) An audio or video recording from a body-worn camera that
- 11 is retained by a law enforcement agency relating to a civil action
- 12 in which the requesting party and the public body are parties is
- 13 not a public record and is exempt from disclosure under section
- 14 13(1)(v) of the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL
- **15** 15.243.
- 16 Sec. 6. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a law
- 17 enforcement agency shall retain an evidentiary audio and video
- 18 recording recorded by a body-worn camera for not less than 30 days
- 19 from the date the recording is made. A law enforcement agency shall
- 20 retain audio and video recordings that are the subject of an
- 21 ongoing criminal or internal investigation, or an ongoing criminal
- 22 prosecution or civil action, until the completion of the ongoing
- 23 investigation or legal proceeding.
- 24 (2) A law enforcement agency shall retain audio and video
- 25 recorded by a body-worn camera for not less than 3 years after the
- 26 date the recording is made if the recording is relevant to a formal
- 27 complaint against a law enforcement officer or agency as determined

- 1 by the law enforcement agency.
- 2 (3) If a complaint against a law enforcement officer or law
- 3 enforcement agency is made after the expiration of the retention
- 4 period described in subsection (1) or (2) and a law enforcement
- 5 agency is unable to produce a recording related to the complaint in
- 6 any criminal prosecution or civil action, it must not be presumed
- 7 that the recording would corroborate either the prosecution's or
- 8 the defendant's version of events in a criminal prosecution or the
- 9 plaintiff's or the defendant's version in a civil action.
- 10 Sec. 7. A law enforcement agency may charge a fee for a copy
- 11 of an audio and video recording recorded by a law enforcement
- 12 officer with a body-worn camera. A fee charged under this section
- 13 shall be calculated under and in compliance with section 4 of the
- 14 freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.234.
- Sec. 8. A law enforcement agency that utilizes body-worn
- 16 cameras shall develop a written policy regarding the use of the
- 17 body-worn cameras by its law enforcement officers and the
- 18 maintenance and disclosure of audio and video recordings recorded
- 19 by body-worn cameras that complies with the requirements of this
- **20** act.

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
