HOUSE BILL No. 4430

March 28, 2017, Introduced by Reps. Howrylak, Lucido, Robinson, Marino, LaGrand, Kahle, Runestad, Chang, Johnson, Glenn, Dianda, Hernandez, Pagan, Victory and Inman and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to prohibit this state and certain other governmental agents, employees, and entities in this state from assisting a federal agency in obtaining certain forms of data without a warrant; and to prohibit certain uses of certain data collected without a warrant.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Fourth Amendment rights protection act".
- Sec. 2. This state or a political subdivision of this state shall not assist, participate with, or provide material support or resources to a federal agency to enable it to collect or to facilitate in the collection or use of a person's electronic data or metadata, unless 1 or more of the following circumstances apply:
 - (a) The person has given informed consent.
