June 8, 2017, Introduced by Reps. Wittenberg, Hammoud, LaGrand, Love, Neeley, Geiss, Chang, Gay-Dagnogo, Peterson, Rabhi, Cochran, Sabo, Howrylak, Byrd, Moss, Sowerby, Green, Phelps and Jones and referred to the Committee on Law and Justice.

A bill to create the immigration status inquiry and information collection act; and to prohibit certain inquiries, information collection, and the provision of information by certain individuals.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "immigration status inquiry and information collection act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Citizenship" means the status of an individual under custom or law as being or not being a legal member of a sovereign state.
 - (b) "Employee of a health facility or agency" means an employee of a health facility or agency licensed under article 17 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.20101 to 333.22260.

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- 1 (c) "Federal immigration authority" means any officer,
- 2 employee, or person otherwise paid by or acting as an agent of
- 3 United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement or United States
- 4 Customs and Border Protection, or any division thereof, or any
- 5 other officer, employee, or person otherwise paid by or acting as
- 6 an agent of the United States Department of Homeland Security who
- 7 is charged with immigration enforcement.
- 8 (d) "Law enforcement officer" means that term as defined in
- 9 section 2 of the Michigan commission on law enforcement standards
- 10 act, 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.602.
- 11 (e) "Physician or other health professional" means an
- 12 individual who is licensed, registered, certified, or otherwise
- 13 authorized to engage in a health profession under article 15 of the
- 14 public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16101 to 333.18838.
- Sec. 3. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law and
- 16 except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a law enforcement
- 17 officer, employee of a health facility or agency, or physician or
- 18 other health professional shall not inquire into the immigration or
- 19 citizenship status of an individual or citizen with whom he or she
- 20 comes into contact as a result of engaging in his or her duties as
- 21 a law enforcement officer, employee of a health facility or agency,
- 22 or physician or other health professional. A law enforcement
- 23 officer, employee of a health facility or agency, or physician or
- 24 other health professional may inquire into the immigration or
- 25 citizenship status of an individual with whom he or she comes into
- 26 contact as a result of engaging in his or her duties as a law
- 27 enforcement officer, employee of a health facility or agency, or

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- 1 physician or other health professional if the inquiry relates to a
- 2 legitimate law enforcement purpose that is unrelated to the
- 3 enforcement of a civil immigration law, or is required by state or
- 4 federal law to verify the eligibility of an individual for a
- 5 benefit, service, or license.
- 6 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a law
- 7 enforcement officer shall not voluntarily release personally
- 8 identifiable data or information to a federal immigration authority
- 9 regarding an individual's release date, home address, or any other
- 10 information that may be used to ascertain an individual's religion,
- 11 ethnicity, or race, unless the release of the data or information
- 12 is for a legitimate law enforcement purpose unrelated to the
- 13 enforcement of a civil immigration law.
- 14 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an employee of
- 15 a health facility or agency or a physician or other health
- 16 professional who receives information regarding an individual's
- 17 immigration or citizenship status with whom he or she comes into
- 18 contact as a result of engaging in his or her duties as an employee
- 19 of a health facility or agency or a physician or other health
- 20 professional shall treat that information confidentially in the
- 21 same manner as an individual's personal and medical records as
- 22 provided in section 20201(2)(c) of the public health code, 1978 PA
- 23 368, MCL 333.20201.
- 24 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 25 date it is enacted into law.

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
