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HOUSE BILL No. 4734

June 8, 2017, Introduced by Rep. Moss and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 23, 24e, 24f, 24h, 28, 821, and 830 (MCL 168.23, 168.24e, 168.24f, 168.24h, 168.28, 168.821, and 168.830), section 23 as amended by 2012 PA 417, sections 24f and 24h as amended by 1982 PA 154, and section 821 as amended by 2003 PA 302.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 23. (1) The chief or only judge of probate of the county or probate court district, the county clerk, and the county treasurer shall constitute a board of county election commissioners for each county. , 2 of whom shall be a quorum for the transaction of business. The chief or only judge of probate of the county or probate court district and the county clerk shall act respectively

- 1 as chairperson and secretary of the board. In the absence or
- 2 disqualification of the county clerk from any meeting of the board
- 3 of county election commissioners, the board may select 1 of the
- 4 county clerk's deputies to act in the county clerk's place. In the
- 5 absence or disqualification of any member of the board of county
- 6 election commissioners other than the county clerk, the members of
- 7 the board who are present shall appoint some other county officer
- 8 THE COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY OR COUNTY SHERIFF in the absent or
- 9 disqualified member's place, and the appointed county officer, on
- 10 being notified, shall attend without delay and act as a member of
- 11 the board.
- 12 (2) If a member of the board is involved in the recall of an
- 13 officer, either by assisting in the preparation of the petition for
- 14 recall or by being an officer whose recall is sought, then the
- 15 member of the board shall be IS disqualified with respect to any
- 16 determination under section 952 and shall MUST be replaced as
- 17 provided in this section.
- 18 Sec. 24e. (1) The board shall meet as necessary to transact
- 19 their business, and during the month of January in each even
- 20 numbered year elect one-1 of their members chairman CHAIRPERSON and
- 21 one 1 as vice-chairman. VICE-CHAIRPERSON. Any 3 members shall
- 22 constitute a quorum, but no action shall become BECOMES effective
- 23 unless 1 member from each political party represented concurs
- 24 therein. IN THE ACTION.
- 25 (2) The county clerk shall be IS the clerk of the board of
- 26 county canvassers. The board of county canvassers may employ such
- 27 ANY assistants as are necessary TO adequately to-perform the duties

- 1 of the board. , and the THE payment for the assistants shall MUST
- 2 be in amounts authorized by the board of county canvassers COUNTY
- 3 CLERK and shall MUST be paid from an appropriation made for that
- 4 purpose by the COUNTY board of supervisors prior to COMMISSIONERS
- 5 **BEFORE** the canvass.
- 6 Sec. 24f. (1) In counties having a population of 475,000 or
- 7 more but less than $\frac{1,500,000}{1,000,000}$, the members of the board
- 8 of county canvassers shall MUST receive actual and necessary
- 9 expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties, and
- 10 in addition shall MUST be paid at a rate which is equal to the per
- 11 diem rate paid to the county board of commissioners for meetings,
- or which is equal to 1/2% of the annual salary paid to members of
- 13 the county board of commissioners, whichever is greater. Payments
- 14 for meetings and reimbursement of expenses shall MUST be paid by
- 15 the county treasurer upon the warrant of the county clerk.
- 16 (2) In counties having a population of less than 475,000, the
- 17 members of the board of county canvassers shall MUST receive actual
- 18 and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their
- 19 official duties, and in addition shall MUST be paid the same daily
- 20 rate as is paid the members of the COUNTY board of commissioners
- 21 for meetings. Payments for meetings and reimbursement of expenses
- 22 shall MUST be paid by the county treasurer upon the warrant of the
- 23 county clerk.
- Sec. 24h. In counties having a population of 1,500,000
- 25 1,000,000 or more, the members of the board of county canvassers
- 26 shall MUST receive actual and necessary expenses incurred in the
- 27 performance of their official duties, and in addition shall MUST be

- 1 paid a daily rate of \$25.00 for meetings and \$50.00 for recounts.
- 2 Payments for meetings, recounts, and reimbursement of expenses
- 3 shall MUST be paid by the county treasurer upon the warrant of the
- 4 county clerk.
- 5 Sec. 28. Members of the various boards of election
- 6 commissioners and boards of canvassers and any other person charged
- 7 with duties in connection with the conduct of primaries, elections,
- 8 canvassing of returns, and recounts shall MUST receive such
- 9 compensation as shall be—IS determined by the legislative body of
- 10 the THIS state, THE county, THE city, THE township, or THE village,
- 11 as the case may be.APPLICABLE.
- 12 Sec. 821. (1) The EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2), THE
- 13 board of county canvassers shall meet at the office of the county
- 14 clerk at 1 p.m. 9 A.M. on the day THURSDAY after the day of a
- 15 general election, August primary, or presidential primary election,
- 16 OR OTHER ELECTION HELD in the county. Except as provided in
- 17 subsection (2), for other elections the board shall meet within 5
- 18 days following the election.
- 19 (2) If, at an election held on the May regular election date,
- 20 a ballot question appears on the ballot concerning AN authorized
- 21 millage that is subject to a millage reduction as provided in
- 22 section 34d of the general property tax act, 1893 PA 206, MCL
- 23 211.34d, the board of county canvassers shall meet to canvass and
- 24 certify the results of the vote on that proposition after May 31
- 25 and before June 15 following the election.
- 26 Sec. 830. Each county canvasser and county clerk shall MUST
- 27 receive such—reasonable compensation for services performed

- 1 pursuant to the provisions of UNDER this act as shall be ARE
- 2 allowed by the COUNTY board of supervisors or county auditors,
- 3 COMMISSIONERS, which compensation shall MUST be paid out of the
- 4 treasury of the county.
- 5 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 6 after the date it is enacted into law.
