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HOUSE BILL No. 4806

June 20, 2017, Introduced by Rep. Lucido and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
by amending section 3112b (MCL 324.3112b), as added by 1998 PA 4.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 3112b. (1) When a permit for a discharge from a combined sewer system is issued or renewed under this part, the department shall require **BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING** as a condition **CONDITIONS** of the permit: that

(A) THAT eaves troughs and roof downspouts for the collection of storm water STORMWATER throughout the tributary service area are not directly connected to the sewer system. The department may allow the permittee up to 1 year to comply with this provision SUBDIVISION for residential property and up to 5 years for

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- 1 commercial and industrial properties.
- 2 (B) THAT THE PERMITTEE IMPLEMENT A NOTIFICATION SYSTEM,
- 3 APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT, FOR ALL USERS OF THE COMBINED SEWER
- 4 SYSTEM TO ALERT THE USERS THAT ATMOSPHERIC CONDITIONS POSE A THREAT
- 5 OF A SEWAGE DISCHARGE AND THAT A REDUCTION IN WATER USAGE COULD
- 6 PREVENT OR MINIMIZE THE THREAT. THE NOTIFICATION SYSTEM MAY PROVIDE
- 7 FOR DIFFERENT ALERTS BASED UPON THE MAGNITUDE OF THE THREAT.
- 8 (2) Subsection (1) (1) (A) does not apply if the permittee
- 9 demonstrates to the satisfaction of the department that the
- 10 disconnection of downspouts and eaves troughs is not a cost-
- 11 effective means of reducing the frequency or duration of combined
- 12 sewer overflows or of maintaining compliance with discharge
- 13 requirements.
- 14 (3) As used in this section, "combined sewer system" means a
- 15 sewer designed and used to convey both storm water STORMWATER
- 16 runoff and sanitary sewage, and which contains lawfully installed
- 17 regulators and control devices that allow for delivery of sanitary
- 18 flow to treatment during dry weather periods and divert storm water
- 19 STORMWATER and sanitary sewage to surface waters during storm flow
- 20 periods.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 22 after the date it is enacted into law.
