- (v) A PERSON'S LIABILITY FOR THE DEATH OR INJURY OF AN
 INDIVIDUAL, OR FOR PROPERTY DAMAGE, CAUSED BY THE USE OF FIREWORKS.
- 3 (2) A person that knows, or should know, that he or she—THE
- 4 PERSON is required to comply with subsection (1) and who THAT fails
- 5 or neglects to do so is responsible for a civil fine of \$2,500.00
- 6 for each violation. Each day that a person is in noncompliance
- 7 constitutes a separate violation.
- 8 (3) During periods when consumer fireworks are sold, each
- 9 retail location selling consumer fireworks either shall be added as
- 10 an additional insured, or public liability and product liability
- 11 insurance coverage shall be obtained and maintained, in an amount
- 12 not less than \$10,000,000.00 per occurrence. A person that knows,
- 13 or should know, that he or she THE PERSON is required to comply
- 14 with this subsection and who THAT fails or neglects to do so is
- 15 liable RESPONSIBLE for a civil fine of not more than \$5,000.00.
- 16 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 17 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 18 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 19 unless Senate Bill No. ____ or House Bill No. ____ (request no.
- 20 04027'17) of the 99th Legislature is enacted into law.
