## **HOUSE BILL No. 4994**

September 20, 2017, Introduced by Rep. Kosowski and referred to the Committee on Families, Children, and Seniors.

A bill to amend 1981 PA 180, entitled

"Older Michiganians act,"

by amending sections 2 and 6 (MCL 400.582 and 400.586), section 2 as amended by 1987 PA 35 and section 6 as amended by 2014 PA 78.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
  - (A) "AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY" MEANS THE AGENCY CREATED IN EXECUTIVE REORGANIZATION ORDER NO. 2015-1, MCL 400.27, TO ASSUME THE AUTHORITY, POWERS, DUTIES, FUNCTIONS, AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE OFFICE OF SERVICES TO THE AGING.
  - (B)  $\frac{(a)}{(a)}$  "Area agency on aging" means an agency designated by the commission under section  $\frac{4(i)}{(1)}$ .
    - (C) (b) "Chief elected official administrative officer" means

- 1 any of the following:
- 2 (i) The president of a village.
- (ii) The mayor of a city.
- 4 (iii) The supervisor of a township.
- 5 (iv) The elected county executive or appointed county manager
- 6 of a county; or if the county has not adopted an optional unified
- 7 form of county government, the chairperson of the county board of
- 8 commissioners of the county.
- 9 (D) (c) "Commission" means the commission on services to the
- 10 aging established under section 3.
- 11 (E) (d) "Director" means the director of the office of
- 12 services to the aging AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY.
- (F) (e) "Long-term care facility" means 1 or more of the
- 14 following:
- 15 (i) A home for the aged as defined in section  $\frac{20106(3)}{20106}$
- 16 of the public health code, Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978,
- 17 being section 333.20106 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.1978 PA 368,
- 18 MCL 333.20106.
- 19 (ii) An adult foster care facility as defined in section  $\frac{3(4)}{4}$
- 20 3 of the adult foster care facility licensing act, Act No. 218 of
- 21 the Public Acts of 1979, being section 400.703 of the Michigan
- 22 Compiled Laws.1979 PA 218, MCL 400.703.
- 23 (iii) A nursing home as defined in section  $\frac{20109(1)}{20109}$  of
- 24 Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978, being section 333.20109 of
- 25 the Michigan Compiled Laws. THE PUBLIC HEALTH CODE, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 26 333.20109.
- (iv) A county medical care facility as defined in section

- 1 20104(4) of Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978, being section
- 2 333.20104 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.20104 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH
- 3 CODE, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.20104.
- 4 (v) A hospital long-term care unit as defined in section
- 5 20106(6) 20106 of Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978. THE PUBLIC
- 6 HEALTH CODE, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.20106.
- 7 (G) (f) "Office" means the office of services to the aging
- 8 created by section 5 OR ANY SUCCESSOR AGENCY ESTABLISHED TO CARRY
- 9 OUT THE DUTIES OF THIS ACT. A REFERENCE TO OFFICE IN THIS ACT IS A
- 10 REFERENCE TO THE AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY.
- 11 (H) (g) "Older person" means a state resident who is 60 years
- 12 of age or older, and the spouse of the older person, regardless of
- **13** age.
- 14 Sec. 6. The office of services to the aging AND ADULT SERVICES
- 15 AGENCY shall do all of the following:
- 16 (a) Serve as a visible and effective advocate for aging and
- 17 older persons.
- 18 (b) Function as the single state agency within this state to
- 19 supervise and administer the state plan required by the older
- 20 Americans act of 1965, 42 USC 3001 to 3058ff.
- 21 (c) Be primarily responsible for the coordination of all state
- 22 activities related to the purposes of this act.
- 23 (d) Cooperate with agencies of the state and federal
- 24 government and receive funds for any purpose authorized by the
- 25 legislature.
- (e) Make necessary contracts incidental to the performance of
- 27 its duties and the execution of its policies.

- 1 (f) Provide technical assistance to state and local agencies
- 2 for the purposes of planning, program development, administration,
- 3 and evaluation; and encourage, promote, and aid in the
- 4 establishment of services for aging and older persons.
- 5 (g) Collect, analyze, and disseminate data concerning services
- 6 which THAT affect aging and older persons.
- 7 (h) Establish an educational and public information program to
- 8 foster public understanding of the problems and opportunities of
- 9 aging and older persons; provide information on programs available
- 10 to assist older persons; and encourage the development of private
- 11 and public community programs to improve the status of older
- 12 persons.
- 13 (i) Evaluate the effect of federal and state statutes on aging
- 14 and older persons and recommend to the governor and the legislature
- 15 appropriate changes.
- 16 (j) Evaluate, in cooperation with appropriate state
- 17 departments and agencies, the effectiveness of public and private
- 18 policies that affect older persons in the state and that are funded
- 19 by federal, state, local, and private resources, including services
- 20 that provide a comprehensive and integrated system of health and
- 21 social HUMAN services that respond to individual needs.
- (k) Supervise, monitor, assess, evaluate, and provide
- 23 technical assistance to area agencies on aging, and other agencies
- 24 receiving funds from the office, in meeting specified objectives.
- (l) Make recommendations to the governor and the legislature
- 26 on budget and grant requests for programs for aging and older
- 27 persons.

- 1 (m) Participate in the development of the annual report of
- 2 services that is required to be submitted to the department of
- 3 health and human services UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND
- 4 HUMAN SERVICES under section 2004 of Title XX of the social
- 5 security act, 42 USC 1397c, and provide recommendations to the
- 6 governor on the components of the plan that relate to services to
- 7 aging and older persons.
- 8 (n) Develop a comprehensive triennial state plan on aging with
- 9 yearly updates regarding the priority needs of aging and older
- 10 persons, as well as recommendations for future action. The office
- 11 AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY shall prepare an annual report to
- 12 be submitted to the governor and the legislature by January 31 of
- 13 each year. The annual report shall detail the progress of the
- 14 office AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY and the commission in
- 15 implementing the triennial plan.
- 16 (o) Establish an appeals procedure, subject to approval by the
- 17 commission, the applicability of which shall not be limited to
- 18 denials of funding.
- 19 (p) Serve as a clearinghouse for the collection and
- 20 distribution of information on aging and older persons.
- 21 (q) Establish demonstration programs for services to the aging
- 22 and older persons in selected communities in the state. Particular
- 23 emphasis shall be given to services designed to foster continued
- 24 participation of older persons in family and community life and to
- 25 prevent as nearly as possible unnecessary institutionalization of
- 26 older persons. The programs shall be established to demonstrate and
- 27 test their effectiveness, to stimulate continued support for them,

- 1 and to create new services, using federal, state, local, or private
- 2 funds and resources.
- 3 (r) Function as the state agency for voluntary services for,
- 4 and provided by, older persons. The office AGING AND ADULT SERVICES
- 5 AGENCY shall do all of the following:
- 6 (i) Be designated as the state agency for coordination and
- 7 development of foster grandparent and senior companion programs.
- 8 The office AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY is authorized: to
- 9 receive and allocate funds from federal, state, and other sources
- 10 for foster grandparent and senior companion programs; to negotiate
- 11 waivers with the federal agency responsible for administering
- 12 foster grandparent and senior companion programs and funds; and, in
- 13 cases where federal foster grandparent and senior companion
- 14 programs cannot be modified, to institute policies and rule
- 15 variations with subprograms of foster grandparent and senior
- 16 companion programs distinctly established through the use of state
- 17 funds. Administrative agencies established before October 6, 1976,
- 18 to develop and administer foster grandparent and senior companion
- 19 programs are continued under this act according to contracts
- 20 initiated with the federal government. This subparagraph does not
- 21 prohibit the termination of a grantee for cause. Expansion of
- 22 foster grandparent and senior companion programs shall be
- 23 administered under existing programs where feasible. Other state
- 24 and local governmental agencies serving children, youth, and
- 25 developmentally disabled persons in need of protective care and
- 26 treatment in institutional and community settings shall cooperate
- 27 with the office AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY in the development

- 1 and administration of voluntary services for, and provided by,
- 2 aging and older persons. The office AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY
- 3 may negotiate with the federal administration to obtain the same
- 4 nontaxable status for state funded foster grandparent and senior
- 5 companion stipends as that given to participants in the federal
- 6 program.
- 7 (ii) Be designated as the state agency for coordination and
- 8 development of retired senior volunteer programs. The office AGING
- 9 AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY is authorized: to receive and allocate
- 10 funds from federal, state, and other sources for retired senior
- 11 volunteer programs; to negotiate waiver of rules with the federal
- 12 agency responsible for administering retired senior volunteer
- 13 programs and funds; and, in cases where federal retired senior
- 14 volunteer programs cannot be modified, to institute policies and
- 15 rule variations with subprograms of retired senior volunteer
- 16 programs distinctly established through the use of state funds.
- 17 Administrative agencies established before October 1, 1978, to
- 18 develop and administer retired senior volunteer programs are
- 19 continued under this act according to contracts initiated with the
- 20 federal government. Nothing in this subparagraph prohibits the
- 21 termination of a grantee for cause. Expansion of retired senior
- 22 volunteer programs shall be administered under existing programs
- 23 where feasible. Other state and local governmental agencies shall
- 24 cooperate with the office AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY in the
- 25 development and administration of voluntary services for, and
- 26 provided by, aging and older persons.
- 27 (s) Establish, evaluate, and improve opportunities for aging

- 1 and older persons to provide volunteer services.
- 2 (t) Pursue and receive on behalf of the state any grant or
- 3 gift and accept any grant or gift so that the title passes to the
- 4 state. All grants and gifts shall be deposited with the state
- 5 treasurer and used for the purposes set forth in the grant or the
- 6 gift if the purposes are within the powers conferred on the office
- 7 AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY and the use is approved by the
- 8 legislature. If the use is not approved, the grant or gift shall
- 9 revert to the donor, or the donor's administrator or assigns.
- (u) Train and assign staff who shall institute food delivery
- 11 systems, inform older persons of the delivery systems, and train
- 12 older persons to operate the food delivery systems. The office
- 13 AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY shall also do all of the following:
- (i) Develop means to reduce the cost of food to older persons
- 15 and increase the nutritional adequacy of food purchased and
- 16 consumed.
- 17 (ii) Provide technical assistance to local clubs, groups, or
- 18 organizations of older persons for the development of buying clubs,
- 19 food cooperatives, or shopping assistance programs; provide
- 20 education in purchase and preparation of foods; and encourage
- 21 retail grocers to package raw food in meal-size portions.
- 22 (iii) Provide ongoing assistance until the individual projects
- 23 become self-sufficient.
- 24 (iv) Coordinate and develop efforts in conjunction with those
- 25 of other state or local public or private agencies such as the
- 26 cooperative extension services, public health agencies, senior
- 27 nutrition projects, the department of **HEALTH AND** human services,

- 1 the retail grocers association, the department of agriculture and
- 2 rural development, and others considered appropriate by the
- 3 office. AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY.
- 4 (v) Provide in its annual report to the governor and the
- 5 legislature under subdivision (n), a report on the effect of the
- 6 programs.
- 7 (vi) Provide trained personnel, technical assistance, and
- 8 coordination with other state agencies.
- 9 (v) Function as the administrator of employment programs and
- 10 related services for, and provided by, older persons. The office
- 11 AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY shall encourage the employment of
- 12 older persons in government agencies and private organizations.
- 13 (w) Subject to 1941 PA 370, MCL 38.401 to 38.428, and the
- 14 rules of the state civil service commission, ensure that preference
- 15 is given to older persons in employment by the office AGING AND
- 16 ADULT SERVICES AGENCY and all recipients of funds from the
- 17 office. AGING AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY.
- 18 (x) Encourage the development of preretirement and
- 19 postretirement programs for older persons.
- 20 (y) Develop, in consultation with the various components of
- 21 the aging network, basic core needs assessment and evaluation
- 22 instruments. The office AGENCY AND ADULT SERVICES AGENCY shall
- 23 provide technical assistance to aid local organizations in
- 24 augmenting these core instruments.
- 25 (z) Provide adequate and effective opportunities for older
- 26 persons to express their views on policy development and program
- 27 implementation.

- 1 (aa) Establish a long-term care ombudsman program consisting
- 2 of a state long-term care ombudsman and a system of local or
- 3 regional ombudsman offices having the duties and powers described
- 4 in section 6g. The local or regional ombudsman programs shall be
- 5 funded through area agencies on aging.
- 6 (BB) SUBJECT TO APPROPRIATION, CONDUCT A PUBLIC EDUCATION
- 7 CAMPAIGN THAT EMPHASIZES ZERO TOLERANCE FOR ELDER ABUSE. THE
- 8 CAMPAIGN SHALL INCLUDE INFORMATION ABOUT THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF
- 9 ELDER ABUSE, IDENTIFICATION OF POTENTIAL CAUSES OF ELDER ABUSE,
- 10 RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO ASSIST IN PREVENTING ELDER ABUSE, WHERE
- 11 SUSPECTED ELDER ABUSE MAY BE REPORTED, AND CONTACT INFORMATION FOR
- 12 PROGRAMS OFFERING SERVICES TO VICTIMS OF ELDER ABUSE, INCLUDING,
- 13 BUT NOT LIMITED TO, COUNSELING AND ASSISTANCE WITH ARRANGING
- 14 PERSONAL CARE AND SHELTER. THE CAMPAIGN SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE
- 15 LIMITED TO, PRINTED EDUCATION AND INFORMATIONAL MATERIALS, AUDIO,
- 16 VIDEO, ELECTRONIC, OTHER MEDIA, AND PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS OR
- 17 ADVERTISEMENTS.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 19 after the date it is enacted into law.
