## **HOUSE BILL No. 5121**

October 17, 2017, Introduced by Reps. Sabo, Yanez, Chirkun, Cochran, Liberati, Wittenberg, Zemke, Elder, Brinks, Durhal, Gay-Dagnogo, Moss, Geiss, Lasinski, Hoadley, Greig, Guerra, Sowerby, Crawford, Lucido, Tedder, Vaupel, Marino, Greimel, Green, Dianda, Faris, Victory, Iden, McCready, Kelly, Bellino, Pagel, Lilly, Kesto and Kosowski and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 203, entitled

"Foster care and adoption services act,"

by amending section 3 (MCL 722.953), as amended by 2014 PA 524, and by adding section 8b.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 3. The purposes of this act are all of the following:
- (a) To assist foster parents to provide a stable, loving family environment for children who are placed outside of their homes on a temporary basis.
- (b) To help eliminate barriers to the adoption of children and to promote the provision of a stable and loving family environment to children who are without permanent families.
- (c) To promote the well-being and safety of all children who receive foster care or are adopted under the laws of this state.
- (d) To protect and assist prospective adoptive families as 0.046517 \*\*\*\*

- 1 they negotiate the adoption process.
- 2 (e) To regulate child placing agencies who certify foster
- 3 parents and serve adoptees and adoptive families in this state.
- 4 (f) To regulate adoption attorneys who facilitate direct
- 5 placement adoptions.

- 7 receive all applicable resources as described in section 8a.
- 8 (H) TO ENSURE THAT THE DEPARTMENT DEVELOPS AND MAINTAINS A

- 10 8D TO PROVIDE TO CHILDREN PLACED IN FOSTER CARE. THE SPECIFIC

- 12 CHILDREN'S ASSURANCE OF QUALITY FOSTER CARE POLICY.
- 13 SEC. 8B. (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENSURE THAT THE CHILDREN'S
- 14 ASSURANCE OF QUALITY FOSTER CARE POLICY IS DEVELOPED, IMPLEMENTED
- 15 BY THE SUPERVISING AGENCY, AND MADE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC.
- 16 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROMOTE THE PARTICIPATION OF CURRENT
- 17 AND FORMER CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE IN DEVELOPING THE CHILDREN'S
- 18 ASSURANCE OF QUALITY FOSTER CARE POLICY.
- 19 (3) THE CHILDREN'S ASSURANCE OF QUALITY FOSTER CARE POLICY
- 20 SHALL ENSURE THAT CHILDREN PLACED IN FOSTER CARE ARE PROVIDED WITH
- 21 THE FOLLOWING:
- 22 (A) FAIR, EQUAL, AND RESPECTFUL TREATMENT, INCLUDING TREATMENT
- 23 THAT DOES NOT VIOLATE STATE AND FEDERAL LAW.
- 24 (B) PLACEMENT WITH RELATIVES AND SIBLINGS, WHEN APPROPRIATE,
- 25 AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 4A(5).
- 26 (C) INVENTORY AND SECURITY OF THE CHILD IN FOSTER CARE'S
- 27 PERSONAL BELONGINGS.

- 15 (I) PLACEMENT IN THE LEAST RESTRICTIVE SETTING, APPROPRIATE TO
- 16 THE CHILD IN FOSTER CARE'S NEEDS IN ACCORDANCE WITH R 400.12313 OF
- 17 THE MICHIGAN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE. IF DISCIPLINE IS REQUIRED, AND
- 18 PHYSICAL RESTRAINT HAS BEEN USED BY A CHILD CARING INSTITUTION AS
- 19 THAT TERM IS DEFINED IN SECTION 1 OF 1973 PA 116, MCL 722.111, THE
- 20 CHILD CARING INSTITUTION SHALL PROVIDE A DETAILED REPORT OF THE
- 21 INCIDENT TO THE DEPARTMENT.
- 22 (J) ACCESS TO AND RECEIPT OF INFORMATION AND SERVICES,
- 23 INCLUDING NECESSARY MEDICAL, EMOTIONAL, PSYCHOLOGICAL, PSYCHIATRIC,
- 24 AND EDUCATIONAL EVALUATIONS AND TREATMENT, AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE
- 25 AFTER IDENTIFYING THE NEED FOR SERVICES BY THE SCREENING AND

- 27 (K) ACCESS TO AND PARTICIPATION IN RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES,

- 13 ASSURANCE OF QUALITY FOSTER CARE POLICY. THE GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE
- 14 SHALL INCLUDE INFORMATION ON HOW AND WHERE TO FILE A GRIEVANCE,
- 15 INCLUDING CONTACT INFORMATION FOR THE OFFICE OF THE CHILDREN'S
- 16 OMBUDSMAN AND THE DEPARTMENT'S OFFICE OF FAMILY ADVOCATE, ON A FORM

- 18 (5) A CHILD IN FOSTER CARE MAY FILE A GRIEVANCE WITH THE
- 19 SUPERVISING AGENCY REGARDING THE PERCEIVED NONCOMPLIANCE WITH ANY
- 20 OF THE ITEMS LISTED IN THE CHILDREN'S ASSURANCE OF QUALITY FOSTER
- 21 CARE POLICY AS OUTLINED IN THE SUPERVISING AGENCY'S GRIEVANCE
- 22 POLICY DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (4). WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER RECEIVING
- 23 THE GRIEVANCE, THE SUPERVISING AGENCY SHALL RESPOND WITH A WRITTEN
- 24 STATEMENT OF HOW THE CHILD IN FOSTER CARE'S GRIEVANCE WILL BE
- 25 ADDRESSED. IF THE SUPERVISING AGENCY DOES NOT PROVIDE A WRITTEN
- 26 RESPONSE WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE GRIEVANCE IS FILED WITH THE
- 27 SUPERVISING AGENCY OR IF THE CHILD IN FOSTER CARE DOES NOT AGREE

- 1 WITH THE FINDINGS IN THE WRITTEN RESPONSE, THE CHILD IN FOSTER CARE

- 3 (6) IF THE GRIEVANCE IS NOT RESOLVED WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF
- 4 THE DEPARTMENT'S OFFICE OF FAMILY ADVOCATE, THE CHILD IN FOSTER
- 5 CARE MAY REQUEST THAT HIS OR HER LAWYER-GUARDIAN AD LITEM PETITION
- 6 THE COURT FOR THE APPROPRIATE RELIEF.
- 7 (7) THE SOLE REMEDY THAT MAY BE PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION IS
- 8 LIMITED TO INJUNCTIVE RELIEF.
