HOUSE BILL No. 5278

November 28, 2017, Introduced by Reps. Neeley, Sneller, Durhal, Gay-Dagnogo, Moss, Faris, Ellison, Graves, Rendon, Brinks, Schor, Chirkun, Hammoud, Pagan, Guerra, Phelps, Scott, Chang, Lasinski and Geiss and referred to the Committee on Law and Justice.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 389, entitled

"An act to provide for the prevention and treatment of domestic violence; to develop and establish policies, procedures, and standards for providing domestic violence assistance programs and services; to create a domestic violence prevention and treatment board and prescribe its powers and duties; to establish a domestic violence prevention and treatment fund and provide for its use; to prescribe powers and duties of the family independence agency; to prescribe immunities and liabilities of certain persons and officials; and to prescribe penalties for violations of this act,"

by amending the title and sections 1, 2, and 4 (MCL 400.1501, 400.1502, and 400.1504), the title as amended by 2001 PA 192 and section 1 as amended by 2000 PA 84.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

An act to provide for the prevention and treatment of domestic AND SEXUAL violence; to develop and establish policies, procedures, and standards for providing domestic AND SEXUAL violence assistance

- 14 (b) "Dating relationship" means frequent, intimate
- 15 associations primarily characterized by the expectation of
- 16 affectional involvement. Dating relationship does not include a
- 17 casual relationship or an ordinary fraternization between 2
- 18 individuals in a business or social context.
- 19 (c) "Department" means the family independence
- 20 agency. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.
- 21 (d) "Domestic violence" means the occurrence of any of the
- 22 following acts by a person that is not an act of self-defense:
- (i) Causing or attempting to cause physical or mental harm to
- 24 a family or household member.
- 25 (ii) Placing a family or household member in fear of physical
- 26 or mental harm.
- 27 (iii) Causing or attempting to cause a family or household

- 1 member to engage in involuntary sexual activity by force, threat of
- 2 force, or duress.
- 3 (iv) Engaging in activity toward a family or household member
- 4 that would cause a reasonable person to feel terrorized,
- 5 frightened, intimidated, threatened, harassed, or molested.
- **6** (e) "Family or household member" includes any of the
- 7 following:
- (i) A spouse or former spouse.
- 9 (ii) An individual with whom the person resides or has
- 10 resided.
- 11 (iii) An individual with whom the person has or has had a
- 12 dating relationship.
- (iv) An individual with whom the person is or has engaged in a
- 14 sexual relationship.
- 15 (v) An individual to whom the person is related or was
- 16 formerly related by marriage.
- (vi) An individual with whom the person has a child in common.
- 18 (vii) The minor child of an individual described in
- 19 subparagraphs (i) to (vi).
- 20 (f) "Fund" means the domestic violence prevention and
- 21 treatment fund created in section 5.
- 22 (g) "Prime sponsor" means a county, city, village, or township
- 23 of this state, or a combination thereof, or a private, nonprofit
- 24 association or organization.
- 25 Sec. 2. (1) The domestic AND SEXUAL violence prevention and
- 26 treatment board is created in the department. The board shall
- 27 consist under executive order No. 2012-17 consists of 7 members,

- 1 all of whom shall MUST have experience in an area related to the
- 2 problems of domestic OR SEXUAL violence. The members shall be
- 3 appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the
- 4 senate.
- 5 (2) The term MEMBERS of office of a member THE BOARD shall be
- 6 SERVE FOR TERMS OF 3 years except that :- of the members first
- 7 appointed τ^2 shall serve for a term of 1 year, 2 shall serve for a
- 8 term of 2 years, and 1 shall serve for a term of 3 years. ; and of
- 9 the 2 additional members appointed under this 1979 amendatory act,
- 10 1 shall serve for a term of 2 years and 1 shall serve for a term of
- 11 3 years. A member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring other than
- 12 by expiration of a term shall MUST be appointed for the remainder
- 13 of the unexpired term.
- 14 (3) The governor shall designate 1 member of the board to
- 15 serve as chairperson. A majority of the members shall OF THE BOARD
- 16 constitute a quorum.
- 17 (4) The per diem compensation of the board and the schedule
- 18 for reimbursement of expenses shall WILL be established annually by
- 19 the legislature.
- 20 Sec. 4. The department shall provide staff to enable the board
- 21 to carry out the following powers and duties ESTABLISHED UNDER
- 22 EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2012-17:
- 23 (a) Coordinate and monitor programs and services funded under
- 24 this act for the prevention of domestic AND SEXUAL violence and the
- 25 treatment of victims of domestic AND SEXUAL violence.
- (b) Develop standards for the implementation and
- 27 administration of services and procedures to prevent domestic AND

- 1 SEXUAL violence and to provide services and programs for victims of
- 2 domestic AND SEXUAL violence.
- 3 (c) Provide planning and technical assistance to prime
- 4 sponsors for the development, implementation, and administration of
- 5 programs and services for the prevention of domestic AND SEXUAL
- 6 violence and the treatment of victims of domestic AND SEXUAL
- 7 violence.
- 8 (d) Conduct research to develop and implement effective means
- 9 for preventing domestic AND SEXUAL violence and treating victims of
- 10 domestic AND SEXUAL violence.
- 11 (e) Provide assistance to the department of state police in
- 12 developing a system for monitoring and maintaining a uniform
- 13 reporting system to provide accurate statistical data on domestic
- 14 AND SEXUAL violence.
- (f) Coordinate educational and public informational programs
- 16 for the purpose of developing appropriate public awareness
- 17 regarding the problems of domestic AND SEXUAL violence; encourage
- 18 professional persons and groups to recognize and deal with problems
- 19 of domestic AND SEXUAL violence; to make information about the
- 20 problems of domestic AND SEXUAL violence available to the public,
- 21 and organizations, and agencies which THAT deal with problems of
- 22 domestic AND SEXUAL violence; and encourage the development of
- 23 community programs to prevent domestic AND SEXUAL violence and
- 24 provide services to victims of domestic AND SEXUAL violence.
- 25 (g) Study and recommend changes in civil and criminal LAWS AND
- 26 procedures which THAT will enable victims of domestic AND SEXUAL
- 27 violence to receive equitable and fair treatment under the law.

- 1 (h) Advise the legislature and governor on the nature,
- 2 magnitude, and priorities of the problem of domestic AND SEXUAL
- 3 violence and the needs of victims of domestic AND SEXUAL violence;
- 4 and recommend APPROPRIATE changes in state LAWS AND programs T
- 5 statutes, RELATED TO DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE.
- 6 (I) **DEVELOP** policies, budgets, and standards which THAT will
- 7 reduce the problem OF DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE and improve the
- 8 condition of victims.
- 9 (J) ADMINISTER GRANTS AWARDED PURSUANT TO 34 USC 12291 TO
- 10 20126, THE FAMILY VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND SERVICES ACT, 42 USC
- 11 10401 TO 10414, AND OTHER GOVERNMENTAL OR NONGOVERNMENTAL GRANTS
- 12 DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 13 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 14 after the date it is enacted into law.

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
