HOUSE BILL No. 5406

January 11, 2018, Introduced by Rep. Victory and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," (MCL 324.101 to 324.90106) by adding part 50.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 2 SEC. 5001. AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 3 (A) "ASSET MANAGEMENT" MEANS AN ONGOING PROCESS OF
- 4 MAINTAINING, UPGRADING, AND OPERATING PHYSICAL ASSETS COST-
- 5 EFFECTIVELY, BASED ON A CONTINUOUS PHYSICAL INVENTORY AND CONDITION
 - ASSESSMENT AND INVESTMENT TO ACHIEVE PERFORMANCE GOALS.
 - (B) "ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN" MEANS A SET OF PROCEDURES TO
- 8 MANAGE ASSETS THROUGH THEIR LIFE CYCLES, BASED ON PRINCIPLES OF

 - (C) "ASSET OWNER" MEANS A PERSON THAT OWNS OR OPERATES AN

- 5 IN SECTION 5002.
- 6 (F) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL
- 7 QUALITY.
- 8 (G) "DRINKING WATER ASSETS" MEANS A SYSTEM OF PIPES AND
- 9 STRUCTURES THROUGH WHICH WATER IS OBTAINED AND DISTRIBUTED,
- 10 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, WELLS AND WELL STRUCTURES, WELLHEAD
- 11 PROTECTION AREAS, GROUNDWATER PROTECTION AREAS, INTAKES AND CRIBS,

- 19 (I) "PERFORMANCE GOALS" MEANS STANDARDS OF SYSTEM PERFORMANCE
- 20 THAT REFLECT ASSET MANAGEMENT PRINCIPLES FOR ASSET PRESERVATION AND
- 21 SUSTAINABILITY, OPERATIONS, CAPACITY CONSISTENT WITH LOCAL NEEDS,
- 22 AND IDENTIFIED LEVELS OF SERVICE.
- 23 (J) "REGION" MEANS THE GEOGRAPHIC JURISDICTION OF ANY OF THE
- 24 FOLLOWING:
- 25 (i) A REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION CREATED PURSUANT TO 1945 PA
- 26 281, MCL 125.11 TO 125.25.
- 27 (ii) A REGIONAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION CREATED

- 1 PURSUANT TO 1966 PA 46, MCL 125.1231 TO 125.1237.
- 2 (iii) A METROPOLITAN AREA COUNCIL FORMED PURSUANT TO THE
- 3 METROPOLITAN COUNCILS ACT, 1989 PA 292, MCL 124.651 TO 124.729.
- 4 (iv) A METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION ESTABLISHED PURSUANT
- 5 TO FEDERAL LAW.
- 6 (v) AN AGENCY DIRECTED AND FUNDED BY SECTION 822F OF ARTICLE
- 7 VIII OF 2016 PA 268 TO ENGAGE IN JOINT DECISION-MAKING PRACTICES
- 8 RELATED BUT NOT LIMITED TO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, ECONOMIC
- 9 DEVELOPMENT, TALENT, AND INFRASTRUCTURE OPPORTUNITIES.
- 10 (K) "SEWER ASSETS" MEANS A SYSTEM OF PIPES AND STRUCTURES,
- 11 INCLUDING PIPES, CHANNELS, CONDUITS, MANHOLES, PUMPING STATIONS,
- 12 SEWAGE OR WASTEWATER TREATMENT FIXED ASSETS, DIVERSION AND
- 13 REGULATORY DEVICES, OUTFALL STRUCTURES, AND APPURTENANCES, USED TO
- 14 COLLECT, CONVEY, TRANSPORT, TREAT, OR OTHERWISE HANDLE SANITARY
- 15 SEWAGE.
- 16 (l) "STORMWATER ASSETS" MEANS GREEN OR GRAY FEATURES THAT ARE
- 17 LOCATED WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHIC LIMITS OF AN ASSET SERVICE AREA AND
- 18 ARE DESIGNED OR ACTIVELY MANAGED BY A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT FOR
- 19 COLLECTING, STORING, TREATING, CONVEYING, OR ATTENUATING
- 20 STORMWATER, SUCH AS CATCH BASINS, CURBS, GUTTERS, DITCHES AND
- 21 CHANNELS SOLELY CONVEYING STORMWATER, PIPES, CONDUITS, SWALES,

- 25 SEC. 5002. (1) THE WATER ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL IS CREATED
- 26 WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT.
- 27 (2) THE COUNCIL SHALL CONSIST OF 9 VOTING MEMBERS APPOINTED BY

- 1 THE MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL, WHO SHALL SERVE AT THE
- 2 PLEASURE OF THE MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL. THE MEMBERS SHALL
- 3 REPRESENT THE NONPROFIT, PUBLIC, AND PRIVATE SECTORS AND ACADEMIA,
- 4 INCLUDING INDIVIDUALS REPRESENTING INTERESTS SUCH AS WATER, SEWER,
- 5 AND STORMWATER AGENCIES, THIS STATE, REGIONAL GOVERNMENT, LOCAL
- 6 UNITS OF GOVERNMENT, AND ENVIRONMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS. THE COUNCIL
- 7 MAY APPOINT THE CENTRAL DATA STORAGE AGENCY AS AN EX OFFICIO,
- 8 NONVOTING MEMBER.
- 9 (3) COUNCIL MEMBERS SHALL SERVE FOR A TERM OF 3 YEARS.
- 10 HOWEVER, OF THE INITIAL APPOINTMENTS TO THE COUNCIL, 3 SHALL SERVE
- 11 FOR 1 YEAR, 3 SHALL SERVE FOR 2 YEARS, AND 3 SHALL SERVE FOR 3
- 12 YEARS. A VACANCY ON THE COUNCIL SHALL BE FILLED IN THE SAME MANNER
- 13 AS THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT.
- 14 (4) AT THE FIRST MEETING OF THE COUNCIL, THE COUNCIL SHALL
- 15 SELECT A CHAIRPERSON FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS.
- 16 (5) THE COUNCIL MAY APPOINT SUBCOMMITTEES WHOSE MEMBERS SERVE
- 17 AS NEEDED TO PROVIDE RESEARCH ON ISSUES AND PROJECTS AS DETERMINED
- 18 BY THE COUNCIL.
- 19 (6) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE QUALIFIED ADMINISTRATIVE
- 20 STAFF AND QUALIFIED TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE COUNCIL.
- 21 SEC. 5003. THE COUNCIL SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 22 (A) ADVISE THE MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL ON A STATEWIDE
- 23 WATER ASSET MANAGEMENT STRATEGY AND THE PROCESSES AND TOOLS NEEDED
- 24 TO IMPLEMENT A STRATEGY FOR ALL WATER, SEWER, AND STORMWATER
- 25 AGENCIES AND ASSET OWNERS.
- 26 (B) PROMOTE AND OVERSEE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE
- 27 RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE REGIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE ASSET MANAGEMENT

- 1 PILOT PROGRAM CREATED UNDER EXECUTIVE DIRECTIVE 2017-1 AT A STATE
- 2 LEVEL RELATED TO WATER, SEWER, AND STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE.
- 3 (C) DEVELOP A TEMPLATE FOR AN ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN BY OCTOBER
- 4 1, 2019 FOR USE UNDER SECTION 5004 BY LOCAL WATER, SEWER, AND
- 5 STORMWATER AGENCIES AND ASSET OWNERS SUBMITTING ASSET MANAGEMENT
- 6 PLANS TO THE COUNCIL FOR APPROVAL. AT A MINIMUM, THE TEMPLATE
- 7 SHOULD ENSURE THAT LOCAL ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANS INCLUDE ALL OF THE
- 8 FOLLOWING COMPONENTS:
- 9 (i) AN ASSET INVENTORY THAT INCLUDES THE LOCATION, MATERIAL,
- 10 SIZE, AND CONDITION OF THE ASSETS IN A FORMAT THAT ALLOWS FOR
- 11 DIGITAL MAPPING. ALL QUALITY CONTROL STANDARDS AND PROTOCOLS SHALL,
- 12 AT A MINIMUM, BE CONSISTENT WITH EXISTING FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS AND
- 13 REGULATIONS AND EXISTING GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTING STANDARDS.
- 14 (ii) A LEVEL OF SERVICE ANALYSIS THAT INCLUDES DESIRED LEVELS
- 15 OF SERVICE AND PERFORMANCE GOALS OF THE ASSETS TO HELP THE SYSTEM
- 16 ACHIEVE RELIABILITY, RESPONSIVENESS, SAFETY, CAPACITY,
- 17 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS, COST AND AFFORDABILITY, AND COMPLIANCE WITH
- 18 LAW. LEVELS OF SERVICE MAY VARY AMONG ASSETS UNDER THE LOCAL
- 19 AGENCY'S JURISDICTION.
- 20 (iii) A RISK OF FAILURE ANALYSIS THAT IDENTIFIES THE
- 21 PROBABILITY AND CRITICALITY OF FAILURE OF THE MOST CRITICAL ASSETS
- 22 AND ANY CONTINGENCY PLANS.
- 23 (iv) ANTICIPATED REVENUES AND EXPENSES, INCLUDING A
- 24 DESCRIPTION OF ALL REVENUE SOURCES AND ANTICIPATED RECEIPTS FOR THE
- 25 PERIOD OF THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN, AND EXPECTED INFRASTRUCTURE
- 26 REPAIR AND REPLACEMENT EXPENDITURES, INCLUDING PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS
- 27 OR CAPITAL RECONSTRUCTION.

- 1 (v) A PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES ANALYSIS THAT DETERMINES HOW THE
- 2 INVESTMENT STRATEGY ACHIEVES THE DESIRED LEVELS OF SERVICE AND
- 3 PERFORMANCE GOALS. THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN MUST INCLUDE STEPS
- 4 NECESSARY TO ENSURE ASSET CONDITIONS MEET OR ACHIEVE STATED GOALS,
- 5 INCLUDING A DESCRIPTION AND EXPLANATION FOR ANY GAP BETWEEN
- 6 ACHIEVABLE CONDITION AND PERFORMANCE THROUGH THE INVESTMENT
- 7 STRATEGY AND DESIRED GOALS.
- 8 (vi) A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE AGENCY PLANS TO COORDINATE WITH
- 9 OTHER ASSET OWNERS, INCLUDING NEIGHBORING JURISDICTIONS, TO
- 10 MINIMIZE DUPLICATION OF EFFORT WITH REGARD TO INFRASTRUCTURE
- 11 PRESERVATION AND MAINTENANCE.
- 12 (vii) PROOF OF ACCEPTANCE, CERTIFICATION, OR ADOPTION BY THE
- 13 JURISDICTION'S GOVERNING BODY.
- 14 SEC. 5004. BY OCTOBER 1, 2019, THE COUNCIL SHALL ESTABLISH A
- 15 SCHEDULE FOR SUBMISSION OF ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANS FOR WATER, SEWER,
- 16 AND STORMWATER AGENCIES AND ASSET OWNERS THAT INCLUDES ALL OF THE
- 17 FOLLOWING:
- 18 (A) BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2020, EACH WATER, SEWER, AND
- 19 STORMWATER AGENCY AND ASSET OWNER SHALL SUBMIT AN ASSET MANAGEMENT
- 20 PLAN TO THE COUNCIL.
- 21 (B) THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANS SUBMITTED UNDER SUBDIVISION (A)
- 22 SHALL COVER AND BE VALID FOR A MINIMUM OF 3 YEARS AND SHALL BE
- 23 CONSISTENT WITH THE TEMPLATE PROVIDED BY THE COUNCIL.
- 24 (C) THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANS SUBMITTED UNDER SUBDIVISION (A)
- 25 SHALL BE REVIEWED BY THE COUNCIL WITHIN 6 MONTHS OF RECEIPT. THE
- 26 COUNCIL SHALL COMPARE SUBMITTED ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANS TO THE
- 27 MINIMUM COMPONENTS REQUIRED BY THIS ACT AND THE TEMPLATE PROVIDED

- 1 BY THE COUNCIL AND SHALL DETERMINE IF THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANS
- 2 ARE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THOSE STANDARDS. IF THE COUNCIL DETERMINES
- 3 THAT AN ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN DOES NOT MEET ESTABLISHED STANDARDS,
- 4 THE COUNCIL SHALL SEEK CONCURRENCE FROM THE DEPARTMENT. IF THE
- 5 DEPARTMENT CONCURS, THE COUNCIL SHALL REQUIRE THAT THE ENTITY
- 6 SUBMITTING THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN MEET ACCEPTABLE STANDARDS
- 7 WITHIN 6 MONTHS OF THE SUBMITTAL.
- 8 (D) A WATER, SEWER, OR STORMWATER AGENCY OR ASSET OWNER THAT
- 9 IS REQUIRED UNDER THIS PART TO HAVE AN APPROVED ASSET MANAGEMENT
- 10 PLAN MUST IMPLEMENT THE APPROVED ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN BY OCTOBER
- 11 1, 2024.
- 12 SEC. 5005. THE COUNCIL SHALL ANNUALLY SUBMIT TO THE MICHIGAN
- 13 INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL A REPORT ON ASSET CONDITION AND INVESTMENT
- 14 THAT INCLUDES A SUMMARY ANALYSIS OF THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANS
- 15 RECEIVED FROM DRINKING WATER, SEWER, AND STORMWATER ENTITIES. THE
- 16 REPORT SHALL ALSO INCLUDE RECOMMENDATIONS ON WATER, SEWER, AND
- 17 STORMWATER CONDITION GOALS AND ANALYSIS OF HOW THE UTILITIES ARE
- 18 MEETING THOSE GOALS. THE WATER INFRASTRUCTURE ASSET MANAGEMENT
- 19 ANALYSES CONTAINED IN THE REPORT SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH THE
- 20 MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL'S ASSET MANAGEMENT PROCESS AND
- 21 SHALL BE REPORTED CONSISTENT WITH CATEGORIES ESTABLISHED BY THE
- 22 MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL.
- 23 SEC. 5006. (1) STATE FUNDING MAY BE PROVIDED TO WATER, SEWER,
- 24 AND STORMWATER AGENCIES AND ASSET OWNERS TO IMPLEMENT THIS PART AT
- 25 A COST-SHARE DETERMINED BY THE COUNCIL. FUNDING NECESSARY FOR THE
- 26 DEPARTMENT TO SUPPORT THE ACTIVITIES DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION
- 27 SHALL BE PROVIDED BY AN ANNUAL APPROPRIATION.

- 1 (2) EACH WATER, SEWER, AND STORMWATER AGENCY AND ASSET OWNER
- 2 SHALL ANNUALLY REPORT TO THE COUNCIL, CONSISTENT WITH CURRENT
- 3 ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES, HOW ITS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLANS ARE
- 4 MEETING ITS INVESTMENT GOALS, TO ENSURE CONSISTENCY WITH ITS ASSET
- 5 MANAGEMENT PLANS.
- 6 (3) THE DEPARTMENT AND EACH DRINKING WATER, SEWER, AND
- 7 STORMWATER AGENCY AND ASSET OWNER SHALL KEEP ACCURATE AND UNIFORM
- 8 RECORDS ON ALL WORK PERFORMED AND FUNDS EXPENDED FOR THE PURPOSES
- 9 OF THIS SECTION, ACCORDING TO THE PROCEDURES DEVELOPED BY THE
- 10 MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL.
- 11 (4) THE COUNCIL SHALL ANNUALLY PREPARE A REPORT ON THE
- 12 ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED DURING THE PRECEDING YEAR AND THE EXPENDITURE
- 13 OF FUNDS RELATED TO THE PROCESSES AND ACTIVITIES IDENTIFIED BY THE
- 14 COUNCIL. THE REPORT SHALL ALSO INCLUDE AN OVERVIEW OF THE
- 15 ACTIVITIES IDENTIFIED FOR THE SUCCEEDING YEAR. THE COUNCIL SHALL
- 16 SUBMIT THIS REPORT TO THE MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL AND THE
- 17 LEGISLATURE BY MAY 2 OF EACH YEAR.
- 18 SEC. 5007. (1) THE COUNCIL SHALL IDENTIFY TRAINING NEEDS TO
- 19 DEVELOP PROFICIENCY IN USING A MULTI-ASSET MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR
- 20 WATER, SEWER, AND STORMWATER AGENCIES AND ASSET OWNERS, AND
- 21 TRAINING TO IDENTIFY ASSET SYSTEM CONDITIONS BASED ON A STATEWIDE
- 22 ASSET CONDITION MEASURE.
- 23 (2) THE COUNCIL SHALL COORDINATE AND COLLABORATE WITH THE
- 24 TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL ON PLANNING, REPORTING, AND
- 25 TRAINING.
- 26 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 27 unless Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. (request no.

1 04467'17) of the 99th Legislature is enacted into law.
