HOUSE BILL No. 5466

January 30, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Lasinski, Ellison, Greig, Sowerby, Pagan, Sneller, Gay-Dagnogo, Love, Brinks, Geiss, LaGrand, Guerra, Garrett, Cambensy, Hertel, Hoadley, Moss, Chang, Liberati, Camilleri, Green, Wittenberg, Durhal, Rabhi, Cochran, Faris, Jones, Dianda, Neeley, Clemente, Hammoud and Chirkun and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to establish an educational scholarship program for certain educators and providers employed in early childhood education and care facilities; to prescribe conditions for repayment of the scholarships in certain circumstances; to provide for the administration of the scholarship program; and to prescribe certain powers and duties of certain state officers, agencies, and departments.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "early childhood educators scholarship act".
 - Sec. 2. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Early childhood education or care facility" means a child

- 1 care center, family child care home, or group child care home as
- 2 those terms are defined in section 1 of 1973 PA 116, MCL 722.111.
- 3 (b) "Eligible costs" means tuition and fees charged by an
- 4 eligible institution for an eligible program; related costs for
- 5 room, board, books, supplies, and transportation; and other related
- 6 costs determined by the office of great start.
- 7 (c) "Eligible employment" means employment at an hourly wage
- 8 of not more than \$17.00 per hour for an average of at least 40
- 9 weeks per year and 25 hours per week as an educator or provider in
- 10 an early childhood education or care facility.
- 11 (d) "Eligible institution" means a degree- or certificate-
- 12 granting public or independent nonprofit college or university,
- 13 junior college, or community college in this state.
- 14 (e) "Eligible program" means an associate or baccalaureate
- 15 degree program operated in this state by an eligible institution
- 16 and approved by the office of great start as appropriate for
- 17 training in early childhood care, education, or administration.
- 18 (f) "Eligible student" means an individual who qualifies for a
- 19 scholarship under section 4.
- 20 (g) "Fund" means the teacher early childhood educators
- 21 scholarship fund created under section 6.
- (h) "Office of great start" or "office" means the office of
- 23 great start created within the department of education by Executive
- 24 Reorganization Order No. 2011-7, MCL 388.1281.
- 25 Sec. 3. The early childhood educators scholarship program is
- 26 created, to be administered by the office of great start. The
- 27 office of great start shall do all of the following:

- 1 (a) Subject to section 4, award scholarships to eligible
- 2 students under this act pursuant to application procedures
- 3 established by the office.
- 4 (b) Develop the scholarship agreement described in section 4.
- 5 (c) Conduct periodic audits of scholarship recipients to
- 6 enforce the requirements of the scholarship agreement described in
- 7 section 4 and all other requirements set forth in this act or
- 8 promulgated by rule under subdivision (e).
- 9 (d) Collect repayment of scholarships if required under
- 10 section 4.
- 11 (e) Promulgate rules to implement this act pursuant to the
- 12 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- **13** 24.328.
- 14 Sec. 4. The office of great start shall award a scholarship
- 15 under this act to an individual only if the office determines that
- 16 the individual meets all of the following eligibility criteria:
- 17 (a) Is a resident of this state.
- 18 (b) Does not have a 4-year undergraduate degree.
- (c) Has not previously defaulted on any state or federal
- 20 student loan and does not owe a refund on any previously received
- 21 state or federal financial aid.
- 22 (d) Currently has and has had for at least 1 year eligible
- 23 employment.
- 24 (e) Is enrolled in or has been accepted into an eligible
- 25 program on a full- or part-time basis.
- (f) If he or she has been attending the eligible program, is
- 27 maintaining satisfactory progress in that program according to the

- 1 standards of the eligible institution.
- 2 (g) Has entered into a written scholarship agreement with the
- 3 office of great start in which he or she agrees to all of the
- 4 following:
- 5 (i) To continue serving in eligible employment while attending
- 6 an eligible program and for 1 year immediately succeeding
- 7 completion of that program.
- 8 (ii) Upon the request of the office, to provide the office
- 9 with evidence of compliance with the scholarship agreement,
- including the eligible employment commitment made under
- 11 subparagraph (i), and any other requirements of this act and any
- 12 rules promulgated by the office pursuant to this act.
- 13 (iii) If the individual fails or refuses to comply with the
- 14 eligible employment commitment made under subparagraph (i), to
- 15 repay all or part of any scholarship money received under this act
- 16 plus interest and, if applicable, reasonable collection fees, in
- 17 compliance with rules promulgated by the office, including rules
- 18 that provide for proportionate repayment if a scholarship recipient
- 19 serves in eligible employment for less than the length of the time
- 20 required under subparagraph (i) and rules under which a repayment
- 21 obligation may be reduced or forgiven due to death, disability, or
- 22 other good cause.
- Sec. 5. Subject to appropriation, an eligible student awarded
- 24 a scholarship under section 4 may receive not more than the
- 25 following amount of money, as applicable, to be used for eligible
- 26 costs incurred in connection with attending an eligible program:
- 27 (a) \$400.00 per semester credit hour at an eligible

- 1 institution that is a 4-year college or university.
- 2 (b) \$250.00 per semester credit hour at an eligible
- 3 institution that is a junior or community college.
- 4 Sec. 6. (1) The early childhood educators scholarship fund is
- 5 created within the state treasury.
- **6** (2) The state treasurer may receive money or other assets from
- 7 any source for deposit into the fund, including, but not limited
- 8 to, amounts repaid to the office of great start on scholarships
- 9 awarded under this act. The state treasurer shall direct the
- 10 investment of the fund. The state treasurer shall credit to the
- 11 fund interest and earnings from fund investments.
- 12 (3) Money in the fund at the close of the fiscal year shall
- 13 remain in the fund and shall not lapse to the general fund.
- 14 (4) The department of treasury shall be the administrator of
- 15 the fund for auditing purposes.
- 16 (5) The department of treasury shall expend money from the
- 17 fund, upon appropriation, only to provide money to the office of
- 18 great start for scholarships awarded under this act.
