HOUSE BILL No. 5584

February 14, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Guerra and Johnson and referred to the Committee on Families, Children, and Seniors.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 2803 (MCL 333.2803), as amended by 2012 PA 499.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2803. (1) "Abortion" means that term as defined in 2 section 17015.
 - (2) "Dead body" means a human body or fetus, or a part of a dead human body or fetus, in a condition from which it may reasonably be concluded that death has occurred.
 - (3) "ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF A BIRTH RECORD THAT IS ONLY AVAILABLE THROUGH THE OFFICE OF THE STATE REGISTRAR AND WHO MEETS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
 - (A) HE OR SHE WAS BORN IN THE JURISDICTION OF THE OFFICE OF

- 14 (5) (4) "Fetal remains" means a dead fetus or part of a dead
- 15 fetus that has completed at least 10 weeks of gestation or has
- 16 reached the stage of development that, upon visual inspection of
- 17 the fetus or part of the fetus, the head, torso, or extremities
- 18 appear to be supported by skeletal or cartilaginous structures.
- 19 Fetal remains do not include the umbilical cord or placenta.
- 20 (6) (5) "File" means to present a certificate, report, or
- 21 other record to the local registrar for registration by the state
- 22 registrar.
- 23 (7) (6) "Final disposition" means the burial, cremation,
- 24 interment, or other legal disposition of a dead body or fetal
- 25 remains.
- 26 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 27 after the date it is enacted into law.
