HOUSE BILL No. 5624

February 21, 2018, Introduced by Rep. Johnson and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 2016 PA 407, entitled "Skilled trades regulation act,"

by amending sections 1111 and 1123 (MCL 339.6111 and 339.6123).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1111. (1) To qualify for a plumbing contractor license, the applicant must either hold a master plumber license or employ the holder of a master plumber license as his or her representative.
 - (2) Only an individual who is a sole proprietor, a partner in a partnership, an officer of a corporation, or a member of a limited liability company may apply for licensure as a plumbing contractor.

- 1 (3) The department shall issue a plumbing contractor's license
- 2 to an individual who does all of the following:
- 3 (a) Files a completed application on a form provided by the
- 4 department that includes the following information:
- 5 (i) A statement listing the complete address of each place
- 6 where the applicant has resided and has been engaged in business
- 7 during the last 5 years including the length of time at each
- 8 residence and types of businesses engaged in or employments. IF THE
- 9 APPLICANT IS REGISTERED AS A PLUMBING INSPECTOR UNDER ARTICLE 10
- 10 AND ENGAGED IN BUSINESS AS A PLUMBING CONTRACTOR, THE STATEMENT
- 11 MUST ALSO INCLUDE THAT ADDRESS.
- (ii) The name of the individual who is applying for the
- 13 license, the name of the business, and the location of the place
- 14 for which the license is desired.
- 15 (iii) The name of the business owner, president of the
- 16 corporation, or a member or manager of the limited liability
- 17 company and the name of the individual who is applying, if
- 18 different from the name of the business owner, president, or member
- 19 or manager and his or her title.
- (iv) The name, residence address, and license number of the
- 21 licensed master plumber who represents the person.
- 22 (b) Pays the applicable examination fee established under
- 23 section 207 and passes an examination provided for by the board and
- 24 the department.
- 25 (c) Pays the license fee described in article 4.
- 26 (4) A licensed plumbing contractor may operate 1 or more
- 27 branch offices in this state under the same business if a licensed

- 1 master plumber is in charge and has the responsibility of
- 2 supervision at each branch.
- **3** (5) If a license is issued to a plumbing contractor
- 4 represented by a master plumber, the plumbing contractor and the
- 5 master plumber are jointly and severally responsible for exercising
- 6 the supervision or control of the plumbing operations necessary to
- 7 secure full compliance with this article, the rules promulgated
- 8 under this article, and all other laws and rules related to the
- 9 installation of plumbing.
- 10 (6) Both a person, unless the person is a plumbing contractor,
- 11 and the master plumber are jointly and severally responsible for
- 12 exercising the supervision or control of the plumbing operations
- 13 necessary to secure full compliance with this article, the rules
- 14 promulgated under this article, and all other laws and rules
- 15 related to the installation of plumbing.
- 16 (7) If a plumbing contractor is represented by a licensed
- 17 master plumber who ceases to represent the plumbing contractor, the
- 18 plumbing contractor has 30 days after the date the master plumber
- 19 no longer represents the plumbing contractor in which to designate
- 20 another licensed master plumber as the representative of the
- 21 plumbing contractor. The plumbing contractor shall notify the
- 22 department in writing of the change.
- 23 (8) A licensed plumbing contractor shall display in a
- 24 conspicuous place at the entrance of the place of business a sign
- 25 that states the name of the business and the name of the licensed
- 26 master plumber and license number in letters that are at least 3
- 27 inches high.

Sec. 1123. An individual who is licensed under this article

- 2 and employed or acting IS REGISTERED UNDER ARTICLE 10 as a plumbing
 3 inspector shall not engage in, or be directly or indirectly
 4 connected with, the plumbing business, including, but not limited
 5 to, the furnishing of labor, materials, or appliances for the
- 6 construction, alteration, or maintenance of a building or the
- 7 preparation of plans or specifications for the construction,
- 8 alteration, or maintenance of a building, and shall not engage in
- 9 any work that conflicts with his or her official duties. IS NOT
- 10 PROHIBITED FROM ENGAGING IN THE BUSINESS OF PLUMBING.
- 11 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 12 after the date it is enacted into law.
