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HOUSE BILL No. 5642

February 27, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Greimel, Sneller, Ellison, Faris, Lucido, Zemke, Cochran, Neeley, Yancey and Sabo and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 669 (MCL 257.669), as amended by 2015 PA 128.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 669. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2), (3), and 2 (4), the driver of a motor vehicle transporting 16 or more 3 passengers including the driver, a motor vehicle carrying passengers for hire, or a motor vehicle that is required to be 5 marked or placarded under 49 CFR parts 100 to 180, before crossing a railroad track at grade, shall activate the vehicle hazard 6 7 warning lights and stop the vehicle within 50 feet but not less 8 than 15 feet from the nearest rail. While stopped, the driver shall listen and look in both directions along the track for an 10 approaching RAILROAD train OR OTHER ON-TRACK EQUIPMENT and for 11 signals indicating the approach of a RAILROAD train OR OTHER ON-

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- 1 TRACK EQUIPMENT, and shall not proceed until the driver can do so
- 2 safely. After stopping as required in this subsection, and upon
- 3 proceeding when it is safe to do so, the driver of the vehicle
- 4 shall cross only in a gear of the vehicle that does not require
- 5 changing gears while traversing the crossing. The driver shall not
- 6 shift gears while crossing the track or tracks.
- 7 (2) A stop need not be made at a railroad track grade crossing
- 8 where a police officer or a traffic-control signal directs traffic
- 9 to proceed.
- 10 (3) A stop need not be made at an inactive railroad track
- 11 grade crossing. As used in this subsection, "inactive railroad
- 12 track" means a railroad track that meets all of the following
- 13 requirements:
- 14 (i) The track has been covered or removed.
- 15 (ii) All signs, signals, and other warning devices are
- 16 removed.
- 17 (4) A stop shall not be made at a railroad grade crossing
- 18 marked with a sign reading "exempt". Exempt signs may be erected
- 19 only by or with the consent of the state transportation department
- 20 after notice to and an opportunity to be heard by the primary
- 21 railroad operating over that crossing.
- 22 (5) A person who violates this section is responsible for a
- 23 civil infraction.
- 24 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 25 after the date it is enacted into law.

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
