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## **HOUSE BILL No. 5678**

March 1, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Kahle, Maturen, LaGrand, Yanez, Lucido, McCready, Kesto, Canfield, Leutheuser, Sabo, Howell, Elder and LaFave and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled

"Public health code,"

by amending section 7303a (MCL 333.7303a), as amended by 2017 PA  $^{249}$ .

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 7303a. (1) A prescriber who holds a controlled substances license may administer or dispense a controlled substance listed in schedules 2 to 5 without a separate controlled substances license for those activities.
- (2) Except as otherwise provided in rules promulgated under section 16204e AND FOR A PATIENT WHO IS ADMITTED TO A HOSPICE, beginning March 31, 2018, a licensed prescriber shall not prescribe

- 1 a controlled substance listed in schedules 2 to 5 unless the
- 2 prescriber is in a bona fide prescriber-patient relationship with
- 3 the patient for whom the controlled substance is being prescribed.
- 4 Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, if a licensed
- 5 prescriber prescribes a controlled substance under this subsection,
- 6 the prescriber shall provide follow-up care to the patient to
- 7 monitor the efficacy of the use of the controlled substance as a
- 8 treatment of the patient's medical condition. If the licensed
- 9 prescriber is unable to provide follow-up care, he or she shall
- 10 refer the patient to the patient's primary care provider for
- 11 follow-up care or, if the patient does not have a primary care
- 12 provider, he or she shall refer the patient to another licensed
- 13 prescriber who is geographically accessible to the patient for
- 14 follow-up care.
- 15 (3) Before prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance to
- 16 a patient, a licensed prescriber shall ask the patient about other
- 17 controlled substances the patient may be using. The prescriber
- 18 shall record the patient's response in the patient's medical or
- 19 clinical record.
- 20 (4) Beginning June 1, 2018, before prescribing or dispensing
- 21 to a patient a controlled substance in a quantity that exceeds a 3-
- 22 day supply, a licensed prescriber shall obtain and review a report
- 23 concerning that patient from the electronic system for monitoring
- 24 schedule 2, 3, 4, and 5 controlled substances established under
- 25 section 7333a. This subsection does not apply under any of the
- 26 following circumstances:
- 27 (a) If the dispensing occurs in a hospital or freestanding

- 1 surgical outpatient facility licensed under article 17 and the
- 2 controlled substance is administered to the patient in that
- 3 hospital or facility.
- 4 (b) If the patient is an animal as that term is defined in
- 5 section 18802, the dispensing occurs in a veterinary hospital or
- 6 clinic and the controlled substance is administered to the patient
- 7 in that hospital or clinic.
- 8 (c) If the controlled substance is prescribed by a licensed
- 9 prescriber who is a veterinarian and the controlled substance will
- 10 be dispensed by a pharmacist.
- 11 (D) IF THE PATIENT IS ADMITTED TO A HOSPICE.
- 12 (5) Beginning June 1, 2018, before prescribing or dispensing a
- 13 controlled substance to a patient, a licensed prescriber shall
- 14 register with the electronic system for monitoring schedule 2, 3,
- 15 4, and 5 controlled substances established under section 7333a.
- 16 (6) A licensed prescriber who dispenses controlled substances
- 17 shall maintain all of the following records separately from other
- 18 prescription records:
- 19 (a) All invoices and other acquisition records for each
- 20 controlled substance acquired by the prescriber for not less than 5
- 21 years after the date the prescriber acquires the controlled
- 22 substance.
- 23 (b) A log of all controlled substances dispensed by the
- 24 prescriber for not less than 5 years after the date the controlled
- 25 substance is dispensed.
- (c) Records of all other dispositions of controlled substances
- 27 under the licensee's control for not less than 5 years after the

- 1 date of the disposition.
- 2 (7) The requirement under section 7303 for a license is waived
- 3 in the following circumstances:
- 4 (a) When a controlled substance listed in schedules 2 to 5 is
- 5 administered on the order of a licensed prescriber by an individual
- 6 who is licensed under article 15 as a practical nurse or a
- 7 registered professional nurse.
- 8 (b) When methadone or a methadone congener is dispensed on the
- 9 order of a licensed prescriber in a methadone treatment program
- 10 licensed under article 6 or when a controlled substance listed in
- 11 schedules 2 to 5 is dispensed on the order of a licensed prescriber
- 12 in a hospice rendering emergency care services in a patient's home
- 13 as described in section 17746 by a registered professional nurse
- 14 licensed under article 15.
- 15 (8) As used in this section:
- 16 (a) "Bona fide prescriber-patient relationship" means a
- 17 treatment or counseling relationship between a prescriber and a
- 18 patient in which both of the following are present:
- 19 (i) The prescriber has reviewed the patient's relevant medical
- 20 or clinical records and completed a full assessment of the
- 21 patient's medical history and current medical condition, including
- 22 a relevant medical evaluation of the patient conducted in person or
- 23 via telehealth.
- 24 (ii) The prescriber has created and maintained records of the
- 25 patient's condition in accordance with medically accepted
- 26 standards.
- 27 (B) "HOSPICE" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN SECTION 20106.

- 1 (C) (b) "Telehealth" means that term as defined in section
- **2** 16283.
