A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled

"Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 302 (MCL 257.302), as amended by 2008 PA 7.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 302. The following persons are exempt from obtaining a
 license under this chapter:
- 3 (a) A person serving in the armed forces ARMED FORCES of the4 United States if furnished with a driver's permit and operating an
- 5 official motor vehicle in that service or a person who is a
- 6 military driver and operates a commercial motor vehicle for a
- 7 military purpose. This exemption applies to active duty military
- 8 personnel, members of the military reserves, active duty United
 - States coast quard COAST GUARD personnel, and members of the

- 1 national guard while on active duty, including, but not limited to,
- 2 personnel on full-time national guard duty, personnel on part-time
- 3 national guard training, and national guard military technicians
- 4 who are civilians required to wear military uniforms. This
- 5 exemption does not apply to any of the following:
- 6 (i) United States reserve technicians.
- 7 (ii) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, a
- 8 person who is a civilian and in the employ of the armed forces
- 9 ARMED FORCES of the United States.
- 10 (b) A person while driving or operating a road roller, a snow
- 11 motor, road machinery, or a farm tractor or implement of husbandry
- 12 temporarily drawn, moved, or propelled on a highway, if the person
- 13 is a citizen of the United States or is otherwise eligible to be
- 14 issued an operator's license or chauffeur's license under section
- **15** 307(1).
- 16 (c) A nonresident who is not less than 16 years of age and who
- 17 has been licensed either as an operator or a chauffeur under a law
- 18 requiring the licensing of operators or chauffeurs in his or her
- 19 home state and who has in his or her immediate possession either a
- 20 valid operator's or a valid chauffeur's license issued to him or
- 21 her in his or her home state.
- 22 (d) A nonresident who is over the age of 17 years, whose home
- 23 state does not require the licensing of operators, may operate a
- 24 motor vehicle as an operator only, for a period of not more than 90
- 25 days in any calendar year, if all of the following apply:
- 26 (i) The motor vehicle is registered in the home state or
- 27 country of the nonresident.

- $oldsymbol{1}$ (ii) The nonresident has in his or her immediate possession a
- 2 registration card evidencing ownership and registration of the
- 3 motor vehicle in his or her home state or country, or is able at
- 4 any time or place required to prove lawful possession or the right
- 5 to operate the motor vehicle and to establish his or her proper
- 6 identity.
- 7 (iii) The nonresident is a citizen of the United States or is
- 8 otherwise eligible to be issued an operator's license or
- 9 chauffeur's license under section 307(1).
- 10 (e) A person who is a member of the armed forces—ARMED FORCES
- 11 of the United States on official leave, who on the date of his or
- 12 her orders granting leave possessed an operator's or chauffeur's
- 13 license, valid except for the expiration date of the license. This
- 14 exemption applies only to the person's first leave of absence
- 15 following the expiration of his or her license and exempts the
- 16 person from the provisions of this act for a period not to exceed
- **17** 30 days.
- 18 (f) A person who is a discharged member of the armed forces
- 19 ARMED FORCES of the United States, who on the date of his or her
- 20 discharge possesses an operator's or chauffeur's license, valid
- 21 except for the expiration date, for a period not to exceed 30 days
- 22 from date of discharge.
- 23 (q) A person who is a member of the armed forces—ARMED FORCES
- 24 of the United States, stationed in this state, who resides in
- 25 another state and has a valid license issued by the state in which
- 26 he or she resides.
- 27 (h) A person while operating a commercial motor vehicle in the

- 1 course of a driving test administered by a certified examiner
- 2 appointed by the secretary of state and while accompanied by the
- 3 examiner, if the person is a citizen of the United States or is
- 4 otherwise eligible to be issued an operator's license or
- 5 chauffeur's license under section 307(1).
- 6 (i) A person while operating a commercial motor vehicle who is
- 7 not disqualified from operating a commercial motor vehicle and who
- 8 holds a commercial driver license that is issued to him or her by
- 9 another state or jurisdiction under 49 CFR part 383.
- 10 (J) A PERSON WHILE OPERATING A DISABILITY MOBILITY VEHICLE. AS
- 11 USED IN THIS SUBDIVISION, "DISABILITY MOBILITY VEHICLE" MEANS A
- 12 WHEELCHAIR OR OTHER MOBILITY DEVICE POWERED BY A BATTERY, FUEL, OR
- 13 OTHER ENGINE AND DESIGNED TO BE USED BY AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A
- 14 MOBILITY DISABILITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOCOMOTION.
- 15 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 16 after the date it is enacted into law.
