HOUSE BILL No. 5866

April 24, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Bellino, Barrett and Noble and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
by amending sections 48703, 48703a, 48705, 48710, 48711, 48712,
48721, 48727, and 48735 (MCL 324.48703, 324.48703a, 324.48705,
324.48710, 324.48711, 324.48712, 324.48721, 324.48727, and
324.48735), section 48703 as amended by 2012 PA 471, section 48703a
as amended by 2016 PA 382, sections 48705 and 48710 as amended by
2018 PA 36, sections 48711, 48712, and 48727 as added by 1995 PA
57, section 48721 as amended by 2010 PA 30, and section 48735 as
amended by 2003 PA 270; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 48703. (1) A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not take, catch, or kill or attempt to take, catch, or kill a fish in the waters of

- 1 this state with a grab hook, snag hook, or gaff hook, by the use of
- 2 a set or night line or a net or firearm or an explosive substance
- 3 or combination of substances that have a tendency to kill or
- 4 stupefy fish, or by any other means or device other than a single
- 5 line or a single rod and line while held in the hand or under
- 6 immediate control, and with a hook or hooks attached, baited with a
- 7 natural or artificial bait while being used for still fishing, ice
- 8 fishing, casting, or trolling for fish, which is a means of the
- 9 fish taking the bait or hook in the mouth. A person AN INDIVIDUAL
- 10 shall not use more than 3 single lines or 3 single rods and lines,
- 11 or a single line and a single rod and line, and shall not attach
- 12 more than 6 hooks on all lines. The department shall have the
- 13 authority to COMMISSION MAY decrease the number of rods per angler.
- 14 However, the department COMMISSION shall not reduce the number of
- 15 rods per angler to less than 2. For the purposes of this part, a
- 16 hook is a single, double, or treble pointed hook. A hook, single,
- 17 double, or treble pointed, attached to a manufactured artificial
- 18 bait shall be IS counted as 1 hook. The department COMMISSION may
- 19 designate waters where a treble hook and an artificial bait or lure
- 20 having more than 1 single pointed hook shall MUST not be used
- 21 during the periods the department COMMISSION designates. In the
- 22 Great Lakes or recognized smelt waters, any numbers of hooks,
- 23 attached to a single line, may be used for the taking of smelt,
- 24 alewife, or other bait fish.
- 25 (2) A person—AN INDIVIDUAL shall not set or use a tip-up or
- 26 other similar device for the purpose of taking fish through the ice
- 27 unless the name and address of the person INDIVIDUAL owning the

- 1 tip-up or other similar device is marked in legible English on the
- 2 tip-up or other similar device or securely fastened to it by a
- 3 plate or tag.
- 4 (3) The department COMMISSION may issue an order to regulate
- 5 the taking of fish with a spear, bow and arrow, or crossbow in the
- 6 waters of this state.
- 7 (4) The department COMMISSION may issue an order to regulate
- 8 the taking of fish with nets in the waters of this state.
- 9 Sec. 48703a. (1) The legislature finds and declares that
- 10 aquatic invasive species, including Asian carp, represent a
- 11 significant threat to the state's fisheries, aquatic resources,
- 12 outdoor recreation and tourism economies, and public safety.
- 13 (2) The commission has the exclusive authority to regulate
- 14 sport fishing under this part. The commission shall, to the
- 15 greatest extent practicable, utilize principles of sound scientific
- 16 management in making decisions regarding the regulation of sport
- 17 fishing under this part. The commission may take testimony from
- 18 department personnel, independent experts, and others, and review
- 19 scientific literature and data, among other sources, in support of
- 20 the commission's duty to use principles of sound scientific
- 21 management. The commission shall issue orders regarding the
- 22 regulation of sport fishing under this part following a public
- 23 meeting and an opportunity for public input. Not less than 30 days
- 24 before issuing an order, the commission shall provide a copy of the
- 25 order to each of the following:
- 26 (a) Each member of each standing committee of the senate or
- 27 house of representatives that considers legislation pertaining to

- 1 conservation, the environment, natural resources, recreation,
- 2 tourism, or agriculture.
- 3 (b) The chairperson of the senate appropriations committee and
- 4 the chairperson of the house of representatives appropriations
- 5 committee.
- **6** (c) The members of the subcommittee of the senate
- 7 appropriations committee and the subcommittee of the house of
- 8 representatives appropriations committee that consider the budget
- 9 of the department of natural resources.
- 10 (3) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017, there is
- 11 appropriated for the department the sum of \$1,000,000.00 to
- 12 implement management practices necessary for rapid response,
- 13 prevention, control, or elimination of aquatic invasive species,
- 14 including Asian carp. Any portion of the amount under this section
- 15 that is not expended in the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017
- 16 shall not lapse to the general fund but shall be carried forward in
- 17 a work project account that is in compliance with section 451a of
- 18 the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a.
- 19 Sec. 48705. (1) Reptiles, amphibians, mollusks, and
- 20 crustaceans may only be taken in a manner and during those times
- 21 prescribed by the commission. An individual taking, trapping,
- 22 catching, or fishing for reptiles, amphibians, mollusks, or
- 23 crustaceans for their HIS OR HER personal use shall have a valid
- 24 fishing license issued under part 435.
- 25 (2) An individual shall not take, trap, catch, or fish for
- 26 reptiles or amphibians for commercial purposes.
- 27 (3) The department may , pursuant to part 13, issue permits

- 1 UNDER PART 13 to take amphibians and reptiles at any season of the
- 2 year for scientific or educational purposes. The department may
- 3 revoke a permit issued under this subsection.
- 4 Sec. 48710. This part does not prohibit the use of a gaff,
- 5 except on or along trout streams, or a landing net to assist in
- 6 landing fish already caught by a lawful device. This part does not
- 7 apply to a person AN INDIVIDUAL engaged in the business of
- 8 propagating fish under part 459 or to fish caught by a device for
- 9 which a lawful permit or license is obtained from the department
- 10 under this part.
- 11 Sec. 48711. A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not have in his or
- 12 her possession any net, set lines, jack or other artificial light
- 13 of any kind, dynamite, giant powder, or other explosive substance
- 14 or combination of substances, hook and line, or any other
- 15 contrivance or device to be used for the purpose of taking fish in
- 16 violation of this part or any other act or part. Any such property,
- 17 contrivance, or device found in the possession of a person AN
- 18 INDIVIDUAL or found in a boat, boathouse, or any other place on any
- 19 of the waters of this state or along the shores of the waters of
- 20 this state shall MUST be confiscated and disposed of in the manner
- 21 provided by law. A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not have a gaff in
- 22 his or her possession on or along any trout stream in this state or
- 23 use, except from June 1 to Labor Day, on any trout stream a single
- 24 hook of any kind that is more than 3/8 inches between the point of
- 25 the hook and the shank. This section does not prohibit the use or
- 26 possession of minnow seines, minnow traps, or dip nets as provided
- 27 in section 48730 or the use and possession of seines, nets, spears,

- 1 or artificial lights for the use of which a lawful permit or
- 2 license has been issued by the department. A person may have in his
- 3 or her possession an artificial light of any kind for taking white
- 4 bass. Commercial anglers who have licenses to take fish in the
- 5 Great Lakes may have in their possession nets or hook lines for
- 6 that purpose only. In prosecutions for the violations of this
- 7 section, and in proceedings for the confiscation of the property
- 8 described in this section, the possession of any such property,
- 9 contrivance, or device or, when not found in possession of any
- 10 person, INDIVIDUAL, the presence of any such property in a boat,
- 11 boathouse, or any other place on the waters of this state or along
- 12 the shores of the waters of this state is prima facie evidence that
- 13 the property is owned, possessed, or used for the purpose of
- 14 violating this part. The possession of any such property,
- 15 contrivance, or device on the waters of this state that are closed
- 16 to all fishing during the closed season on or along those waters is
- 17 prima facie evidence that the property is owned, possessed, or used
- 18 for the purpose of violating this part. This act or any other act
- 19 does not apply to the department in its program in fisheries
- 20 management or in the control of aquatic vegetation by individuals
- 21 under permit issued by the department when, in the opinion of the
- 22 department, that control is not inimical to the public interest.
- 23 Sec. 48712. A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not catch any fish or
- 24 attempt to catch any fish in any manner in any lake, stream, or
- 25 pond or portion of any lake, stream, or pond that is used by the
- 26 state or federal government for the propagation of fish, except in
- 27 the portion or portions of the lake, stream, or pond as may be

- 1 designated by the department COMMISSION as open to fishing.
- 2 Sec. 48721. (1) The department COMMISSION shall issue an order
- 3 under part 411 establishing possession limits of fish consistent
- 4 with this section. A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not possess more
- 5 than the daily possession limit or aggregate daily possession
- 6 limit, as applicable, of fish at the place where the fish were
- 7 taken or in route from that place to either of the following:
- 8 (a) His or her automobile or other principal means of land
- 9 transportation.
- 10 (b) His or her residence or temporary place of lodging.
- 11 (2) In addition to 1 day's possession limit of fish, a person
- 12 AN INDIVIDUAL may possess an additional 2 days' possession limit of
- 13 fish that are processed by any of the following methods:
- 14 (a) Canning in a sealed container.
- 15 (b) Curing by smoking or drying.
- 16 (c) Freezing in a solid state.
- 17 (3) A person's AN INDIVIDUAL'S processed fish aboard a vessel,
- 18 on the water or at dockside, shall be ARE considered to be in the
- 19 person's INDIVIDUAL'S possession for the purposes of subsection
- **20** (2).
- 21 (4) A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not possess a fish illegally
- 22 taken.
- 23 Sec. 48727. (1) On and after October 26, 1993, the snagging of
- 24 fish is illegal in this state.
- 25 (2) The department shall manage fisheries on the Pere
- 26 Marquette river at or above the site of the lamprey blocking weir.
- 27 Sec. 48735. (1) Subject to subsection (2), a person AN

- 1 INDIVIDUAL shall not take from any of the inland waters of this
- 2 state any fish in any manner for the purpose of fish culture or
- 3 scientific investigation without first obtaining a permit from the
- 4 department. , except that a person who is operating a private fish
- 5 pond may take fish from his or her own pond for the purpose of
- 6 propagation, scientific investigation, or sale under part 459.
- 7 (2) The SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (5), THE department may issue
- 8 permits to possess live game fish in public or private ponds,
- 9 pools, or aquariums under rules and regulations as the department
- 10 prescribes. This subsection is subject to subsection (5).
- 11 (3) The department may cause to be taken from the inland
- 12 waters of this state any species of fish for the purpose of
- 13 obtaining spawn for fish culture or scientific investigation or for
- 14 the protection of the inland waters from ecological damage or
- 15 imbalance. In addition, the department may cause to be taken from
- 16 the inland waters of this state species of fish that are not
- 17 required to maintain the fishery resources of the inland waters.
- 18 All fish taken under this subsection shall MUST be taken under the
- 19 supervision of a deputy of the department appointed for that
- 20 purpose and in accordance with the regulations of the department of
- 21 agriculture, and the fish may be sold or transferred by the
- 22 department.
- 23 (4) A person SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (5), AN INDIVIDUAL shall
- 24 not import or bring any live game fish, including viable eggs of
- 25 any game fish, from outside of this state except under a permit
- 26 from the department or under part 459 and the rules promulgated in
- 27 accordance with that part. A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not plant

- 1 any spawn, fry, or fish of any kind in any of the public waters of
- 2 this state or any other waters under the jurisdiction of this state
- 3 without first obtaining a permit from the department that states
- 4 the species, number, and approximate size or age of the spawn, fry,
- 5 or fish to be planted and the name and location of the waters where
- 6 the spawn, fry, or fish shall ARE TO be planted. A permit is not
- 7 required to plant spawn, fry, or fish furnished by the federal or
- 8 state government. This subsection is subject to subsection (5).
- 9 (5) A permit under subsection (2) or (4) does not include a
- 10 genetically engineered variant of a fish species identified in the
- 11 permit unless the genetically engineered variant is specifically
- 12 identified in the permit. A permit under subsection (2) or (4) may
- 13 be limited to a genetically engineered fish.
- 14 (6) A permit under this section shall MUST be exhibited upon
- 15 the request of any law enforcement officer.
- 16 (7) The department shall annually report to the legislature
- 17 all fish sold or transferred pursuant to UNDER this part.
- 18 Enacting section 1. Sections 48704, 48708, 48714, 48715,
- **19** 48716, 48717, 48718, 48719, 48720, 48725, and 48733 of the natural
- 20 resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL
- **21** 324.48704, 324.48708, 324.48714, 324.48715, 324.48716, 324.48717,
- 22 324.48718, 324.48719, 324.48720, 324.48725, and 324.48733, are
- 23 repealed.
