HOUSE BILL No. 6048

May 17, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Lilly, Lower, Kesto and Miller and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"

by amending sections 1, 1a, and 2 (MCL 28.291, 28.291a, and 28.292), section 1 as amended by 2012 PA 25, section 1a as amended by 2008 PA 31, and section 2 as amended by 2017 PA 31.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) A person who is a resident of this state may apply
 - to the department of state for an official state personal
- 3 identification card. Upon application, the applicant shall supply a
- photographic identity document, a birth certificate, AN AFFIDAVIT
 - AND INFORMATION UNDER SUBSECTIONS (3) AND (4), or other
 - nonphotographic identity document, and other sufficient documents

- 1 as the secretary of state may require to verify the identity and
- 2 citizenship of the applicant. If an applicant for an official state
- 3 personal identification card is not a citizen of the United States,
- 4 the applicant shall supply a photographic identity document and
- 5 other sufficient documents to verify the identity of the applicant
- 6 and the applicant's legal presence in the United States under
- 7 subsection (5). (8). The documents required under this subsection
- 8 shall MUST include the applicant's full legal name, date of birth,
- 9 address, and residency and demonstrate that the applicant is a
- 10 citizen of the United States or is legally present in the United
- 11 States. If the applicant's full legal name differs from the name of
- 12 the applicant that appears on a document presented under this
- 13 subsection, the applicant shall present documents to verify his or
- 14 her current full legal name. An application for a state personal
- 15 identification card shall MUST be made in a manner prescribed by
- 16 the secretary of state and shall MUST contain the applicant's full
- 17 legal name, date of birth, residence address, height, sex, eye
- 18 color, signature, intent to be an organ donor, other information
- 19 required or permitted on the official state personal identification
- 20 card and, only to the extent to comply with federal law, the
- 21 applicant's social security SOCIAL SECURITY number. The applicant
- 22 may provide a mailing address if the applicant receives mail at an
- 23 address different from his or her residence address.
- 24 (2) The secretary of state shall accept as 1 of the
- 25 identification documents required under subsection (1) an
- 26 identification card issued by the department of corrections to
- 27 prisoners who are placed on parole or released from a correctional

- 1 facility, containing the prisoner's legal name, photograph, and
- 2 other information identifying the prisoner as provided in section
- **3** 37(4) of the corrections code of 1953, 1953 PA 232, MCL 791.237.
- 4 (3) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTIONS (4) AND (5), IN LIEU OF A BIRTH
- 5 CERTIFICATE OR OTHER NONPHOTOGRAPHIC IDENTITY DOCUMENT REQUIRED
- 6 UNDER SUBSECTION (1), THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ACCEPT AN
- 7 AFFIDAVIT IN A FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE, MADE BY
- 8 AN APPLICANT UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY, THAT INCLUDES, AT A MINIMUM,
- 9 ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 10 (A) THE APPLICANT'S DATE OF BIRTH AS REPRESENTED BY THE
- 11 APPLICANT.
- 12 (B) THAT THE APPLICANT IS A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES AND
- 13 POSSESSES THE QUALIFICATIONS OF AN ELECTOR UNDER SECTION 492 OF THE
- 14 MICHIGAN ELECTION LAW, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.492.
- 15 (C) THAT THE APPLICANT HAS ATTEMPTED AND FAILED TO OBTAIN A
- 16 BIRTH CERTIFICATE OR OTHER FORM OF NONPHOTOGRAPHIC IDENTIFICATION
- 17 REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (1) FROM THE APPLICANT'S STATE, UNITED
- 18 STATES TERRITORY, OR FOREIGN COUNTRY OF BIRTH AS A RESULT OF EITHER
- 19 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 20 (i) A REQUESTED RECORD CANNOT BE LOCATED BY THE APPLICANT'S
- 21 STATE, UNITED STATES TERRITORY, OR FOREIGN COUNTRY OF BIRTH.
- 22 (ii) THE APPLICANT IS INDIGENT, AND THE COST OF OBTAINING THE
- 23 RECORD IS PROHIBITIVE TO THE APPLICANT.
- 24 (D) THAT THE APPLICANT DOES NOT POSSESS ANY OTHER FORM OF
- 25 IDENTIFICATION FOR ELECTION PURPOSES AND REQUIRES AN OFFICIAL STATE
- 26 PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD TO VOTE.
- 27 (4) AN AFFIDAVIT DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (3) MUST BE

- 1 ACCOMPANIED BY ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 2 (i) DOCUMENTATION FROM OR EVIDENCE OF COMMUNICATION WITH THE
- 3 APPLICANT'S STATE, UNITED STATES TERRITORY, OR FOREIGN COUNTRY OF
- 4 BIRTH SUPPORTING THE APPLICANT'S ATTESTATION UNDER SUBSECTION
- 5 (3)(C)(i), IF APPLICABLE.
- 6 (ii) DOCUMENTATION OF THE COST OF THE REQUESTED RECORD
- 7 DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (3) (C) (ii), IF APPLICABLE, AND WHETHER THE
- 8 APPLICANT IS OR IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR ANY REDUCED OR WAIVED FEE TO
- 9 OBTAIN THAT RECORD.
- 10 (iii) AT LEAST 1 DOCUMENT SUPPORTING THE APPLICANT'S
- 11 ATTESTATION UNDER SUBSECTION (3) (A).
- 12 (iv) AN OFFICIAL STATEMENT FROM THE STATE REGISTRAR OR A LOCAL
- 13 REGISTRAR DESCRIBED IN SECTION 2891(2) OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH CODE,
- 14 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.2891, THAT A MICHIGAN BIRTH CERTIFICATE COULD
- 15 NOT BE LOCATED FOR THE APPLICANT.
- 16 (5) AN OFFICIAL STATE PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED BY
- 17 THE SECRETARY OF STATE USING AN AFFIDAVIT DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION
- 18 (3) MUST ONLY BE ISSUED IF THE ISSUANCE OTHERWISE COMPLIES WITH
- 19 THIS ACT, AND ANY OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS OR REGULATIONS OF THIS
- 20 STATE OR THE UNITED STATES.
- 21 (6) (3)—The secretary of state shall have electronic access to
- 22 prisoner information maintained by the department of corrections
- 23 for the purpose of verifying the identity of a prisoner who applies
- 24 for an official state identification card under subsection (1).
- 25 (7) (4)—The secretary of state shall not issue an official
- 26 state personal identification card to a person who holds an
- 27 operator's or chauffeur's license issued under the Michigan vehicle

- 1 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, unless the license has
- 2 been suspended, revoked, or restricted.
- 3 (8) (5)—If the applicant is not a citizen of the United
- 4 States, the applicant shall provide, and the department shall
- 5 verify, documents demonstrating his or her legal presence in the
- 6 United States. Nothing in this act shall obligate or be construed
- 7 to obligate this state to comply with title II of the real ID act
- 8 of 2005, Public Law 109-13. The secretary of state may adopt rules
- 9 under the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL
- 10 24.201 to 24.328, as are necessary for the administration of this
- 11 subsection. A determination by the secretary of state that an
- 12 applicant is not legally present in the United States may be
- 13 appealed under section 631 of the revised judicature act of 1961,
- 14 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.631.
- 15 (9) (6) The secretary of state shall not disclose a social
- 16 security SOCIAL SECURITY number obtained under subsection (1) to
- 17 another person except for use for 1 or more of the following
- 18 purposes:
- 19 (a) Compliance with 49 USC 31301 to 31317 and regulations and
- 20 rules related to this act.
- 21 (b) To carry out the purposes of section 466(a) of the social
- 22 security act, 42 USC 666, in connection with matters relating to
- 23 paternity, child support, or overdue child support.
- 24 (c) With TO the department of community health, HEALTH AND
- 25 HUMAN SERVICES for comparison with vital records maintained by the
- 26 department of community health AND HUMAN SERVICES under part 28 of
- 27 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.2801 to 333.2899.

- 1 (d) As otherwise required by law.
- 2 (10) (7) The secretary of state shall not display a person's
- 3 social security SOCIAL SECURITY number on the person's official
- 4 state personal identification card.
- 5 (11) (8) A requirement under this section to include a social
- 6 security SOCIAL SECURITY number on an application does not apply to
- 7 an applicant who demonstrates he or she is exempt under law from
- 8 obtaining a social security SOCIAL SECURITY number.
- 9 (12) (9) The secretary of state, with the approval of the
- 10 state administrative board created under 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.1 to
- 11 17.3, may enter into agreements with the United States government
- 12 to verify whether an applicant for an official state personal
- 13 identification card under this section who is not a citizen of the
- 14 United States is authorized under federal law to be present in the
- 15 United States.
- 16 (13) (10)—The secretary of state shall not issue an official
- 17 state personal identification card to a person holding an official
- 18 state personal identification card issued by another state without
- 19 confirmation that the person is terminating or has terminated the
- 20 official state personal identification card issued by the other
- 21 state.
- 22 (14) (11) The secretary of state shall do all of the
- 23 following:
- 24 (a) Ensure the physical security of locations where official
- 25 state personal identification cards are produced and the security
- 26 of document materials and papers from which official state personal
- 27 identification cards are produced.

- 1 (b) Subject all persons authorized to manufacture or produce
- 2 official state personal identification cards and all persons who
- 3 have the ability to affect the identity information that appears on
- 4 official state personal identification cards to appropriate
- 5 security clearance requirements. The security requirements of this
- 6 subdivision and subdivision (a) may require that official state
- 7 personal identification cards be manufactured or produced in this
- 8 state.
- **9** (c) Provide fraudulent document recognition programs to
- 10 department of state employees engaged in the issuance of official
- 11 state personal identification cards.
- 12 Sec. 1a. As used in this act:
- 13 (a) "Highly restricted personal information" includes an
- 14 individual's photograph or image, social security SOCIAL SECURITY
- 15 number, digitized signature, and medical and disability information
- 16 and source documents presented by an applicant to obtain a AN
- 17 OFFICIAL STATE personal identification card under section 1.
- 18 (b) "Personal information" means information that identifies
- 19 an individual, including the individual's photograph or image,
- 20 name, address (but not the 5-digit zip code), driver license
- 21 number, social security SOCIAL SECURITY number, telephone number,
- 22 digitized signature, and medical and disability information.
- 23 (C) "IDENTIFICATION FOR ELECTION PURPOSES" MEANS THAT TERM AS
- 24 DEFINED IN SECTION 2 OF THE MICHIGAN ELECTION LAW, 1954 PA 116, MCL
- 25 168.2.
- 26 (D) (e)—"Residence address" means the place that is the
- 27 settled home or domicile at which a person legally resides, which

- 1 meets the definition of residence as THAT TERM IS defined in
- 2 section 11 of the Michigan election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.11.
- 3 (E) (d)—"Resident" means every person who resides in this
- 4 state and establishes that he or she is legally present in the
- 5 United States. This definition applies to the provisions of this
- 6 act only.
- 7 Sec. 2. (1) An official state personal identification card
- 8 must contain the following:
- 9 (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the
- 10 individual to whom the card is issued.
- 11 (b) The full legal name, date of birth, sex, residence
- 12 address, height, weight, eye color, digital photographic image,
- 13 signature of or verification and certification by the applicant, as
- 14 determined by the secretary of state, and expiration date of the
- 15 official state personal identification card.
- 16 (c) An indication that the identification card contains 1 or
- 17 more of the following:
- (i) The blood type of the individual.
- 19 (ii) Immunization data of the individual.
- 20 (iii) Medication data of the individual.
- (iv) A statement that the individual is deaf.
- 22 (d) In the case of a holder of an official state personal
- 23 identification card who has indicated his or her wish to
- 24 participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of
- 25 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, a
- 26 heart insignia on the front of the official state personal
- 27 identification card.

- 1 (e) If requested by an individual who is a veteran as that
- 2 term is defined in section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61, a
- 3 designation that the individual is a veteran. The designation shall
- 4 MUST be in a style and format considered appropriate by the
- 5 secretary of state. The secretary of state shall require proof of
- 6 discharge or separation of service from the armed forces of this
- 7 state, another state, or the United States, and the nature of that
- 8 discharge, for the purposes of verifying an individual's status as
- 9 a veteran under this subdivision. The secretary of state shall
- 10 consult with the department of military and veterans affairs in
- 11 determining the proof that shall MUST be required to identify an
- 12 individual's status as a veteran for the purposes of this
- 13 subsection. The secretary of state may provide the department of
- 14 military and veterans affairs and agencies of the counties of this
- 15 state that provide veteran services with information provided by an
- 16 applicant under this subsection for the purpose of veterans'
- 17 benefits eligibility referral.
- (f) Physical security features designed to prevent tampering,
- 19 counterfeiting, or duplication of the official state personal
- 20 identification card for fraudulent purposes.
- 21 (2) In conjunction with the application for an official state
- 22 personal identification card, the secretary of state shall do all
- 23 of the following:
- 24 (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:
- 25 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an
- 26 anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public
- 27 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in

- 1 accordance with this section.
- (ii) Information describing the donor registry program
- 3 maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ procurement
- 4 organization or its successor organization under section 10120 of
- 5 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120. The information
- 6 required under this subparagraph includes the address and telephone
- 7 number of Michigan's federally designated organ procurement
- 8 organization or its successor organization as described in section
- 9 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120.
- 10 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to have
- 11 his or her name placed on the registry described in subparagraph
- **12** (*ii*).
- 13 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on
- 14 his or her official state personal identification card that he or
- 15 she is willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death
- 16 under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 17 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in accordance with this section.
- 18 (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she indicates to the
- 19 secretary of state under this section a willingness to have his or
- 20 her name placed on the donor registry described in subdivision
- 21 (a) (ii), the secretary of state will mark the applicant's record
- 22 for the donor registry.
- 23 (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
- 24 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:
- 25 (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
- 26 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal
- 27 identification card.

- (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally
 appears at a secretary of state branch office.
- 3 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for
- 4 applications processed by electronic means.
- 5 (4) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the
- 6 official state personal identification card. The secretary of state
- 7 shall designate a space on the official state personal
- 8 identification card where the applicant may place a sticker or
- 9 decal of a uniform size as the secretary may specify to indicate
- 10 that the cardholder carries a separate emergency medical
- 11 information card. The sticker or decal may be provided by any
- 12 person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested
- in assisting in implementing the emergency medical information
- 14 card, but must meet the specifications of the secretary of state.
- 15 The sticker or decal also may be used to indicate that the
- 16 cardholder has designated 1 or more patient advocates in accordance
- 17 with section 5506 of the estates and protected individuals code,
- 18 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506. The emergency medical information card,
- 19 carried separately by the cardholder, may contain the information
- 20 described in subsection (2)(c), information concerning the
- 21 cardholder's patient advocate designation, other emergency medical
- 22 information, or an indication as to where the cardholder has stored
- 23 or registered emergency medical information. An original official
- 24 state personal identification card or the renewal of an existing
- 25 official state personal identification card issued to an individual
- 26 less than 21 years of age must be portrait or vertical in form, and
- 27 an official state personal identification card issued to an

- 1 individual 21 years of age or over must be landscape or horizontal
- 2 in form. Except as otherwise required in this act, other
- 3 information required on the official state personal identification
- 4 card under this act may appear on the official state personal
- 5 identification card in a form prescribed by the secretary of state.
- **6** (5) The official state personal identification card must not
- 7 contain a fingerprint or finger image of the applicant.
- **8** (6) Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 9 state shall retain and use an individual's digital photographic
- 10 image and signature described in subsection (1)(b) only for
- 11 programs administered by the secretary of state as specifically
- 12 authorized by law. An individual's digital photographic image or
- 13 signature must only be used as follows:
- 14 (a) By a federal, state, or local governmental agency for a
- 15 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.
- 16 (b) By the secretary of state for a use specifically
- 17 authorized by law.
- 18 (c) For BY the secretary of state to forward FOR FORWARDING to
- 19 the department of state police the images of individuals required
- 20 to be registered under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA
- 21 295, MCL 28.721 to 28.736, upon the department of state police
- 22 providing the secretary of state an updated list of those
- 23 individuals.
- 24 (d) For BY the secretary of state to forward FOR FORWARDING to
- 25 the department of state police a digitized photograph taken of the
- 26 applicant for an official state personal identification card for
- 27 use as provided in section 5c of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.425c.

- 1 (e) As necessary to comply with a law of this state or the
- 2 United States.
- 3 (7) If an individual presents evidence of statutory blindness
- 4 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued
- 5 or is the holder of an official state personal identification card,
- 6 the secretary of state shall mark the individual's official state
- 7 personal identification card in a manner that clearly indicates
- 8 that the cardholder is legally blind.
- 9 (8) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an
- 10 individual who indicates a willingness to have his or her name
- 11 placed on the donor registry described in subsection (2)(a)(ii).
- 12 Information about an individual's indication of a willingness to
- 13 have his or her name placed on the donor registry that is obtained
- 14 by the secretary of state and forwarded under this section is
- 15 exempt from disclosure under section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of
- 16 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.243. As required in section
- 17 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the
- 18 secretary of state shall establish and maintain the donor registry
- 19 in a manner that complies with that section and that provides
- 20 electronic access, including, but not limited to, the transfer of
- 21 data to this state's federally designated organ procurement
- 22 organization or its successor organization, tissue banks, and eye
- 23 banks.
- 24 (9) An official state personal identification card may contain
- 25 an identifier for voter registration VOTING purposes. THE SECRETARY
- 26 OF STATE SHALL MARK AN OFFICIAL STATE PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD
- 27 IN A MANNER THAT CLEARLY INDICATES THAT THE STATE PERSONAL

- 1 IDENTIFICATION CARD WAS ISSUED USING AN AFFIDAVIT AND INFORMATION
- 2 UNDER SECTION 1(3) AND (4) IN THE SAME MANNER AS AN OFFICIAL STATE
- 3 PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED UNDER PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BY
- 4 THE SECRETARY OF STATE TO COMPLY WITH 6 CFR 37.71.
- 5 (10) An official state personal identification card must
- 6 contain information appearing in electronic or machine readable
- 7 codes needed to conduct a transaction with the secretary of state.
- 8 The information must be limited to the information described in
- 9 subsection (1)(a) and (b) except for the person's digital
- 10 photographic image and signature or verification and certification,
- 11 state of issuance, and other information necessary for use with
- 12 electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic teller machines
- 13 and must not contain the individual's driving record or other
- 14 personal identifier. The official state personal identification
- 15 card must identify the encoded information.
- 16 (11) An official state personal identification card must be
- 17 issued only upon authorization of the secretary of state, and must
- 18 be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible the
- 19 ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate the
- 20 official state personal identification card without ready
- 21 detection.
- 22 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant
- 23 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each
- 24 original or renewal official state personal identification card
- 25 issued. The department of treasury shall deposit the fees received
- 26 and collected under this section in the state treasury to the
- 27 credit of the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the

- 1 fees credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary
- 2 of state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from
- 3 the Michigan transportation fund created under section 10 of 1951
- 4 PA 51, MCL 247.660, must not be used to compensate the secretary of
- 5 state for costs incurred and services performed under this section.
- **6** (13) An original or renewal official state personal
- 7 identification card expires on the birthday of the individual to
- 8 whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date of issuance
- 9 or on the date the individual is no longer considered to be legally
- 10 present in the United States under section 1, whichever is earlier.
- 11 The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal
- 12 identification card under this act for a period greater than 4
- 13 years. Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 14 state may issue a renewal official state personal identification
- 15 card for 1 additional 4-year period by mail or by other methods
- 16 prescribed by the secretary of state. The secretary of state shall
- 17 require renewal in person by an individual required under section
- 18 5a of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a,
- 19 to maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's license or official
- 20 state personal identification card.
- 21 (14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee under this
- 22 section if the applicant is any of the following:
- 23 (a) An individual 65 years of age or older.
- 24 (b) An individual who has had his or her operator's or
- 25 chauffeur's license suspended, revoked, or denied under the
- 26 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, because
- 27 of a mental or physical infirmity or disability.

- 1 (c) An individual who presents evidence of statutory blindness
- 2 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368.
- 3 (d) An individual who presents other good cause for a fee
- 4 waiver.
- 5 (e) An individual who decides to add or remove a heart
- 6 insignia described in subsection (1)(d).
- 7 (F) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DOES NOT POSSESS IDENTIFICATION FOR
- 8 ELECTION PURPOSES, WHO POSSESSES THE QUALIFICATIONS OF AN ELECTOR
- 9 UNDER SECTION 492 OF THE MICHIGAN ELECTION LAW, 1954 PA 116, MCL
- 10 168.492, AND WHO CERTIFIES UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY IN A FORM
- 11 PRESCRIBED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE THAT THE INDIVIDUAL REQUIRES
- 12 AN OFFICIAL STATE PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD TO VOTE AND CANNOT
- 13 OTHERWISE OBTAIN IDENTIFICATION FOR ELECTION PURPOSES WITHOUT
- 14 PAYMENT OF A FEE TO THE ISSUING AGENCY THAT IS PROHIBITIVE TO THE
- 15 INDIVIDUAL.
- 16 (15) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 17 personal identification card shall apply for a renewal official
- 18 state personal identification card if the individual changes his or
- 19 her name.
- 20 (16) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 21 personal identification card shall apply for a corrected
- 22 identification card if he or she changes his or her residence
- 23 address. The secretary of state may correct the address on an
- 24 official state personal identification card by a method prescribed
- 25 by the secretary of state. A fee must not be charged for a change
- 26 of residence address.
- 27 (17) An individual who has been issued an official state

- 1 personal identification card may apply for a renewal official state
- 2 personal identification card for 1 or more of the following
- 3 reasons:
- 4 (a) The individual wants to change any information on the
- 5 official state personal identification card.
- 6 (b) An official state personal identification card issued
- 7 under this act is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes
- 8 illegible.
- 9 (18) An individual may indicate on an official state personal
- 10 identification card in a place designated by the secretary of state
- 11 his or her blood type, emergency contact information, immunization
- 12 data, medication data, or a statement that the individual is deaf.
- 13 (19) No later than January 1, 2017, the secretary of state
- 14 shall develop and shall, in conjunction with the department of
- 15 state police, implement a process using the L.E.I.N. or any other
- 16 appropriate system that limits access to law enforcement that
- 17 allows law enforcement agencies of this state to access emergency
- 18 contact information that the holder of an official state personal
- 19 identification card has voluntarily provided to the secretary of
- 20 state. As used in this subsection, "emergency contact information"
- 21 means the name, telephone number, or address of an individual that
- 22 is used for the sole purpose of contacting that individual when the
- 23 holder of an official state personal identification card has been
- 24 involved in an emergency.
- 25 (20) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state
- 26 that he or she is a minor who has been emancipated under 1968 PA
- 27 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal identification

- 1 card must bear the designation of the individual's emancipated
- 2 status in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state.
- 3 (21) The secretary of state shall inquire of each individual
- 4 who applies for or who holds an official state personal
- 5 identification card, in person or by mail, whether he or she agrees
- 6 to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101
- 7 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123.
- 8 An individual who has agreed to participate in the donor registry
- 9 is not considered to have revoked that agreement solely because the
- 10 individual's official state personal identification card has
- 11 expired. Enrollment in the donor registry is a legal agreement that
- 12 remains binding and in effect after the donor's death regardless of
- 13 the expressed desires of the deceased donor's next of kin who may
- 14 oppose the donor's anatomical gift.
- 15 (22) A valid official state personal identification card
- 16 presented by the individual to whom the card is issued is
- 17 considered the same as a valid state of Michigan driver license
- 18 when identification is requested except as otherwise specifically
- 19 provided by law.
- 20 (23) FOR THE 2017-2018 FISCAL YEAR, \$1,000,000.00 IS
- 21 APPROPRIATED FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE FOR
- 22 ISSUING OFFICIAL STATE PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CARDS AND TO
- 23 IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS
- 24 SUBSECTION.
- 25 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 26 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 27 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
