HOUSE BILL No. 6091

May 30, 2018, Introduced by Rep. Sabo and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to prohibit certain employers from requiring employees and employees' spouses and dependents to participate in certain activities; and to provide sanctions and remedies.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "employee benefits relinquishment act".
- **3** Sec. 3. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Employee" means an individual who receives compensation for performing services for an employer under an express or implied contract of hire.
 - (b) "Employer" means an individual or entity that employs 1 or more employees. Employer does not include this state, an agency of this state, or a political subdivision of this state.

- 1 Sec. 5. An employer that offers or contributes to health
- 2 insurance coverage for its employees shall not require an employee
- 3 who opts out of the health insurance coverage, or the employee's
- 4 spouse or dependent, to participate in an exit interview or exit
- 5 program as a condition of receiving a benefit the employer offers
- 6 to employees who opt out of the health insurance coverage.
- 7 Sec. 7. (1) An employer that violates or threatens or attempts
- 8 to violate section 5 is liable to an employee affected by the
- 9 violation, threat, or attempt for damages equal to the opt-out
- 10 benefit that the employee did receive or would have received. An
- 11 employee affected by the violation, threat, or attempt may bring a
- 12 civil action for damages or injunctive relief, or both. In
- 13 addition, a court shall award court costs and reasonable attorney
- 14 fees to an employee who prevails in an action brought under this
- 15 subsection.
- 16 (2) The attorney general may bring an action under subsection
- 17 (1) on behalf of 1 or more employees affected by a violation or
