- Sec. 104. (1) "Department" means the department of licensing
 and regulatory affairs.
 - (2) "Director" means the director of the department or his or her authorized representative.
 - (3) "Disability" means an infirmity that prevents a board member from performing a duty assigned to the board member.
 - (4) "Files" means the records, memoranda, opinions, minutes, and similar written materials that were formerly in the physical dominion of a board abolished by this act and the records,

- 3 (5) "Formal complaint" means a document that states the
