HOUSE BILL No. 6114

June 6, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Theis, Hoitenga, Bellino, Griffin, Moss and Iden and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1986 PA 268, entitled "Legislative council act,"

(MCL 4.1101 to 4.1901) by adding section 404.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 404. (1) IN ADDITION TO ITS DUTIES UNDER SECTION 403,
- 2 AFTER A BILL THAT ENACTS OR AMENDS AN OCCUPATIONAL REGULATION IS
- 3 INTRODUCED, THE MICHIGAN LAW REVISION COMMISSION SHALL REVIEW THE
- 4 LEGISLATION TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE LEGISLATION MEETS THE POLICY
- 5 OF USING THE LEAST RESTRICTIVE REGULATION NECESSARY TO PROTECT
 - CONSUMERS FROM PRESENT, SIGNIFICANT, AND SUBSTANTIATED HARMS THAT
- 7 THREATEN PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY. ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO
- 8 THE REVIEW OF PENDING LEGISLATION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION:
 - (A) THE COMMISSION MAY REQUIRE THE LEGISLATION'S PROPONENTS TO SUBMIT EVIDENCE OF PRESENT, SIGNIFICANT, AND SUBSTANTIATED HARMS TO

- 1 CONSUMERS IN THE STATE. THE COMMISSION ALSO MAY REQUIRE INFORMATION
- 2 FROM OTHER INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE KNOWLEDGEABLE ABOUT THE OCCUPATION,
- 3 LABOR ECONOMICS, OR OTHER RELEVANT FACTORS.
- 4 (B) THE COMMISSION SHALL EVALUATE THE EFFECTS OF THE
- 5 LEGISLATION ON OPPORTUNITIES FOR WORKERS, CONSUMER CHOICES AND
- 6 COSTS, GENERAL UNEMPLOYMENT, MARKET COMPETITION, AND GOVERNMENTAL
- 7 COSTS AND ANY OTHER EFFECTS OF THE LEGISLATION IF ENACTED.
- 8 (C) THE COMMISSION SHALL COMPARE THE MANNER IN WHICH THE
- 9 LEGISLATION WOULD REGULATE AN OCCUPATION IF ENACTED TO WHETHER OR
- 10 HOW OTHER STATES REGULATE THE OCCUPATION.
- 11 (D) THE COMMISSION SHALL COMPLETE THE REVIEW, PREPARE A
- 12 WRITTEN REPORT OF THE RESULTS OF THE REVIEW, AND SUBMIT THE REPORT
- 13 TO THE COMMITTEE TO WHICH THE LEGISLATION WAS REFERRED, ON A TIMELY
- 14 BASIS.
- 15 (2) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2019, THE COMMISSION SHALL REVIEW
- 16 ANNUALLY THE OCCUPATIONAL REGULATIONS OF APPROXIMATELY 20% OF THE
- 17 OCCUPATIONS THAT ARE SUBJECT TO STATE REGULATION, AND OVER EACH 5-
- 18 YEAR PERIOD REVIEW ALL OCCUPATIONAL REGULATIONS THAT ARE SUBJECT TO
- 19 STATE REGULATION, AND SHALL EVALUATE WHETHER THOSE REGULATIONS ARE
- 20 CONSISTENT WITH THE POLICY OF USING THE LEAST RESTRICTIVE
- 21 REGULATION NECESSARY TO PROTECT CONSUMERS FROM PRESENT,
- 22 SIGNIFICANT, AND SUBSTANTIATED HARMS THAT THREATEN PUBLIC HEALTH
- 23 AND SAFETY. FOR PURPOSES OF ITS REVIEW UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE
- 24 COMMISSION MAY REQUIRE THAT AN OCCUPATIONAL BOARD, ITS MEMBERS, AND
- 25 OTHER PERSONS SUBMIT INFORMATION TO THE COMMISSION.
- 26 (3) IN ITS ANALYSIS UNDER SUBSECTIONS (1) AND (2), THE
- 27 COMMISSION SHALL EMPLOY A REBUTTABLE PRESUMPTION THAT MARKET

- 1 COMPETITION AND PRIVATE REMEDIES ARE SUFFICIENT TO PROTECT
- 2 CONSUMERS; AND IF THAT PRESUMPTION IS REBUTTED, WHERE APPROPRIATE,
- 3 STATE REGULATIONS SHOULD BE TAILORED TO ADDRESS SPECIFIC MARKET
- 4 FAILURES IDENTIFIED BY THE COMMISSION TO PROTECT CONSUMERS FROM 1
- 5 OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING, AS APPROPRIATE:
- 6 (A) FRAUD, BY STRENGTHENING POWERS UNDER THE MICHIGAN CONSUMER
- 7 PROTECTION ACT, 1976 PA 331, MCL 445.901 TO 445.922, AND OTHER
- 8 DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICES STATUTES IN THIS STATE.
- 9 (B) UNSANITARY FACILITIES AND GENERAL HEALTH AND SAFETY
- 10 CONCERNS, BY PERIODIC INSPECTIONS.
- 11 (C) POTENTIAL DAMAGES TO THE BUYER OR TO THIRD PARTIES THAT
- 12 ARE NOT A PARTY TO A CONTRACT BETWEEN A SELLER AND BUYER, AND FROM
- 13 OTHER TYPES OF EXTERNALITIES BY BONDING OR INSURANCE.
- 14 (D) POTENTIAL DAMAGES BY TRANSIENT OR FLY-BY-NIGHT PROVIDERS
- 15 BY REQUIRING REGISTRATION WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE.
- 16 (E) ASYMMETRICAL INFORMATION BETWEEN A SELLER AND BUYER, BY
- 17 VOLUNTARY CERTIFICATION.
- 18 (F) GOVERNMENTAL REIMBURSEMENT FOR PROVIDING MEDICAL SERVICES
- 19 FOR NEW OR HIGHLY SPECIALIZED MEDICAL PROVISIONS BY A SPECIALTY
- 20 LICENSE FOR MEDICAL REIMBURSEMENT.
- 21 (4) BY JANUARY 31, 2020, AND BY EACH SUBSEQUENT JANUARY 31,
- 22 THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FINDINGS OF ITS
- 23 REVIEWS UNDER SUBSECTION (2) IN THE PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR TO THE
- 24 SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE SENATE MAJORITY
- 25 LEADER, AND THE ATTORNEY GENERAL. IN THE REPORT ABOUT AN
- 26 OCCUPATIONAL REGULATION, THE COMMISSION SHALL DO 1 OF THE
- 27 FOLLOWING:

- 4 LEGISLATION THAT DOES 1 OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 5 (i) REPEALS OR RESCINDS THE OCCUPATIONAL REGULATION.
- 6 (ii) CONVERTS THE OCCUPATIONAL REGULATION TO A LESS
- 7 RESTRICTIVE REGULATION THAT REFLECTS THE POLICY DESCRIBED IN
- 8 SUBSECTION (2).
- 9 (iii) INSTRUCTS THE RELEVANT LICENSING BOARD OR AGENCY TO
- 10 PROMULGATE A REVISED OCCUPATIONAL REGULATION.
- 11 (iv) REFLECTS ANY OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMISSION.
- 12 (B) IF THE COMMISSION CONCLUDES AS A RESULT OF THE REVIEW THAT
- 13 THE OCCUPATIONAL REGULATION DOES REFLECT THE POLICY DESCRIBED IN
- 14 SUBSECTION (2), RECOMMEND THAT THE LEGISLATURE NOT ENACT NEW
- 15 LEGISLATION.
- 16 (5) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 17 (A) "CERTIFICATION" MEANS A VOLUNTARY PROGRAM IN WHICH A
- 18 PRIVATE ORGANIZATION OR THE GOVERNMENT OF THIS STATE GRANTS
- 19 NONTRANSFERABLE RECOGNITION TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO MEETS PERSONAL
- 20 QUALIFICATIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE PRIVATE ORGANIZATION OR THE
- 21 GOVERNMENT OF THIS STATE. ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY FOR PURPOSES
- 22 OF THE INTERPRETATION OF CERTIFICATION:
- 23 (i) CERTIFICATION INCLUDES THE AUTHORITY TO USE "CERTIFIED" AS
- 24 A DESIGNATED TITLE IF CERTIFICATION IS GRANTED.
- 25 (ii) A PROGRAM OF CERTIFICATION DOES NOT PREVENT A
- 26 NONCERTIFIED INDIVIDUAL FROM PERFORMING THE LAWFUL OCCUPATION OF AN
- 27 INDIVIDUAL WHO HOLDS A CERTIFICATION FOR COMPENSATION, BUT THAT

- 1 INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT USE THE TITLE "CERTIFIED".
- 2 (iii) CERTIFICATION IS NOT SYNONYMOUS WITH THE TERM
- 3 OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE.
- 4 (iv) THE USE OF THE WORD "CERTIFICATION" OR "CERTIFIED" IN
- 5 OTHER STATUTES OF THIS STATE TO MEAN REQUIRING AN INDIVIDUAL TO
- 6 MEET CERTAIN PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS TO WORK LEGALLY, SUCH AS
- 7 REQUIRING A CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT TO BECOME CERTIFIED BEFORE
- 8 WORKING LEGALLY, SHALL BE INTERPRETED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS
- 9 SECTION AS REQUIRING AN INDIVIDUAL TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF AN
- 10 OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE.
- 11 (B) "LAWFUL OCCUPATION" MEANS A COURSE OF CONDUCT, PURSUIT, OR
- 12 PROFESSION THAT INCLUDES THE SALE OF GOODS OR SERVICES THAT ARE NOT
- 13 THEMSELVES ILLEGAL TO SELL, WHETHER OR NOT THE INDIVIDUAL WHO IS
- 14 SELLING THEM IS SUBJECT TO AN OCCUPATIONAL REGULATION.
- 15 (C) "LEAST RESTRICTIVE REGULATION" MEANS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING,
- 16 FROM LEAST TO MOST RESTRICTIVE:
- 17 (i) MARKET COMPETITION.
- 18 (ii) THIRD-PARTY OR CONSUMER-CREATED RATINGS AND REVIEWS.
- 19 (iii) PRIVATE CERTIFICATION.
- 20 (iv) A SPECIFIC PRIVATE CIVIL CAUSE OF ACTION TO REMEDY
- 21 CONSUMER HARM.
- 22 (v) AN ACTION THAT IS A DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICE.
- 23 (vi) A REGULATION OF THE PROCESS OF PROVIDING SPECIFIC GOODS
- 24 OR SERVICES TO CONSUMERS.
- 25 (vii) INSPECTION.
- 26 (viii) BONDING OR INSURANCE.
- (ix) REGISTRATION.

- 1 (x) GOVERNMENT CERTIFICATION.
- 2 (xi) A SPECIALTY OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE FOR MEDICAL
- 3 REIMBURSEMENT.
- 4 (xii) AN OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE.
- 5 (D) "OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE" MEANS A NONTRANSFERABLE
- 6 AUTHORIZATION IN LAW THAT MEETS BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 7 (i) ALLOWS AN INDIVIDUAL TO PERFORM A LAWFUL OCCUPATION FOR
- 8 COMPENSATION IF HE OR SHE MEETS PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS ESTABLISHED
- 9 BY LAW.
- 10 (ii) PROHIBITS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DOES NOT POSSESS A VALID
- 11 OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE FROM PERFORMING THE OCCUPATION FOR
- 12 COMPENSATION.
- 13 (E) "OCCUPATIONAL REGULATION" MEANS A STATUTE, RULE, PRACTICE,
- 14 POLICY, OR OTHER STATE LAW THAT REQUIRES AN INDIVIDUAL TO POSSESS
- 15 CERTAIN PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS TO USE AN OCCUPATIONAL TITLE OR
- 16 WORK IN A LAWFUL OCCUPATION. THE TERM INCLUDES REGISTRATION,
- 17 CERTIFICATION, AND OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE. THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE
- 18 A BUSINESS LICENSE, FACILITY LICENSE, BUILDING PERMIT, OR ZONING
- 19 AND LAND USE REGULATION ESTABLISHED UNDER STATE LAW, EXCEPT TO THE
- 20 EXTENT THAT STATE LAW REGULATES AN INDIVIDUAL'S PERSONAL
- 21 OUALIFICATIONS TO PERFORM A LAWFUL OCCUPATION.
- 22 (F) "PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS" MEANS CRITERIA THAT ARE RELATED
- 23 TO AN INDIVIDUAL'S PERSONAL BACKGROUND AND CHARACTERISTICS,
- 24 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, COMPLETION OF AN APPROVED
- 25 EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM, SATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE ON AN EXAMINATION,
- 26 WORK EXPERIENCE, MORAL STANDING, CRIMINAL HISTORY, AND COMPLETION
- 27 OF CONTINUING EDUCATION.

- 1 (G) "REGISTRATION" MEANS A REQUIREMENT TO GIVE NOTICE TO THE
- 2 GOVERNMENT OF THIS STATE THAT MAY INCLUDE THE INDIVIDUAL'S NAME AND
- 3 ADDRESS, THE INDIVIDUAL'S AGENT FOR SERVICE OF PROCESS, THE
- 4 LOCATION OF THE ACTIVITY TO BE PERFORMED, AND A DESCRIPTION OF THE
- 5 SERVICE THAT THE INDIVIDUAL PROVIDES. ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY
- 6 FOR PURPOSES OF THE INTERPRETATION OF REGISTRATION:
- 7 (i) REGISTRATION DOES NOT INCLUDE PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS BUT
- 8 MAY REQUIRE A BOND OR INSURANCE.
- 9 (ii) WHEN THE GOVERNMENT RECEIVES NOTICE DESCRIBED IN THIS
- 10 SUBDIVISION, THE INDIVIDUAL WHO GAVE NOTICE MAY USE "REGISTERED" AS
- 11 A DESIGNATED TITLE. A NONREGISTERED INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT PERFORM THE
- 12 OCCUPATION FOR COMPENSATION OR USE "REGISTERED" AS A DESIGNATED
- 13 TITLE.
- 14 (iii) REGISTRATION IS NOT TRANSFERABLE.
- 15 (iv) REGISTRATION IS NOT SYNONYMOUS WITH AN OCCUPATIONAL
- 16 LICENSE.
- 17 (v) THE USE OF THE WORDS "REGISTRATION" AND "REGISTERED" IN
- 18 OTHER STATUTES OF THIS STATE TO MEAN REQUIRING AN INDIVIDUAL TO
- 19 MEET CERTAIN PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS TO WORK LEGALLY, SUCH AS
- 20 REQUIRING A NURSE AIDE TO BECOME REGISTERED BEFORE WORKING LEGALLY,
- 21 IS CONSIDERED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION AS REQUIRING AN
- 22 INDIVIDUAL TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF AN OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE.
- 23 (H) "SPECIALTY OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE FOR MEDICAL REIMBURSEMENT"
- 24 MEANS A NONTRANSFERABLE AUTHORIZATION IN LAW FOR AN INDIVIDUAL TO
- 25 QUALIFY FOR PAYMENT OR REIMBURSEMENT FROM A GOVERNMENT AGENCY FOR
- 26 THE NONEXCLUSIVE PROVISION OF MEDICAL SERVICES BASED ON MEETING
- 27 PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE LEGISLATURE. ALL OF THE

- 1 FOLLOWING APPLY TO A SPECIALTY OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE FOR MEDICAL
- 2 REIMBURSEMENT:
- 3 (i) A PRIVATE COMPANY MAY RECOGNIZE THIS CREDENTIAL.
- 4 (ii) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS REGULATED UNDER ANOTHER OCCUPATIONAL
- 5 REGULATION TO PROVIDE SIMILAR SERVICES AS DEFINED IN THAT
- 6 REGULATION FOR COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT MAY PROVIDE THOSE
- 7 SERVICES WITHOUT A SPECIALTY OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE FOR MEDICAL
- 8 REIMBURSEMENT.
- 9 (iii) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DOES NOT POSSESS A SPECIALTY
- 10 OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE FOR MEDICAL REIMBURSEMENT MAY PROVIDE SIMILAR
- 11 SERVICES FOR COMPENSATION IF HE OR SHE DOES NOT QUALIFY FOR PAYMENT
- 12 OR REIMBURSEMENT FROM A GOVERNMENT AGENCY.
- 13 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 14 after the date it is enacted into law.
