HOUSE BILL No. 6162

June 12, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Guerra, Sabo, Cochran, Chang, Lasinski, Brinks, Geiss, Greig, Love, Green, Pagan, Yancey, Gay-Dagnogo, Wittenberg, Rabhi and Jones and referred to the Committee on Law and Justice.

A bill to amend 1895 PA 215, entitled
"The fourth class city act,"
by amending section 1 (MCL 91.1), as amended by 1994 PA 19.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. (1) A city incorporated under the provisions of this act has, and the council may pass ordinances relating to, the following general powers:
 - (a) To restrain and prevent vice and immorality, gambling, noise and disturbance, and indecent or disorderly conduct or assemblages; to prevent and quell riots; to preserve peace and good order; and to protect the property of the city or of persons in the city.
 - (b) To prohibit vagrancy, truancy, begging, public

- 1 drunkenness, disorderly conduct, or prostitution.COMMERCIAL SEX.
- 2 (c) To prevent injury or annoyance from anything dangerous,
- 3 offensive, or unhealthy; to prohibit and remove anything tending to
- 4 cause or promote disease; and to prevent and abate nuisances.
- 5 (d) To prohibit and suppress places of disorderly conduct,
- 6 immorality, or vice.
- 7 (e) To regulate or license the use of places of entertainment.
- 8 (f) To prohibit and suppress gambling and to authorize the
- 9 seizure and destruction of instruments and devices used for
- 10 gambling.
- 11 (g) To prohibit and prevent the selling or giving of alcoholic
- 12 liquor , as defined in section 2 of the Michigan liquor control
- act, Act No. 8 of the Public Acts of the Extra Session of 1933,
- 14 being section 436.2 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. UNDER SECTION 2
- 15 OF FORMER 1933 (EX SESS) PA 8.
- 16 (h) To regulate, restrain, or prohibit sports, exhibitions,
- 17 caravans, and shows for which money or other reward is demanded or
- 18 received, except lectures on historic, literary, or scientific
- 19 subjects.
- 20 (i) To prevent the violation of the Sabbath day, or the
- 21 disturbance of a religious meeting, congregation, or society or
- 22 other public meeting assembled for a lawful purpose; and to require
- 23 businesses to be closed on the Sabbath day.
- 24 (j) To license, regulate, or prohibit auctioneers, auctions,
- 25 and sales by public bids or offers by buyers or sellers in the
- 26 manner of auctions; and to regulate the fees to be paid by and to
- 27 auctioneers. However, a license shall MUST not be required in case

- 1 of sales required by law to be made at auction.
- 2 (k) To license, regulate, or prohibit hawking and peddling and
- 3 to license pawnbroking.
- $\mathbf{4}$ (1) To license and regulate wharf boats and to regulate the
- 5 use of boats in and about the harbor, if any, and within the
- 6 jurisdiction of the city.
- 7 (m) To establish, authorize, license, and regulate ferries to
- 8 and from the city or a place in the city; and to regulate and
- 9 prescribe the charges and prices for the transportation of persons
- 10 and property by ferry.
- (n) To regulate and license taverns, houses of public
- 12 entertainment, saloons, restaurants, and eating houses; and to
- 13 regulate and prescribe the location of saloons. This subdivision
- 14 does not authorize the licensing of the sale of alcoholic liquor τ
- 15 as defined in section 2 of Act No. 8 of the Public Acts of the
- 16 Extra Session of 1933. UNDER SECTION 2 OF FORMER 1933 (EX SESS) PA
- 17 8.
- 18 (o) To license and regulate vehicles used for the
- 19 transportation of persons or property for hire in the city; and to
- 20 regulate or fix their stands on the streets and public places and
- 21 at wharves, boat landings, railroad station grounds, and other
- 22 places.
- 23 (p) To regulate and license toll bridges within the city and
- 24 to prescribe the rates and charges for passage over the bridges.
- 25 (q) To provide for and regulate the inspection of food.
- (r) To regulate the inspection, weighing, and measuring of
- 27 brick, lumber, firewood, coal, hay, and any article of merchandise.

- 1 (s) To provide for the inspection and sealing of weights and
- 2 measures and to enforce the keeping and use of proper weights and
- 3 measures by venders.
- 4 (t) To regulate the construction, repair, and use of vaults,
- 5 cisterns, areas, hydrants, pumps, sewers, and gutters.
- 6 (u) To prohibit and prevent indecent exposure of the person;
- 7 the show, sale, or exhibition for sale of indecent or obscene
- 8 pictures, drawings, engravings, paintings, books, or pamphlets; and
- 9 indecent or obscene exhibitions and shows.
- 10 (v) To regulate or prohibit bathing in the city's bodies of
- 11 water.
- 12 (w) To provide for the clearing of driftwood and noxious
- 13 matter from the city's bodies of water; and to prohibit and prevent
- 14 the depositing in the city's bodies of water of matter tending to
- 15 render the water impure, unwholesome, or offensive.
- 16 (x) To compel the owner or occupant of any grocery, tallow
- 17 chandler shop, soap or candy factory, butcher shop or stall,
- 18 slaughter house, stable, barn, privy, sewer, or other offensive,
- 19 nauseous, or unwholesome place to cleanse, remove, or abate it when
- 20 the council considers it necessary for the health, comfort, or
- 21 convenience of the inhabitants of the city.
- 22 (y) To regulate the keeping, selling, and using of dynamite,
- 23 gunpowder, firecrackers and fireworks, and other explosive or
- 24 combustible materials; to regulate the exhibition of fireworks and
- 25 the discharge of firearms; and to restrain the making of fires in
- 26 the streets and other open spaces in the city.
- 27 (z) To direct and regulate the construction of cellars, slips,

- 1 barns, private drains, sinks, and privies.
- 2 (aa) To prohibit, prevent, and suppress mock auctions and
- 3 fraudulent games, devices, and practices. Persons managing, using,
- 4 or practicing; attempting to manage, use, or practice; or aiding in
- 5 the management or practice of a mock auction or fraudulent game,
- 6 device, or practice may be subject to the provisions of an
- 7 ordinance under this subdivision.
- 8 (bb) To prohibit, prevent, and suppress lotteries for the
- 9 drawing or disposing of money or other property. Persons
- 10 maintaining, directing, or managing such lotteries or aiding in the
- 11 maintenance, directing, or managing of such lotteries may be
- 12 subject to the provisions of an ordinance under this subdivision.
- 13 (cc) To license and regulate solicitors for passengers or for
- 14 baggage to and from a hotel, tavern, public house, boat, or
- 15 railroad and to provide the places where they may be admitted to
- 16 solicit or receive patronage; and to license and regulate porters,
- 17 runners, and drivers of vehicles used and employed for hire, to
- 18 provide the places where they be admitted to solicit or receive
- 19 patronage, and to fix and regulate the amounts and rates of their
- 20 compensation.
- 21 (dd) To provide for the protection and care of paupers.
- 22 (ee) To provide for taking a census of the inhabitants of the
- 23 city, whenever the council sees fit, and to direct and regulate the
- 24 census.
- 25 (ff) To provide for the issuing of licenses to the owners and
- 26 keepers of dogs and to require the owners and keepers of dogs to
- 27 pay for and obtain such licenses; and to regulate and prevent the

- 1 running at large of dogs, to require dogs to be muzzled, and to
- 2 authorize the killing of dogs running at large or not licensed in
- 3 violation of an ordinance of the city.
- 4 (gg) To prohibit the possession or use of toy pistols,
- 5 slingshots, and other dangerous toys or implements within the city.
- 6 (hh) To require horses, mules, or other animals attached to
- 7 vehicles or standing in the streets, lanes, or alleys in the city
- 8 to be securely fastened, hitched, watched, or held and to regulate
- 9 the placing and provide for the preservation of hitching posts.
- 10 (ii) To provide for and regulate the numbering of buildings
- 11 upon the streets and alleys; to require the owners or occupants of
- 12 buildings to affix numbers on the buildings; and to designate and
- 13 change the names of public streets, alleys, and parks.
- 14 (jj) To provide for, establish, regulate, and preserve public
- 15 fountains and reservoirs within the city, and troughs and basins
- 16 for watering animals.
- 17 (kk) To prevent or provide for the construction and operation
- 18 of street railways, to regulate street railways, and to determine
- 19 and designate the route and grade of any street railway to be laid
- 20 or constructed in the city.
- 21 (ll) To establish and maintain a public library, to provide a
- 22 suitable building for that public library, and to aid in
- 23 maintaining such other public libraries as may be established
- 24 within the city by private beneficence as the council considers to
- 25 be for the public good.
- 26 (mm) To license transient traders. In the case of transient
- 27 traders who engage in the business of selling goods or merchandise

- 1 after the commencement of the fiscal year, the license fee may be
- 2 apportioned with relation to the part of the fiscal year that has
- 3 expired. If such traders continue in the same business after the
- 4 commencement of the next fiscal year, and their goods or
- 5 merchandise are assessed for taxes for the next fiscal year, the
- 6 traders shall MUST not be required to take out a second license
- 7 upon the commencement of the next fiscal year.
- 8 (2) The council may enact ordinances and make regulations,
- 9 consistent with the laws and constitution of the state as they may
- 10 consider necessary for the safety, order, and good government of
- 11 the city and the general welfare of the inhabitants of the city,
- 12 but exclusive rights, privileges, or permits shall MUST not be
- 13 granted by the council.
- 14 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 15 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 16 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 17 unless Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 6169 (request no.
- 18 02879'17) of the 99th Legislature is enacted into law.
