## **HOUSE BILL No. 6180**

June 12, 2018, Introduced by Reps. Chang, Peterson, LaGrand, Gay-Dagnogo, Wittenberg, Hoadley, Pagan, Geiss, Green, Elder, Garrett, Howrylak and Rabhi and referred to the Committee on Local Government.

A bill to require a local housing ordinance to use certain factors in designating the area median income for making determinations regarding affordable housing; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain local governmental officers and entities.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. As used in this act:

- (a) "Affordable housing" means housing for which the occupants pay no more than 30% of their income for gross housing costs.
- (b) "Area median income" means the median household income, adjusted for family size, of a geographic area of this state.
- (c) "Federal poverty level" means the poverty guidelines published annually in the Federal Register by the United States Department of Health and Human Services under its authority to

- 1 revise the poverty line under 42 USC 9902.
- 2 (d) "Housing ordinance" means an ordinance, rule, resolution,
- 3 or regulation of a local unit of government that governs housing-
- 4 related activities.
- 5 (e) "Municipality" means a city, village, or township of this
- 6 state.
- 7 (f) "Poverty rate" means the percentage of all individuals
- 8 residing in a municipality whose family income is less than the
- 9 federal poverty level applicable to that family.
- 10 Sec. 2. A housing ordinance of a municipality that has a
- 11 poverty rate equal to or greater than 20% shall require the use of
- 12 the most current United States Department of Housing and Urban
- 13 Development Metropolitan Fair Market Rent Area published under 42
- 14 USC 1437f that is specific to that municipality for designating the
- 15 area median income applicable to that municipality in making a
- 16 determination concerning affordable housing.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 18 date it is enacted into law.
