A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled "Revised judicature act of 1961,"

by amending section 5805 (MCL 600.5805), as amended by 2012 PA 582.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 5805. (1) A person shall not bring or maintain an action 2 to recover damages for injuries to persons or property unless, 3 after the claim first accrued to the plaintiff or to someone through whom the plaintiff claims, the action is commenced within the periods of time prescribed by this section. 5
  - (2) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION, THE PERIOD OF LIMITATIONS IS 3 YEARS AFTER THE TIME OF THE DEATH OR INJURY FOR ALL ACTIONS TO RECOVER DAMAGES FOR THE DEATH OF A PERSON OR FOR

## 1 INJURY TO A PERSON OR PROPERTY.

- 2 (3)  $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$  Subject to subsections  $\frac{(3)}{(2)}$  and  $\frac{(4)}{(2)}$  AND (5), the period

- 15 charging malicious prosecution.
- 16 (7) (6) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, the
- 17 period of limitations is 2 years for an action charging
- 18 malpractice.
- 19 (8)  $\frac{(7)}{}$  The period of limitations is 2 years for an action
- 20 against a sheriff charging misconduct or neglect of office by the
- 21 sheriff or the sheriff's deputies.
- 22 (9) (8)—The period of limitations is 2 years after the
- 23 expiration of the year for which a constable was elected for
- 24 actions based on the constable's negligence or misconduct as
- 25 constable.
- 26 (10) (9)—The period of limitations is 1 year for an action
- 27 charging libel or slander.

- 21 professional engineer or licensed professional surveyor arising
- 22 from professional services rendered is an action charging
- 23 malpractice subject to the period of limitation contained in

- 12 not include a casual relationship or an ordinary fraternization
- 13 between 2 individuals in a business or social context.
- 14 Enacting section 1. Section 5805 of the revised judicature act
- 15 of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.5805, as amended by this amendatory
- 16 act, applies to an action filed after January 1, 1996 and before
- 17 the effective date of this amendatory act if a final judgment or
- 18 order has not been entered in the action.
- 19 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
