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## **HOUSE BILL No. 6329**

September 6, 2018, Introduced by Rep. Kahle and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled

"Public health code,"

by amending section 7303a (MCL 333.7303a), as amended by 2018 PA 101.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 7303a. (1) A prescriber who holds a controlled substances license may administer or dispense a controlled substance listed in schedules 2 to 5 without a separate controlled substances license for those activities.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in rules promulgated under section 16204e, beginning March 31, 2019 or, if rules are

- 1 promulgated under section 16204e before March 31, 2019, on the date
- 2 on which rules are promulgated under section 16204e, a licensed
- 3 prescriber shall not prescribe a controlled substance listed in
- 4 schedules 2 to 5 unless the prescriber is in a bona fide
- 5 prescriber-patient relationship with the patient for whom the
- 6 controlled substance is being prescribed. Except as otherwise
- 7 provided in this subsection, if a licensed prescriber prescribes a
- 8 controlled substance under this subsection, the prescriber shall
- 9 provide follow-up care to the patient to monitor the efficacy of
- 10 the use of the controlled substance as a treatment of the patient's
- 11 medical condition. If the licensed prescriber is unable to provide
- 12 follow-up care, he or she shall refer the patient to the patient's
- 13 primary care provider for follow-up care or, if the patient does
- 14 not have a primary care provider, he or she shall refer the patient
- 15 to another licensed prescriber who is geographically accessible to
- 16 the patient for follow-up care.
- 17 (3) Before prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance to
- 18 a patient, a licensed prescriber shall ask the patient about other
- 19 controlled substances the patient may be using. The prescriber
- 20 shall record the patient's response in the patient's medical or
- 21 clinical record.
- 22 (4) Beginning June 1, 2018, before prescribing or dispensing
- 23 to a patient a controlled substance in a quantity that exceeds a 3-
- 24 day supply, a licensed prescriber shall obtain and review a report
- 25 concerning that patient from the electronic system for monitoring
- 26 schedule 2, 3, 4, and 5 controlled substances established under
- 27 section 7333a. This subsection does not apply under any of the

- 1 following circumstances:
- 2 (a) If the dispensing occurs in a hospital or freestanding
- 3 surgical outpatient facility licensed under article 17 and the
- 4 controlled substance is administered to the patient in that
- 5 hospital or facility.
- 6 (A) (b)—If the patient is an animal as that term is defined in
- 7 section 18802, the dispensing occurs in a veterinary hospital or
- 8 clinic and the controlled substance is administered to the patient
- 9 in that hospital or clinic.
- 10 (B) (c)—If the controlled substance is prescribed by a
- 11 licensed prescriber who is a veterinarian and the controlled
- 12 substance will be dispensed by a pharmacist.
- 13 (C) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SECTION 7333A(11), IF THE
- 14 PATIENT IS A PATIENT OF A HEALTH FACILITY OR AGENCY LICENSED UNDER
- 15 ARTICLE 17 THAT IS RENDERING SERVICES TO THE PATIENT AT THAT HEALTH
- 16 FACILITY OR AGENCY AND THE LICENSED PRESCRIBER HAS OBTAINED AND
- 17 REVIEWED A REPORT CONCERNING THE PATIENT FROM THE ELECTRONIC SYSTEM
- 18 DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION AT THE TIME THE PATIENT WAS ADMITTED
- 19 TO THE HEALTH FACILITY OR AGENCY.
- 20 (5) Beginning June 1, 2018, before prescribing or dispensing a
- 21 controlled substance to a patient, a licensed prescriber shall
- 22 register with the electronic system for monitoring schedule 2, 3,
- 23 4, and 5 controlled substances established under section 7333a.
- 24 (6) A licensed prescriber who dispenses controlled substances
- 25 shall maintain all of the following records separately from other
- 26 prescription records:
- 27 (a) All invoices and other acquisition records for each

- 1 controlled substance acquired by the prescriber for not less than 5
- 2 years after the date the prescriber acquires the controlled
- 3 substance.
- 4 (b) A log of all controlled substances dispensed by the
- 5 prescriber for not less than 5 years after the date the controlled
- 6 substance is dispensed.
- 7 (c) Records of all other dispositions of controlled substances
- 8 under the licensee's control for not less than 5 years after the
- 9 date of the disposition.
- 10 (7) The requirement under section 7303 for a license is waived
- 11 in the following circumstances:
- 12 (a) When a controlled substance listed in schedules 2 to 5 is
- 13 administered on the order of a licensed prescriber by an individual
- 14 who is licensed under article 15 as a practical nurse or a
- 15 registered professional nurse.
- 16 (b) When methadone or a methadone congener is dispensed on the
- 17 order of a licensed prescriber in a methadone treatment program
- 18 licensed under article 6 or when a controlled substance listed in
- 19 schedules 2 to 5 is dispensed on the order of a licensed prescriber
- 20 in a hospice rendering emergency care services in a patient's home
- 21 as described in section 17746 by a registered professional nurse
- 22 licensed under article 15.
- 23 (8) As used in this section:
- (a) "Bona fide prescriber-patient relationship" means a
- 25 treatment or counseling relationship between a prescriber and a
- 26 patient in which both of the following are present:
- 27 (i) The prescriber has reviewed the patient's relevant medical

- 1 or clinical records and completed a full assessment of the
- 2 patient's medical history and current medical condition, including
- 3 a relevant medical evaluation of the patient conducted in person or
- 4 through telehealth.
- $\mathbf{5}$  (ii) The prescriber has created and maintained records of the
- 6 patient's condition in accordance with medically accepted
- 7 standards.
- 8 (b) "Telehealth" means that term as defined in section 16283.

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
