

# HOUSE BILL No. 6333

September 6, 2018, Introduced by Rep. Hoitenga and referred to the Committee on  
Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled  
"Michigan liquor control code of 1998,"  
by amending section 707 (MCL 436.1707), as amended by 2008 PA 11.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1       Sec. 707. (1) A vendor shall not sell, serve, or furnish any  
2 alcoholic liquor to ~~any~~ **A** person in an intoxicated condition.

3       (2) A licensee shall not allow a person who is in an  
4 intoxicated condition to consume alcoholic liquor on the licensed  
5 premises.

6       (3) A licensee, or the clerk, servant, agent, or employee of a  
7 licensee, shall not be in an intoxicated condition on the licensed  
8 premises.

9       (4) A licensee shall not allow an intoxicated person to  
10 frequent or loiter on the licensed premises except where the  
11 intoxicated person has been refused service of further alcoholic

1 liquor and continues to remain on the premises for the purpose of  
2 eating food, seeking medical attention, arranging transportation  
3 that does not involve driving himself or herself, or any other  
4 circumstances where requiring the person to vacate the premises  
5 immediately would be considered dangerous to that person or to the  
6 public.

7 (5) A licensee shall not allow a minor to consume alcoholic  
8 liquor or to possess alcoholic liquor for personal consumption on  
9 the licensed premises.

10 (6) A licensee shall not allow ~~any~~**A** person less than ~~18~~**17**  
11 years of age to sell or serve alcoholic liquor.

12 (7) A licensee shall not allow ~~any~~**A** person less than 18 years  
13 of age to work or entertain on a paid or voluntary basis on the  
14 licensed premises unless the person is employed in compliance with  
15 the youth employment standards act, 1978 PA 90, MCL 409.101 to  
16 409.124. This subsection does not apply to an entertainer under the  
17 direct supervision and control of his or her parent or legal  
18 guardian.

19 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days  
20 after the date it is enacted into law.
