HOUSE BILL No. 6513

November 27, 2018, Introduced by Rep. Calley and referred to the Committee on Education Reform.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled $\,$

"The revised school code,"

by amending section 1307h (MCL 380.1307h), as amended by 2017 PA $_{260}$.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1307h. As used in sections 1307 to 1307h:
- (a) "Chemical restraint" means the administration ofmedication for the purpose of restraint.
 - (b) "De-escalation techniques" means evidence- and researchbased strategically employed verbal or nonverbal interventions used to reduce the intensity of threatening behavior before, during, and after a crisis situation occurs.
 - (c) "Documentation" means documentation developed by the

- 1 department that is uniform across the state.
- 2 (d) "Emergency physical restraint" means a last resort
- 3 emergency safety intervention involving physical restraint that is
- 4 necessitated by an ongoing emergency situation and that provides an
- 5 opportunity for the pupil to regain self-control while maintaining
- 6 the safety of the pupil and others. Emergency physical restraint
- 7 does not include physical restraint that is used for the
- 8 convenience of school personnel, as a substitute for an educational
- 9 program, as a form of discipline or punishment, as a substitute for
- 10 less restrictive alternatives, as a substitute for adequate
- 11 staffing, or as a substitute for school personnel training in
- 12 positive behavioral intervention and support. Emergency physical
- 13 restraint does not include a practice prohibited under section
- 14 1307b. Emergency physical restraint does not include physical
- 15 restraint when contraindicated based on a pupil's disability,
- 16 health care needs, or medical or psychiatric condition, as
- 17 documented in a record or records made available to the school.
- 18 (e) "Emergency seclusion" means a last resort emergency safety
- 19 intervention involving seclusion that is necessitated by an ongoing
- 20 emergency situation and that provides an opportunity for the pupil
- 21 to regain self-control while maintaining the safety of the pupil
- 22 and others. To qualify as emergency seclusion, there must be
- 23 continuous observation by school personnel of the pupil in
- 24 seclusion, and the room or area used for confinement must comply
- 25 with state and local fire and building codes; must not be locked;
- 26 must not prevent the pupil from exiting the area if school
- 27 personnel become incapacitated or leave that area; and must provide

- 1 for adequate space, lighting, ventilation, viewing, and the safety
- 2 and dignity of the pupil and others, in accordance with department
- 3 guidelines. Emergency seclusion does not include the confinement of
- 4 preschool children or of pupils who are severely self-injurious or
- 5 suicidal; seclusion that is used for the convenience of school
- 6 personnel, as a substitute for an educational program, as a form of
- 7 discipline or punishment, as a substitute for less restrictive
- 8 alternatives, as a substitute for adequate staffing, or as a
- 9 substitute for school personnel training in positive behavioral
- 10 intervention and support; or a practice prohibited under section
- 11 1307b. Emergency seclusion does not include seclusion when
- 12 contraindicated based on a pupil's disability, health care needs,
- 13 or medical or psychiatric condition, as documented in a record or
- 14 records made available to the school.
- 15 (f) "Emergency situation" means a situation in which a pupil's
- 16 behavior poses AN imminent risk. to the safety of the individual
- 17 pupil or to the safety of others. An emergency situation requires
- 18 an immediate intervention.
- 19 (g) "Functional behavioral assessment" means an evidence- and
- 20 research-based systematic process for identifying the events that
- 21 trigger and maintain problem behavior in an educational setting. A
- 22 functional behavioral assessment shall MUST describe specific
- 23 problematic behaviors, report the frequency of the behaviors,
- 24 assess environmental and other setting conditions where problematic
- 25 behaviors occur, and identify the factors that are maintaining the
- 26 behaviors over time.
- 27 (H) "IMMINENT RISK" MEANS AN IMMEDIATE AND IMPENDING THREAT BY

- 1 A PUPIL TO CAUSE SUBSTANTIAL PHYSICAL INJURY TO SELF OR OTHERS.
- 2 (I) (h)—"Key identified personnel" means those individuals who
- 3 have received the mandatory training described in section
- 4 1307g(b)(i) to (xvi).
- 5 (J) (i)—"Law enforcement officer" means an individual licensed
- 6 under the Michigan commission on law enforcement standards act,
- 7 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.601 to 28.615.
- 8 (K) (i) "Mechanical restraint" means the use of any device,
- 9 article, garment, or material attached to or adjacent to a pupil's
- 10 body to perform restraint.
- 11 (l) (k) "Physical restraint" means restraint involving direct
- 12 physical contact.
- (M) $\frac{(l)}{(l)}$ "Positive behavioral intervention and support" means a
- 14 framework to assist school personnel in adopting and organizing
- 15 evidence-based behavioral interventions into an integrated
- 16 continuum of intensifying supports based on pupil need that unites
- 17 examination of the function of the problem behavior and the
- 18 teaching of alternative skill repertoires to enhance academic and
- 19 social behavior outcomes for all pupils.
- 20 (N) (m) "Positive behavioral intervention and support plan"
- 21 means a pupil-specific support plan composed of individualized,
- 22 functional behavioral assessment-based intervention strategies,
- 23 including, as appropriate to the pupil, guidance or instruction for
- 24 the pupil to use new skills as a replacement for problem behaviors,
- 25 some rearrangement of the antecedent environment so that problems
- 26 can be prevented and desirable behaviors can be encouraged, and
- 27 procedures for monitoring, evaluating, and modifying the plan as

- 1 necessary.
- 2 (O) (n) "Prone restraint" means the restraint of an individual
- 3 facedown.
- 4 (P) (O)—"Regularly and continuously work under contract" means
- 5 that term as defined in section 1230.
- 6 (Q) (p) "Restraint" means an action that prevents or
- 7 significantly restricts a pupil's movement. Restraint does not
- 8 include the brief holding of a pupil in order to calm or comfort,
- 9 the minimum contact necessary to physically escort a pupil from 1
- 10 area to another, the minimum contact necessary to assist a pupil in
- 11 completing a task or response if the pupil does not resist or
- 12 resistance is minimal in intensity or duration, or the holding of a
- 13 pupil for a brief time in order to prevent an impulsive behavior
- 14 that threatens the pupil's immediate safety, such as running in
- 15 front of a car. Restraint does not include the administration of
- 16 medication prescribed by and administered in accordance with the
- 17 directions of a physician, an adaptive or protective device
- 18 recommended by a physician or therapist when it is used as
- 19 recommended, or safety equipment used by the general pupil
- 20 population as intended, such as a seat belt or safety harness on
- 21 school transportation. Restraint does not include necessary actions
- 22 taken to break up a fight, to stop a physical assault, as defined
- 23 in section 1310, or to take a weapon from a pupil. Restraint does
- 24 not include actions that are an integral part of a sporting event,
- 25 such as a referee pulling football players off of a pile or a
- 26 similar action.
- (R) (q) "Restraint that negatively impacts breathing" means

- 1 any restraint that inhibits breathing, including floor restraints,
- 2 facedown position, or any position in which an individual is bent
- 3 over in such a way that it is difficult to breathe. This includes a
- 4 seated or kneeling position in which an individual being restrained
- 5 is bent over at the waist and restraint that involves sitting or
- 6 lying across an individual's back or stomach.
- 7 (S) (r) "School personnel" includes all individuals employed
- 8 in a public school or assigned to regularly and continuously work
- 9 under contract or under agreement in a public school, or public
- 10 school personnel providing service at a nonpublic school. Except
- 11 for sections 1307d and 1307f, school personnel does not include a
- 12 law enforcement officer assigned to regularly and continuously work
- 13 under contract or under agreement in a public school.
- 14 (T) (s) "Seclusion" means the confinement of a pupil in a room
- 15 or other space from which the pupil is physically prevented from
- 16 leaving. Seclusion does not include the general confinement of
- 17 pupils if that confinement is an integral part of an emergency
- 18 lockdown drill required under section 19(5) of the fire prevention
- 19 code, 1941 PA 207, MCL 29.19, or of another emergency security
- 20 procedure that is necessary to protect the safety of pupils.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 22 after the date it is enacted into law.
