- (a) "Advisory committee" means the urban livestock advisory committee appointed under section 3.
- (b) "Commission" means the commission of agriculture and rural development.
- (c) "Department" means the department of agriculture and rural development.

- 1 food, fiber, and fur, or used for service to humans. Livestock
- 2 includes, but is not limited to, cattle, sheep, New World camelids,

- (e) "Local unit of government" means a county, township, city,
