SENATE BILL No. 257

March 21, 2017, Introduced by Senators CONYERS, BIEDA, PROOS, JONES, HERTEL, HOPGOOD, KNEZEK, NOFS, GREGORY and YOUNG and referred to the Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism.

A bill to create an athletes with an intellectual disability empowerment commission; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "athletes with an intellectual disability empowerment commission
 act".
- 4 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Commission" means the athletes with an intellectual disability empowerment commission created in section 3.
 - (b) "Department" means the department of health and human services.
 - (c) "Fund" means the athletes with an intellectual disability

- 1 empowerment fund created in section 4.
- 2 Sec. 3. (1) The athletes with an intellectual disability
- 3 empowerment commission is created within the department.
- 4 (2) The commission consists of the following members:
- 5 (a) The lieutenant governor as an ex officio, nonvoting
- 6 member.
- 7 (b) An individual appointed by the governor.
- 8 (c) An individual appointed by the senate majority leader.
- 9 (d) An individual appointed by the senate minority leader.
- 10 (e) An individual appointed by the speaker of the house.
- 11 (f) An individual appointed by the house minority leader.
- 12 (g) Four individuals from public universities in this state
- 13 appointed by the governor.
- 14 (3) The members first appointed to the commission shall be
- 15 appointed within 60 days after the effective date of this act.
- 16 (4) Members of the commission shall serve for terms of 4 years
- 17 or until a successor is appointed, whichever is later, except that
- 18 of the members first appointed 3 shall serve for 1 year, 3 shall
- 19 serve for 2 years, and 3 shall serve for 3 years.
- 20 (5) A vacancy on the commission shall be filled for the
- 21 unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 22 (6) The governor may remove a member of the commission for
- 23 incompetence, dereliction of duty, malfeasance, misfeasance, or
- 24 nonfeasance in office, or any other good cause.
- 25 (7) The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the
- 26 lieutenant governor. At the first meeting, the commission shall
- 27 elect from among its members a chairperson and other officers as it

- 1 considers necessary or appropriate. After the first meeting, the
- 2 commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the
- 3 call of the chairperson or if requested by 6 or more voting
- 4 members.
- 5 (8) A majority of the members of the commission constitute a
- 6 quorum for the transaction of business at a meeting of the
- 7 commission. A majority of the members present and serving are
- 8 required for official action of the commission.
- 9 (9) The business that the commission may perform shall be
- 10 conducted at a public meeting of the commission held in compliance
- 11 with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 12 (10) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or
- 13 retained by the commission in the performance of an official
- 14 function is subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,
- **15** MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 16 (11) Members of the commission shall serve without
- 17 compensation. However, members of the commission may be reimbursed
- 18 for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance
- 19 of their official duties as members of the commission.
- 20 (12) The commission shall do all of the following:
- 21 (a) Promote and raise awareness of recreational opportunities
- 22 and athletic competitions for athletes with an intellectual
- 23 disability.
- 24 (b) Educate the general public on the benefits of athletics
- 25 for people with intellectual disabilities.
- (c) Provide funding to identify and develop training programs
- 27 for athletes with an intellectual disability.

- 1 (d) Connect athletes with an intellectual disability with
- 2 medical and sports programs at public universities in this state.
- 3 (e) Investigate opportunities to attract events and
- 4 championships for athletes with an intellectual disability to this
- **5** state.
- 6 Sec. 4. (1) The athletes with an intellectual disability
- 7 empowerment fund is created within the state treasury.
- 8 (2) The state treasurer may receive money or other assets from
- 9 any source for deposit into the fund. The state treasurer shall
- 10 direct the investment of the fund. The state treasurer shall credit
- 11 to the fund interest and earnings from fund investments.
- 12 (3) Money in the fund at the close of the fiscal year shall
- 13 remain in the fund and shall not lapse to the general fund.
- 14 (4) The department shall be the administrator of the fund for
- 15 auditing purposes.
- 16 (5) The department shall expend money from the fund, upon
- 17 appropriation, only for 1 or more of the following purposes:
- 18 (a) To provide funding for training of athletes with an
- 19 intellectual disability.
- 20 (b) To promote and identify opportunities for athletes with an
- 21 intellectual disability to participate in athletic events and
- 22 competitions.
- 23 (c) To provide educational materials on the benefits of
- 24 participation in athletic events and competitions for athletes with
- 25 an intellectual disability.
- 26 (d) To provide funding to evaluate individuals for placement
- 27 on the intellectual disability spectrum.
