SENATE BILL No. 281

by amending sections 3 and 26 (MCL 169.203 and 169.226), section 3 as amended by 2012 PA 273 and section 26 as amended by 2013 PA 252.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 3. (1) "Candidate" means an individual who meets 1 or
 more of the following criteria:
 - (a) Files a fee, an affidavit of incumbency, or a nominating petition for an elective office.
 - (b) Is nominated as a candidate for elective office by a political party caucus or convention and whose nomination is certified to the appropriate filing official.
 - (c) Receives a contribution, makes an expenditure, or gives consent for another person to receive a contribution or make an expenditure with a view to bringing about the individual's

- 1 nomination or election to an elective office, whether or not the
- 2 specific elective office for which the individual will seek
- 3 nomination or election is known at the time the contribution is
- 4 received or the expenditure is made.
- 5 (d) Is an officeholder who is the subject of a recall vote.
- 6 (e) Holds an elective office, unless the officeholder is
- 7 constitutionally or legally barred from seeking reelection or fails
- 8 to file for reelection to that office by the applicable filing
- 9 deadline. An individual described in this subdivision is considered
- 10 to be a candidate for reelection to that same office for the
- 11 purposes of this act only.
- 12 For purposes of sections 61 to 71, "candidate" only means, in
- 13 a primary election, a candidate for the office of governor and, in
- 14 a general election, a candidate for the office of governor or
- 15 lieutenant governor. However, the candidates for the office of
- 16 governor and lieutenant governor of the same political party in a
- 17 general election shall be ARE considered as 1 candidate.
- 18 (2) "Candidate committee" means the committee designated in a
- 19 candidate's filed statement of organization as that individual's
- 20 candidate committee. A candidate committee shall be under the
- 21 control and direction of the candidate named in the same statement
- 22 of organization. Notwithstanding subsection (4), an individual
- 23 shall form a candidate committee under section 21 if the individual
- 24 becomes a candidate under subsection (1).
- 25 (3) "Closing date" means the date through which a campaign
- 26 statement is required to be complete.
- 27 (4) "Committee" means a person who receives contributions or

- 1 makes expenditures for the purpose of influencing or attempting to
- 2 influence the action of the voters for or against the nomination or
- 3 election of a candidate, the qualification, passage, or defeat of a
- 4 ballot question, or the qualification of a new political party, if
- 5 contributions received total \$500.00 or more in a calendar year or
- 6 expenditures made total \$500.00 or more in a calendar year.
- 7 COMMITTEE INCLUDES A POLITICAL ORGANIZATION RECOGNIZED BY THE
- 8 INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE UNDER 26 USC 527 THAT HAS AN OFFICER,
- 9 DIRECTOR, BOARD MEMBER, OR TRUSTEE WHO IS A RESIDENT OF THIS STATE.
- 10 An individual, other than a candidate, does not constitute a
- 11 committee. A person, other than a committee registered under this
- 12 act, making an expenditure to a ballot question committee, shall
- 13 not, for that reason, be considered a committee for the purposes of
- 14 this act unless the person solicits or receives contributions for
- 15 the purpose of making an expenditure to that ballot question
- 16 committee.
- 17 Sec. 26. (1) A campaign statement of a committee, other than a
- 18 political party committee, required by this act shall MUST contain
- 19 all of the following information:
- 20 (a) The filing committee's name, address, and telephone
- 21 number, and the full name, residential and business addresses, and
- 22 telephone numbers of the committee treasurer or other individual
- 23 designated as responsible for the committee's record keeping,
- 24 report preparation, or report filing.
- 25 (b) Under the heading "receipts", the total amount of
- 26 contributions received during the period covered by the campaign
- 27 statement; under the heading "expenditures", the total amount of

- 1 expenditures made during the period covered by the campaign
- 2 statement; and the cumulative amount of those totals. Forgiveness
- 3 of a loan shall not be included in the totals. Payment of a loan by
- 4 a third party shall MUST be recorded and reported as an in-kind
- 5 contribution by the third party. In-kind contributions or
- 6 expenditures shall MUST be listed at fair market value and shall be
- 7 reported as both contributions and expenditures. A contribution or
- 8 expenditure that is by other than completed and accepted payment,
- 9 gift, or other transfer, that is clearly not legally enforceable,
- 10 and that is expressly withdrawn or rejected and returned before a
- 11 campaign statement closing date need not be included in the
- 12 campaign statement and if included may, in a later or amended
- 13 statement, be shown as a deduction, but the committee shall keep
- 14 adequate records of each instance.
- 15 (c) The balance of cash on hand at the beginning and the end
- 16 of the period covered by the campaign statement.
- 17 (d) The following information regarding each fund-raising
- 18 event shall MUST be included in the report:
- 19 (i) The type of event, date held, address and name, if any, of
- 20 the place where the activity was held, and approximate number of
- 21 individuals participating or in attendance.
- 22 (ii) The total amount of all contributions.
- 23 (iii) The gross receipts of the fund-raising event.
- 24 (iv) The expenditures incident to the event.
- 25 (e) The full name of each individual from whom contributions
- 26 are received during the period covered by the campaign statement,
- 27 together with the individual's street address, the amount

- 1 contributed, the date on which each contribution was received, and
- 2 the cumulative amount contributed by that individual. The
- 3 occupation, employer, and principal place of business shall MUST be
- 4 stated if the individual's cumulative contributions are more than
- 5 \$100.00. For contributions of \$5.00 or less by an individual to a
- 6 political committee or independent committee, the secretary of
- 7 state shall accept for filing any written communication from the
- 8 political committee or independent committee that contains the
- 9 information otherwise required under this subsection. Any such
- 10 written communication does not need to contain an original
- 11 signature.
- 12 (f) The cumulative amount contributed and the name and address
- 13 of each individual, except those individuals reported under
- 14 subdivision (e), who contributed to the committee. The occupation,
- 15 employer, and principal place of business shall MUST be stated for
- 16 each individual who contributed more than \$100.00.
- 17 (g) The name and street address of each person, other than an
- 18 individual, from whom contributions are received during the period
- 19 covered by the campaign statement, together with an itemization of
- 20 the amounts contributed, the date on which each contribution was
- 21 received, and the cumulative amount contributed by that person.
- (h) The name, address, and amount given by an individual who
- 23 contributed to the total amount contributed by a person who is
- 24 other than a committee or an individual. The occupation, employer,
- 25 and principal place of business shall MUST be stated if the
- 26 individual contributed more than \$100.00 of the total amount
- 27 contributed by a person who is other than a committee or an

- 1 individual.
- 2 (i) The cumulative total of expenditures of \$50.00 or less
- 3 made during the period covered by the campaign statement except for
- 4 expenditures made to or on behalf of another committee, candidate,
- 5 or ballot question.
- 6 (j) The full name and street address of each person to whom
- 7 expenditures totaling more than \$50.00 were made, together with the
- 8 amount of each separate expenditure to each person during the
- 9 period covered by the campaign statement; the purpose of the
- 10 expenditure; the full name and street address of the person
- 11 providing the consideration for which any expenditure was made if
- 12 different from the payee; the itemization regardless of amount of
- 13 each expenditure made to or on behalf of another committee,
- 14 candidate, or ballot question; and the cumulative amount of
- 15 expenditures for or against that candidate or ballot question for
- 16 an election cycle. An expenditure made in support of more than 1
- 17 candidate or ballot question, or both, shall MUST be apportioned
- 18 reasonably among the candidates or ballot questions, or both.
- 19 (K) FOR A CANDIDATE COMMITTEE OF A CANDIDATE WHO CONTROLS OR
- 20 DIRECTS A POLITICAL ORGANIZATION RECOGNIZED BY THE INTERNAL REVENUE
- 21 SERVICE UNDER 26 USC 527, ALL DONORS, CONTRIBUTIONS, AND
- 22 EXPENDITURES OF THAT POLITICAL ORGANIZATION. A CANDIDATE CONTROLS
- 23 OR DIRECTS A POLITICAL ORGANIZATION IF ANY DIRECTOR, OFFICER, OR
- 24 BOARD MEMBER OF THE POLITICAL ORGANIZATION IS EMPLOYED BY OR SERVES
- 25 AS AN AGENT TO THE CANDIDATE, AS DETERMINED BY THE TOTALITY OF THE
- 26 CIRCUMSTANCES.
- 27 (2) A candidate committee or ballot question committee shall

- 1 report all cumulative amounts required by this section on a per
- 2 election cycle basis. Except for subsection (1)(j), an independent
- 3 committee or political committee shall report all cumulative
- 4 amounts required by this section on a calendar year basis.
- 5 (3) A campaign statement of a committee, in addition to the
- 6 other information required by this section, shall MUST include an
- 7 itemized list of all expenditures during the reporting period for
- 8 election day busing of electors to the polls, get-out-the-vote
- 9 activities, slate cards, challengers, poll watchers, and poll
- 10 workers.
- 11 (4) For a reporting period in which a contribution is received
- 12 that is to be part of a bundled contribution or a reporting period
- 13 in which a bundled contribution is delivered to the candidate
- 14 committee of a candidate for statewide elective office, a bundling
- 15 committee shall report to the secretary of state, on a form
- 16 provided by the secretary of state, all of the following
- 17 information, as applicable, about each contribution received or
- 18 delivered as part of a bundled contribution, and about each bundled
- 19 contribution delivered, in the reporting period:
- 20 (a) The amount of each contribution, the date it was received
- 21 by the bundling committee, and the candidate for statewide elective
- 22 office whom the contributor designated as the intended recipient.
- 23 (b) Each contributor's name and address and, for each
- 24 contribution exceeding \$100.00, the contributor's occupation,
- 25 employer, and principal place of business.
- 26 (c) The date each contribution is delivered to the candidate's
- 27 statewide elective office candidate committee.

- 1 (d) The total amount of bundled contributions delivered to
- 2 that candidate committee during the reporting period and during the
- 3 election cycle.
- 4 (5) With its delivery of a bundled contribution to the
- 5 candidate committee of a candidate for statewide elective office, a
- 6 bundling committee shall deliver a report to that candidate
- 7 committee, on a form provided by the secretary of state, that
- 8 includes all of the following information, as applicable, about
- 9 each contribution delivered as part of the bundled contribution,
- 10 and about all bundled contributions delivered to that candidate
- 11 committee in the election cycle:
- 12 (a) The amount of each contribution, the date it was received
- 13 by the bundling committee, and the statewide elective office
- 14 candidate the contributor designated as the intended recipient.
- 15 (b) Each contributor's name and address and, for each
- 16 contribution exceeding \$100.00, the contributor's occupation,
- 17 employer, and principal place of business.
- 18 (c) The total amount of bundled contributions delivered to
- 19 that candidate committee during the reporting period and during the
- 20 election cycle.
- 21 (6) For a reporting period in which a bundled contribution is
- 22 received, a candidate committee of a candidate for statewide
- 23 elective office shall report to the secretary of state, on a form
- 24 provided by the secretary of state, all of the following
- 25 information, as applicable, about each contribution delivered as
- 26 part of a bundled contribution received in the reporting period and
- 27 about all bundled contributions received by that candidate

- 1 committee:
- 2 (a) The amount of each contribution, the date it was received
- 3 by the candidate committee, and the name of the bundling committee
- 4 that delivered the contribution.
- 5 (b) Each contributor's name and address and, for each
- 6 contribution exceeding \$100.00, the contributor's occupation,
- 7 employer, and principal place of business.
- 8 (c) The total amount of bundled contributions received by that
- 9 candidate committee during the reporting period and during the
- 10 election cycle.
