SENATE BILL No. 322

April 25, 2017, Introduced by Senators BIEDA, WARREN, KNEZEK, HERTEL, HOOD, ANANICH, HOPGOOD, GREGORY, JOHNSON and YOUNG and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 453, entitled "Elliott-Larsen civil rights act," by amending section 602 (MCL 37.2602), as amended by 1992 PA 258, and by adding section 202b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 202B. (1) AN EMPLOYER EMPLOYING 50 OR MORE INDIVIDUALS AT
- 2 ANY TIME DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR AT A SINGLE WORK SITE IN THIS
- 3 STATE SHALL INFORM EMPLOYEES OF, AND KEEP POSTED AT THE WORK SITE
- 4 IN A CONSPICUOUS PLACE WHERE EMPLOYEES MAY CONVENIENTLY READ IT, A
- 5 NOTICE WITH ALL OF THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- 6 (A) A STATEMENT THAT IT IS ILLEGAL UNDER FEDERAL LAW TO PAY
- 7 EMPLOYEES DIFFERENT WAGES FOR THE SAME WORK BASED SOLELY ON RACE,
- 8 COLOR, RELIGION, SEX, NATIONAL ORIGIN, AGE, GENETIC INFORMATION, OR
- 9 DISABILITY.

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- 1 (B) A STATEMENT THAT IT IS ILLEGAL UNDER THE LAW OF THIS STATE
- 2 TO PAY EMPLOYEES DIFFERENT WAGES FOR THE SAME WORK BASED SOLELY ON
- 3 RELIGION, RACE, COLOR, NATIONAL ORIGIN, AGE, SEX, HEIGHT, WEIGHT,
- 4 OR MARITAL STATUS.
- 5 (C) A STATEMENT THAT AN EMPLOYEE WHO BELIEVES HIS OR HER
- 6 EMPLOYER HAS VIOLATED THE LAW REQUIRING EQUAL PAY MAY CONTACT THE
- 7 MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL RIGHTS.
- 8 (D) THE TELEPHONE NUMBER REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 602(G) AND THE
- 9 INTERNET ADDRESS OF THE WEBSITE REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 602(H).
- 10 (2) THE NOTICE UNDER SUBSECTION (1) MUST BE IN A FORM APPROVED
- 11 BY THE DEPARTMENT. THE DEPARTMENT MAY INCLUDE ADDITIONAL
- 12 INFORMATION IN THE NOTICE REGARDING THE RIGHTS OF EMPLOYEES UNDER
- 13 THE LAW OF THIS STATE.
- 14 (3) AN EMPLOYER THAT VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS RESPONSIBLE FOR
- 15 A STATE CIVIL INFRACTION AND MAY BE ORDERED TO PAY A CIVIL FINE OF
- 16 NOT MORE THAN \$100.00.
- Sec. 602. The department shall:
- 18 (a) Be responsible to the executive director, who shall be IS
- 19 the principal executive officer of the department and shall be-IS
- 20 responsible for executing the policies of the commission.
- 21 (b) Appoint necessary employees and agents and fix their
- 22 compensation in accordance with civil service rules. The attorney
- 23 general shall appear for and represent the department or the
- 24 commission in a court having jurisdiction of a matter under this
- 25 act.
- 26 (c) Receive, initiate, investigate, conciliate, adjust,
- 27 dispose of, issue charges, and hold hearings on complaints alleging

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- 1 a violation of this act, and approve or disapprove plans to correct
- 2 past discriminatory practices which have caused or resulted in a
- 3 denial of equal opportunity with respect to groups or persons
- 4 protected by this act.
- 5 (d) Require answers to interrogatories; —order the submission
- 6 of books, papers, records, and other materials pertinent to a
- 7 complaint; , and require the attendance of witnesses; , administer
- 8 oaths; —take testimony; —and compel, through court authorization,
- 9 compliance with its orders or an order of the commission.
- 10 (e) Cooperate or contract with persons and state, local, and
- 11 other agencies, both public and private, including agencies of the
- 12 federal government and of other states.
- 13 (f) Monitor the awarding and execution of contracts to ensure
- 14 compliance by a contractor or a subcontractor with a covenant
- 15 entered into or to be entered into pursuant to section 209.
- 16 (G) MAINTAIN A DEDICATED TELEPHONE LINE FOR REPORTING
- 17 VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT THAT ALLOWS ANONYMOUS REPORTING.
- 18 (H) MAINTAIN A PUBLIC WEBSITE THAT INCLUDES ALL OF THE
- 19 FOLLOWING:
- 20 (i) INFORMATION ABOUT RIGHTS UNDER THIS ACT.
- 21 (ii) A LINK TO AN EASY-TO-USE FORM FOR ELECTRONIC REPORTING OF
- 22 A VIOLATION OF THIS ACT THAT ALLOWS ANONYMOUS REPORTING.
- 23 (iii) PROMINENT DISPLAY OF THE TELEPHONE NUMBER FOR REPORTING
- 24 A VIOLATION OF THIS ACT.
- 25 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 26 after the date it is enacted into law.
