SENATE BILL No. 758

January 18, 2018, Introduced by Senator KNOLLENBERG and referred to the Committee on Energy and Technology.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 230, entitled "Stille-DeRossett-Hale single state construction code act," by amending section 28a (MCL 125.1528a), as added by 2017 PA 126.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 28a. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act
- 2 or the code, a permit is not required under this act or the code
- 3 for the installation, maintenance, replacement, or servicing of any
- 4 electrical wiring, equipment, or devices related to or associated
- 5 with a business monitoring system, or with a home monitoring
- 6 system, OR WITH A LOW-VOLTAGE ELECTRIC FENCE if performed by a
- 7 provider.
 - (2) As used in this section:
 - (a) "Business monitoring system" means a device or an assembly

- 1 of equipment and devices, less than 50 volts, that allows a
- 2 business to remotely monitor its business premises through audio,
- 3 video, or sensor detection systems. A business monitoring system
- 4 does not include a fire alarm system or a life safety system
- 5 designed to protect and evacuate building occupants in the event of
- 6 emergencies such as fire, smoke, or power outages.
- 7 (b) "Home monitoring system" means a device or an assembly of
- 8 equipment and devices that allows an individual to remotely monitor
- 9 his or her home through audio, video, or sensor detection systems
- 10 and that may allow the individual to remotely control the home's
- 11 environment, including, but not limited to, temperature, humidity,
- 12 lighting, doors, or locks.
- 13 (C) "LOW-VOLTAGE ELECTRIC FENCE" MEANS AN ALARM SYSTEM THAT
- 14 CONSISTS OF A FENCE STRUCTURE AND AN ENERGIZER THAT PRODUCES AN
- 15 ELECTRIC CHARGE ON CONTACT WITH THE FENCE STRUCTURE AND MEETS ALL
- 16 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 17 (i) THE LOW-VOLTAGE ELECTRIC FENCE IS INSTALLED FOR A
- 18 NONRESIDENTIAL USE.
- 19 (ii) THE ENERGIZER IS POWERED BY A COMMERCIAL STORAGE BATTERY
- 20 THAT DOES NOT EXCEED 12 VOLTS.
- 21 (iii) THE ELECTRIC CHARGE PRODUCED BY THE LOW-VOLTAGE ELECTRIC
- 22 FENCE UPON CONTACT DOES NOT EXCEED ENERGIZER CHARACTERISTICS SET
- 23 FORTH IN PARAGRAPH 22.108 AND DEPICTED IN FIGURE 102 OF
- 24 INTERNATIONAL ELECTROTECHNICAL COMMISSION STANDARD, IEC 60335-2-76,
- 25 CURRENT EDITION.
- 26 (iv) THE LOW-VOLTAGE ELECTRIC FENCE IS IDENTIFIED USING
- 27 WARNING SIGNS ATTACHED TO THE FENCE AT INTERVALS OF NOT MORE THAN

- 1 60 FEET. EACH SIGN SHALL INCLUDE THE INTERNATIONAL SYMBOL FOR SHOCK
- 2 AND BE IN BOTH ENGLISH AND SPANISH.
- 3 (v) THE LOW-VOLTAGE ELECTRIC FENCE IS DESIGNED SO THAT ACCESS
- 4 TO OR WITHIN A FENCED AREA IS RESTRICTED BECAUSE OF SECURED
- 5 OPENINGS OR WHERE IMMEDIATE ACCESS IS NECESSARY FOR LIFE-SAVING OR
- 6 FIREFIGHTING PURPOSES. A FIRE CODE OFFICIAL MAY REQUIRE A KEY BOX
- 7 TO BE INSTALLED IN AN ACCESSIBLE LOCATION. THE KEY BOX SHALL BE OF
- 8 AN APPROVED TYPE LISTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH UL 1037, AND SHALL
- 9 CONTAIN KEYS TO GAIN ACCESS AS REQUIRED BY THE FIRE CODE OFFICIAL.
- 10 (vi) THE LOW-VOLTAGE ELECTRIC FENCE IS COMPLETELY ENCLOSED BY
- 11 A NONELECTRIC FENCE OR WALL.
- 12 (D) (c)—"Provider" means any of the following:
- (i) A system provider that is registered under the security
- 14 alarm systems act, 2012 PA 580, MCL 338.2181 to 338.2187.
- 15 (ii) A security alarm system contractor licensed under the
- 16 private security business and security alarm act, 1968 PA 330, MCL
- **17** 338.1051 to 338.1092.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 19 after the date it is enacted into law.
