January 25, 2018, Introduced by Senators HOPGOOD, GREGORY, BIEDA, YOUNG, HOOD, ANANICH, HERTEL, KNEZEK, WARREN and JOHNSON and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled

"The revised school code,"

(MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1247.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 1247. (1) THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL IS CREATED IN THE
- 2 DEPARTMENT.
- 3 (2) THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL SHALL CONSIST OF THE
- 4 FOLLOWING MEMBERS:
- 5 (A) TWO MEMBERS WHO ARE PARTICIPATING IN A HIGHER EDUCATION
- 6 TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAM, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR.
- (B) FOUR MEMBERS WHO ARE PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS IN THIS STATE,
- APPOINTED AS FOLLOWS:
 - (i) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MAJORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE.

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- 1 (ii) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 2 REPRESENTATIVES.
- 3 (iii) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE
- 4 SENATE.
- 5 (iv) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE HOUSE
- 6 OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 7 (C) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 8 INSTRUCTION FROM A LIST OF 3 OR MORE PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS SUBMITTED
- 9 BY THE MICHIGAN EDUCATION ASSOCIATION.
- 10 (D) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 11 INSTRUCTION FROM A LIST OF 3 OR MORE PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS SUBMITTED
- 12 BY THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF TEACHERS.
- 13 (E) THREE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE STATE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:
- 14 (i) ONE MEMBER WHO IS A REPRESENTATIVE OF A SCHOOL MANAGEMENT
- 15 ORGANIZATION.
- 16 (ii) ONE MEMBER WHO IS A REPRESENTATIVE FROM A NONPROFIT
- 17 ORGANIZATION THAT ENGAGES IN TEACHER AND EDUCATION RESEARCH.
- 18 (iii) ONE MEMBER WHO IS A SUPERINTENDENT OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- 19 (3) THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED TO THE MICHIGAN TEACHER
- 20 COUNCIL SHALL BE APPOINTED WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE
- 21 OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SECTION.
- 22 (4) MEMBERS OF THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL SHALL SERVE FOR
- 23 TERMS OF 4 YEARS OR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED, WHICHEVER IS
- 24 LATER, EXCEPT THAT OF THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED 5 SHALL SERVE FOR
- 25 1 YEAR, 5 SHALL SERVE FOR 2 YEARS, AND 1 SHALL SERVE FOR 3 YEARS.
- 26 (5) IF A VACANCY OCCURS ON THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL, AN
- 27 APPOINTMENT FOR THE UNEXPIRED TERM SHALL BE MADE IN THE SAME MANNER

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- 1 AS THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT.
- 2 (6) THE FIRST MEETING OF THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL SHALL BE
- 3 CALLED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION. AT THE FIRST
- 4 MEETING, THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL SHALL ELECT FROM AMONG ITS
- 5 MEMBERS A CHAIRPERSON AND OTHER OFFICERS AS IT CONSIDERS NECESSARY
- 6 OR APPROPRIATE. AFTER THE FIRST MEETING, THE MICHIGAN TEACHER
- 7 COUNCIL SHALL MEET AT LEAST QUARTERLY, OR MORE FREQUENTLY AT THE
- 8 CALL OF THE CHAIRPERSON OR IF REQUESTED BY AT LEAST A MAJORITY OF
- 9 MEMBERS.
- 10 (7) A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL
- 11 CONSTITUTE A QUORUM FOR THE TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS AT A MEETING OF
- 12 THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL. A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT AND
- 13 SERVING ARE REQUIRED FOR OFFICIAL ACTION OF THE MICHIGAN TEACHER
- 14 COUNCIL.
- 15 (8) THE BUSINESS THAT THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL MAY PERFORM
- 16 SHALL BE CONDUCTED AT A PUBLIC MEETING OF THE MICHIGAN TEACHER
- 17 COUNCIL HELD IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT, 1976 PA 267,
- 18 MCL 15.261 TO 15.275.
- 19 (9) A WRITING PREPARED, OWNED, USED, IN THE POSSESSION OF, OR
- 20 RETAINED BY THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL IN THE PERFORMANCE OF AN
- 21 OFFICIAL FUNCTION IS SUBJECT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT,
- 22 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 TO 15.246.
- 23 (10) MEMBERS OF THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL SHALL SERVE
- 24 WITHOUT COMPENSATION. HOWEVER, MEMBERS OF THE MICHIGAN TEACHER
- 25 COUNCIL MAY BE REIMBURSED FOR THEIR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES
- 26 INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR OFFICIAL DUTIES AS MEMBERS OF
- 27 THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL.

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- 1 (11) THE MICHIGAN TEACHER COUNCIL SHALL PROVIDE ALL OF THE
- 2 FOLLOWING:
- 3 (A) FEEDBACK TO THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, THE
- 4 STATE BOARD, AND THE LEGISLATURE ON INITIATIVES THAT IT CONSIDERS
- 5 CRITICAL TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF ATTRACTING, PREPARING, AND RETAINING
- 6 TEACHERS.
- 7 (B) GUIDANCE ON BEST PRACTICES FOR DEVELOPING THE PROFESSION
- 8 OF TEACHING, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, EFFECTIVE PREPARATION
- 9 AND COMPENSATION, AND FOR CREATING THE BEST TEACHER INFRASTRUCTURE
- 10 TO SERVE THIS STATE.
- 11 (C) ADVICE TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATURE ON SUBJECTS
- 12 REGARDING PUBLIC EDUCATION, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, BUILDING
- 13 A MODEL FOR INCREASING TEACHER COMPENSATION, REWARDING TEACHERS FOR
- 14 EXEMPLARY SERVICE, MAKING THE TEACHING PROFESSION AN ATTRACTIVE
- 15 OPTION FOR PROSPECTIVE EDUCATORS, AND INSTITUTING PRACTICES THAT
- 16 HELP RETAIN QUALITY TEACHERS IN THE CLASSROOM.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 18 after the date it is enacted into law.
