## **SENATE BILL No. 1013**

May 16, 2018, Introduced by Senator HILDENBRAND and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 801h (MCL 257.801h), as added by 1996 PA 551.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 801h. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision in this
- 2 act, the owner or lessee of a fleet of 25-500 or more vehicles that
- 3 are or will be registered under section 801 may apply to the
- 4 secretary of state for special registration plates for any number
- 5 of 25-500 or more vehicles in a fleet. An application shall be on a
- 6 form prescribed by the secretary of state and include an agreement
- 7 that, at a minimum, the applicant agrees to pay annual fleet
- 8 registration taxes under this section.
  - (2) Upon approval of the application and payment of the

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- 1 required registration taxes, the secretary of state may issue the
- 2 applicant a registration plate under section 224 and a registration
- 3 certificate under section 222 for each vehicle. The registration
- 4 plate and certificate shall each be in a format as prescribed by
- 5 the secretary of state.
- 6 (3) The name, emblem, trademark, or logo of the company issued
- 7 fleet registration plates under this section shall be prominently
- 8 displayed on the right and left sides of all vehicles registered
- 9 under this section by that applicant. The name, emblem, trademark,
- 10 or logo shall contain letters, figures, or numerals in sharp
- 11 contrast to the background of the name, emblem, trademark, or logo
- 12 and shall be of such A size, shape, and color as to be THAT IS
- 13 readily legible during daylight hours from a distance of 50 feet.
- 14 THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO PASSENGER VEHICLE RENTAL FLEETS.
- 15 (4) The registration tax for each vehicle registered under
- 16 this section shall be paid annually. Registration taxes under this
- 17 section are payable in full not later than the due date provided in
- 18 section 226. If the owner of a vehicle registered under this
- 19 section fails to pay the annual registration tax for that vehicle
- 20 or fails to comply with the terms of the fleet registration plate
- 21 agreement provided in subsection (1), the secretary of state shall
- 22 immediately suspend the registration of all vehicles registered by
- 23 that owner under this section. The registration shall remain
- 24 suspended and the owner shall not apply for the registration or
- 25 reregistration of a vehicle under this section until payment in
- 26 full of the tax owed is made. After providing notice to the owner,
- 27 the secretary of state shall notify law enforcement of any plate

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- 1 suspended under this section.
- 2 (5) At any time an owner or lessee in good standing may add a
- 3 vehicle to the list of vehicles registered under this section. To
- 4 add a vehicle, the owner or lessee shall make application to the
- 5 secretary of state, in a form prescribed by the secretary of state,
- 6 accompanied by the registration taxes required under section 801.
- 7 (6) At any time an owner or lessee may delete the registration
- 8 of a vehicle from the list of vehicles registered under this
- 9 section. To delete a vehicle, the owner shall notify the secretary
- 10 of state of the proposed deletion in a form prescribed by the
- 11 secretary of state and surrender to the secretary of state the
- 12 registration plate assigned to the deleted vehicle.
- 13 (7) A vehicle not titled or leased in the name of the
- 14 applicant is not eligible for registration under this section. A
- 15 vehicle registered under section 801g is not eligible for
- 16 registration under this section. Passenger vehicle rental fleets
- 17 are not eligible for registration under this section.
- 18 (8) The secretary of state or the authorized representative of
- 19 the secretary of state may visit and examine the vehicle
- 20 registration records of an owner whose vehicles are registered
- 21 under this act. This authority only applies to visits during the
- 22 regular business hours of the owner and to those vehicles and
- 23 records necessary for the secretary of state to determine an
- 24 owner's compliance with this section.
- 25 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 26 after the date it is enacted into law.
