June 7, 2018, Introduced by Senators BRANDENBURG, NOFS, JONES, EMMONS, MARLEAU, BIEDA, HANSEN, HUNE, PROOS, ROBERTSON and PAVLOV and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 2001 PA 34, entitled "Revised municipal finance act," by amending section 309 (MCL 141.2309).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 309. (1) A municipality may sell an authorized municipal
- 2 security at a competitive sale or a negotiated sale EXCEPT AS
- 3 OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION, A MUNICIPALITY MUST SELL
- 4 AUTHORIZED MUNICIPAL SECURITIES AT A PUBLIC SALE. IF A MUNICIPAL
- SECURITY IS IN AN AMOUNT LESS THAN \$500,000.00, THE MUNICIPALITY
- MAY SELL THAT MUNICIPAL SECURITY AT A PRIVATE SALE as determined in
- 7 the authorizing resolution.
- 3 (2) If a municipality determines to sell a municipal security
- 9 at a negotiated PRIVATE sale AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (1), the

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- 1 governing body shall expressly state the method and reasons for
- 2 choosing a negotiated PRIVATE sale instead of a competitive PUBLIC
- 3 sale in the resolution or ordinance authorizing the issuance or
- 4 sale of the municipal security.
- 5 (3) (2) If a municipality determines to sell a municipal
- 6 security at a competitive PUBLIC sale, the municipality shall
- 7 publish a notice of sale at least 7 days before the date set for
- 8 the sale, in a publication printed in the English language and
- 9 circulated in this state that carries as a part of its regular
- 10 service the notices of the sale of municipal securities.
- 11 (4) (3)—A municipality shall award a municipal security sold
- 12 at a competitive PUBLIC sale to the bidder whose bid meets all
- 13 specifications and requirements and results in the lowest interest
- 14 cost to the municipality, unless all bids are rejected.
- 15 (5) IF THE MUNICIPALITY HAS RECEIVED A BID OR BIDS AT THE TIME
- 16 FIXED FOR PUBLIC SALE WHICH IS REJECTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY, THEN
- 17 THE MUNICIPAL SECURITY MAY BE SOLD AT PRIVATE SALE WITHIN 30 DAYS
- 18 THEREAFTER AT A PRICE NOT LESS THAN THE HIGHEST BID RECEIVED AT THE
- 19 PUBLIC OFFERING, OR IF THE MUNICIPALITY HAS OFFERED THE MUNICIPAL
- 20 SECURITY AT 2 PUBLIC OFFERINGS AND HAS NOT RECEIVED ANY BID OR A
- 21 BID SATISFACTORY AT THE SECOND PUBLIC OFFERING TO THE GOVERNING
- 22 BODY, THEN THE MUNICIPAL SECURITY MAY BE SOLD AT A PRIVATE SALE
- 23 WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE LAST PUBLIC OFFERING AT A PRICE NOT LESS
- 24 THAN THE HIGHEST BID, IF ANY, RECEIVED AT THE LAST PUBLIC OFFERING.
- 25 (6) $\frac{4}{4}$ A municipality may accept bids for the purchase of a
- 26 municipal security made in person, by mail, by facsimile, by
- 27 electronic means, or by any other means authorized by the

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1 municipality.
