## **SENATE BILL No. 1126**

September 26, 2018, Introduced by Senator COLBECK and referred to the Committee on Energy and Technology.

A bill to amend 1939 PA 3, entitled

"An act to provide for the regulation and control of public and certain private utilities and other services affected with a public interest within this state; to provide for alternative energy suppliers; to provide for licensing; to include municipally owned utilities and other providers of energy under certain provisions of this act; to create a public service commission and to prescribe and define its powers and duties; to abolish the Michigan public utilities commission and to confer the powers and duties vested by law on the public service commission; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state governmental officers and entities; to provide for the continuance, transfer, and completion of certain matters and proceedings; to abolish automatic adjustment clauses; to prohibit certain rate increases without notice and hearing; to qualify residential energy conservation programs permitted under state law for certain federal exemption; to create a fund; to encourage the utilization of resource recovery facilities; to prohibit certain acts and practices of providers of energy; to allow for the securitization of stranded costs; to reduce rates; to provide for appeals; to provide appropriations; to declare the effect and purpose of this act; to prescribe remedies and penalties; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending sections 1 and 3 (MCL 460.1 and 460.3).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) A commission to be known and designated as the
- 2 "Michigan public service commission" is hereby created, which shall
- 3 consist—THE MICHIGAN PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION IS CREATED IN THE
- 4 DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS.
- 5 (2) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS of 3 members, not more than 2 of
- 6 whom shall be ARE members of the same political party, appointed by
- 7 the governor with the advice and consent of the senate.
- 8 (3) Each member shall OF THE COMMISSION MUST be a citizen of
- 9 the United States , and of the THIS state. of Michigan, and no
- 10 member of said A MEMBER OF THE commission shall NOT be pecuniarily
- 11 interested in any public utility or public service PERSON subject
- 12 to the jurisdiction and control of the commission. During his OR
- 13 HER term, no A member OF THE COMMISSION shall NOT serve as an
- 14 officer or committee member of any political party organization or
- 15 hold any office or be employed by any other commission, board,
- 16 department, or institution in this state. No commission
- 17 (4) AN INDIVIDUAL IS NOT ELIGIBLE TO BE A member OF THE
- 18 COMMISSION IF THAT INDIVIDUAL HAS EVER BEEN RETAINED OR EMPLOYED BY
- 19 ANY PUBLIC UTILITY OR PERSON SUBJECT TO THE JURISDICTION AND
- 20 CONTROL OF THE COMMISSION. A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION shall NOT be
- 21 retained or employed by any public utility or public service PERSON
- 22 subject to the jurisdiction and control of the commission during
- 23 the time he OR SHE is acting as such commissioner, and A MEMBER OF
- 24 THE COMMISSION OR for 6 months thereafter, and no 1 YEAR AFTER THAT
- 25 TIME.

- 1 (5) A member of the commission who is a member of the bar
- 2 STATE BAR of the state of Michigan , shall NOT practice his
- 3 profession LAW or act as counselor or attorney in any court of this
- 4 state during the time WHILE he OR SHE is a member of said THE
- 5 commission. : Provided, however, This shall
- 6 (6) THIS SECTION DOES not require any commissioner MEMBER OF
- 7 THE COMMISSION to retire from —or dissolve any partnership —of
- 8 which he OR SHE is a member, but said THE partnership , while he is
- 9 a member of the commission, shall not engage in public utility
- 10 practice WHILE HE OR SHE IS A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION. Immediately
- 11 upon the taking effect of this act, the offices of the present
- 12 members of the Michigan public service commission are hereby
- 13 abolished, and the members of the Michigan public service
- 14 commission as herein created shall be appointed by the governor
- 15 with the advice and consent of the senate, for terms of 6 years
- 16 each: Provided, That of the members first appointed, 1 shall be
- 17 appointed for a term of 2 years, 1 for a term of 4 years, and 1 for
- 18 a term of 6 years. Upon the expiration of said terms successors
- 19 shall be appointed with like qualifications and in like manner for
- 20 terms of 6 years each, and until their successors are appointed and
- 21 qualified. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as is
- 22 provided for appointment in the first instance.
- 23 (7) MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SHALL SERVE FOR TERMS OF 6 YEARS
- 24 OR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED, WHICHEVER IS LATER. IF A VACANCY
- 25 OCCURS ON THE COMMISSION, THE GOVERNOR SHALL MAKE AN APPOINTMENT
- 26 FOR THE UNEXPIRED TERM IN THE SAME MANNER AS THE ORIGINAL
- 27 APPOINTMENT.

- 1 Sec. 3. The LEGISLATURE SHALL ANNUALLY ESTABLISH THE salary of
- 2 the chairman CHAIRPERSON of the commission, and THE SALARY of each
- 3 of the other members OF THE COMMISSION, and the schedule for
- 4 reimbursement of expenses FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION. shall be
- 5 established annually by the legislature. The commission may appoint
- 6 a secretary and the deputies, clerks, assistants, inspectors, heads
- 7 of divisions, and employees necessary for the proper exercise of
- 8 the powers and duties of the commission. All salaries and other
- 9 expenses incurred by the commission shall-MUST be paid out of funds
- 10 appropriated by the legislature. All fees and other moneys MONEY
- 11 received by the commission shall MUST be paid over at the end of
- 12 each month to the state treasurer. , taking a receipt therefor. The
- 13 commission may employ engineers and experts in public utilities and
- 14 public service matters and fix their compensation for services,
- 15 which may be paid out of the appropriation provided by the
- 16 legislature. The engineers, inspectors, and employees shall be ARE
- 17 entitled to their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the
- 18 performance of the work of the commission pursuant to UNDER the
- 19 schedule established by the legislature. Each deputy, clerk,
- 20 assistant, engineer, inspector, or expert shall perform the duties
- 21 required by the commission. THE COMMISSION SHALL NOT EMPLOY AN
- 22 INDIVIDUAL IF THAT INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN RETAINED OR EMPLOYED BY ANY
- 23 PUBLIC UTILITY OR PERSON SUBJECT TO THE JURISDICTION AND CONTROL OF
- 24 THE COMMISSION DURING THE PREVIOUS YEAR. AN EMPLOYEE OF THE
- 25 COMMISSION SHALL SIGN AN AGREEMENT THAT HE OR SHE WILL NOT BE
- 26 RETAINED OR EMPLOYED BY ANY PUBLIC UTILITY OR PERSON SUBJECT TO THE
- 27 JURISDICTION AND CONTROL OF THE COMMISSION FOR 1 YEAR AFTER LEAVING

- 1 EMPLOYMENT WITH THE COMMISSION. A PUBLIC UTILITY OR PERSON SUBJECT
- 2 TO THE JURISDICTION AND CONTROL OF THE COMMISSION SHALL NOT RETAIN
- 3 OR EMPLOY AN INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS EMPLOYED BY THE COMMISSION FOR 1
- 4 YEAR AFTER THAT INDIVIDUAL LEFT EMPLOYMENT WITH THE COMMISSION.
- 5 Each member of the commission shall devote his OR HER entire time
- 6 to the performance of the duties of his OR HER office.
