SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 441 would amend the State License Fee Act (1979 PA 152), which pertains to the licensure of various occupations regulated by the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA), by extending sunsets on fees that will mature on September 30, 2019. The bill would maintain FY 2018-19 fee amounts by extending previous fee increases (initially enacted in 2003) for an additional four years, through September 30, 2023. The fee sunsets were last extended in 2015.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The bill would maintain current levels of revenue for fees collected by LARA, to the extent that the department would continue collecting revenue generated by fee increases that would otherwise sunset. Revenue generated from these fees is deposited to the Licensing and Regulation Fund and expended for the costs of implementing, administering, and enforcing regulation of the associated occupations. Estimates made using data provided by the State Budget Office indicate that revenue losses resulting if the sunsets are not extended would total approximately \$1.8 million. The table below provides information for each of the fees.
