Overview

The Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development's (MDARD) key programs and priorities include ensuring food safety and security, protecting animal health and welfare, managing invasive exotic species, regulating pesticide use, certifying agricultural commodities, ensuring environmental stewardship, consumer protection, and promoting the state's agricultural economy.

Major Budget Changes From FY 2018-19 YTD Appropriations

1. Double Up Food Bucks

House includes \$1.0 million GF/GP (ongoing) for the Double Up Food Bucks program in order to expand the program to additional counties in Michigan, and to increase the number of participating retailers in the counties where the program is currently established. Double Up Food Bucks increases purchasing power of Michigan residents who receive Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits by providing a dollar-for-dollar match of up to \$20 per day to buy fresh fruits and vegetables at participating grocery stores and farmer's markets. Funding would be granted to the Fair Food Network, a private non-profit organization that directly administers the program.

Executive budget had originally included \$4.0 million GF/GP in its FY 2019-20 budget request: \$2.0 million as ongoing and \$2.0 million as one-time. The \$2.0 million in one-time funding was subsequently included a current year supplemental request. The current year funding request is included in Senate Bill 150, as passed by the Senate on April 25, 2019.

2. Agriculture Preservation Easement Grants

Executive had proposed \$2.0 million from the state restricted Agriculture Preservation Fund to provide grants to local units of government for the purchase of agricultural conservation easements, as authorized under Part 362 of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act. House includes \$1.9 million and shifts \$100,000 to the Farmland and Open Space Preservation program (Item #8, below).

5. Indemnification – Livestock Depredation			
House reduces funding to \$25,000 GF/GP for a program that reimburses eligible livestock producers for animals lost to depredation by wildlife, a program authorized under the Wildlife Depredations I Act (Public Act 487 of 2012). Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2018-19

Sec. 204. Use of Internet for Reporting – REVISED

House directs to department to notify report recipients when reports are posted to the department website.

Sec. 215. Communication with the Legislature – RETAINED

House retains section that prohibits department from taking disciplinary action against an employee for communicating with the legislature.

Sec. 234. Record Retention – RETAINED

House retains section that requires department to retain reports funded from part 1 appropriations; specifies record retention guidelines.

Sec. 451. Bovine TB Whole-Herd Testing – RETAINED

House retains section that requires department to pay for the costs of whole-herd testing and individual animal testing in the Modified Accredited Zone, including indemnity and compensation for animal injury.

Sec. 457. Bovine TB Quarterly Report – RETAINED

House retains current specific reporting requirements related to Bovine TB program.

Sec. 459. Bovine TB Testing, Legislative Intent – DELETED

House does not include section that expresses legislative intent that department not conduct whole-herd testing of any one herd in a TB-free zone more often than once every four years, except under specific conditions.

Sec. 462. Apiary Protection – DELETED

House does not include \$20,000 earmark for an apiary protection program.

Sec. 701. Food and Agriculture Investment Grant Program – REVISED

Current language defines program goals, selection and reporting requirements. House revises current year language to limit department administrative costs to 5%.

Sec. 702. Rural Development Fund/Program – NEW

House includes section that directs department to work with Rural Development Fund Board to establish a process and criteria for funding projects.

Sec. 703. Double Up Food Bucks Program – NEW

House directs the department work with the Department of Health and Human Services to: 1). notify recipients of food assistance program benefits that their benefits can be spent with their bridge cards at many farmer's markets in the state; 2). to notify recipients about the Double Up Food Bucks program and that when they spend \$20.00 at participating farmer's markets they can receive an additional \$20.00 to buy Michigan produce; requires the department to work with the Fair Food Network to ensure access to the program in every county of the state with grocery stores and farmer's markets that meet the program's eligibility requirements. [This is similar to language in supplemental appropriation bill, SB 150.] The H-3 substitute also includes a specific reporting requirement.

Sec. 802. Agriculture Equine Industry Development Fund (AEIDF) – RETAINED

House retains current year language prescribing priority order of AEIDF expenditures.

Sec. 805. County Fair Capital Grant Program – REVISED

House concurs with Executive and revises language governing matching program for county fair capital grants program. Revised to reflect new matching requirements; deletes current year earmarks.

Sec. 806. Festivals and Events – NEW

House defines \$50,000 GF/GP appropriation for the promotion of Michigan festivals and events.

Sec. 807. Hoophouse Revolving Loan Program – NEW

House earmarks \$150,000 GF/GP for a hoophouse revolving loan program.
