SUMMARY:

House Bill 4818 would amend the C.J.I.S. Policy Council Act to require the governor to add an additional member to the Criminal Justice Information Systems Board.

The Criminal Justice Information Systems Board was created by Executive Order No. 2011-7¹ and consists of 22 members representing various offices, departments, and associations across Michigan. The bill would effectively increase the number of members serving on the board to 23.

The bill would direct the Consumer Data Industry Association to submit to the governor a list of three names. Within six months after that, the governor would have to choose one of the listed individuals to serve as an additional member on the board. The new member would serve for a four-year term and could be reappointed. A vacancy on the board of a member appointed under this new section would be filled in the same manner.
