SUMMARY:

House Bill 6313 amends the Occupational Code to provide a one-time extension of the 2020 license cycle year for real estate professionals for certain continuing education requirements.

Under the code, real estate brokers, associate brokers, and salespersons must successfully complete six hours of continuing education during each year of the three-year license cycle.¹ At least two hours per year must involve real estate law, rules, and court cases.

The bill provides that the license cycle year that began November 1, 2019, ends on December 31, 2020—but only for the two hours of continuing education involving real estate law, rules, and court cases.

The bill took effect December 30, 2020.
