CONTENT

House Bill 4958 (S-1) would amend Part 161 (General Provisions) of the Public Health Code to do the following:

- -- Prohibit a licensee or registrant from performing an invasive bodily examination on an anesthetized or unconscious patient except in certain circumstances.
- -- Require a licensee or registrant to ensure that a student who was in a health profession training program did not perform a pelvic examination on an anesthetized or unconscious patient.

<u>Senate Bill 1081</u> would amend Section 161 of the Code to define "invasive bodily examination" as an invasive bodily, vaginal, rectal, or prostate examination.
