SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5482

A bill to provide for certain requirements regarding suicide prevention for schools; to prescribe the rights, powers, duties, and privileges of schools, school districts, public school academies, intermediate school districts, and other public school entities; to provide for and prescribe the powers and duties of certain state departments; and to provide for the regulation of certain school employees.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "save
 our students act".
- Sec. 3. (1) Beginning 1 year after the effective date of this
 act, the board of a school district or intermediate school district
 or the board of directors of a public school academy shall ensure





- 1 that each school operated by the board or board of directors that
- 2 offers any of grades 6 to 12 and that provides identification cards
- 3 to pupils enrolled at the school includes on each identification
- 4 card provided to a pupil a local, state, or national suicide
- 5 prevention hotline telephone number printed on it. The local,
- 6 state, or national suicide prevention hotline telephone number
- 7 included on pupil identification cards as described in this
- 8 subsection must be a local, state, or national suicide prevention
- 9 hotline telephone number that can be accessed for use 24 hours of
- 10 each day and 7 days of each week by pupils who attempt to utilize

- 12 (2) For each school operated by the board of a school district
- 13 or intermediate school district or the board of directors of a
- 14 public school academy that offers any of grades 6 to 12, the board
- 15 or board of directors that operates that school is encouraged to
- 16 display the model information materials developed or adopted under
- 17 subsection (3) on or in any of the following:
- 18 (a) The school's website homepage.
- 19 (b) A conspicuous location in the school counselor's office or
- 20 the office of any school employee of the school qualified to act in
- 21 a counseling role under section 1233 or 1233a of the revised school
- 22 code, MCL 380.1233 and 380.1233a.
- 23 (c) A conspicuous location in the office of the school
- 24 principal or chief administrator of the school.
- 25 (3) The department of health and human services shall develop
- 26 or adopt model information materials regarding suicide prevention
- 27 services, suicide, depression, and anxiety for the purposes under
- 28 subsection (2) and shall, upon request by a school district,
- 29 intermediate school district, or public school academy, provide the

- 3 (4) A school district, intermediate school district, public
- 4 school academy, public school, a board member of a board of a

- 15 (a) "Intermediate school district" means that term as defined

- (c) "School district" means that term as defined in section 6
- 21 of the revised school code, MCL 380.6.
- (d) "The revised school code" means the revised school code,
- 23 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 to 380.1852.
