## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4104**

January 29, 2019, Introduced by Reps. LaFave, Guerra, Farrington, Marino, Berman and Wittenberg and referred to the Committee on Financial Services.

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code,"

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

  that constitutes racketeering activity as defined in 18 USC

- 4 (qq) An offense committed within this state or another state
  5 in violation of a law of the United States that is substantially
  6 similar to a violation listed in subdivisions (a) through (pp).
- 7 (rr) An offense committed in another state in violation of a
  8 statute of that state that is substantially similar to a violation
  9 listed in subdivisions (a) through (pp).
- 10 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days 11 after the date it is enacted into law.
