THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 36a. (1) The Upon written request, the administrator may
shall sell or otherwise provide all unclaimed property account
information to a locator for all unclaimed accounts that remain
unclaimed for not less than 24—12 months after the date payment or
delivery is made under section 20. if the value of the unclaimed
property is \$10,000.00 or more. The administrator shall not charge
more than \$250.00 for each request. The administrator shall provide

 - (d) The type and amount of property. and
- 7 (e) The cash value of the property.

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- (f) The year the property was reported to the administrator.
- 9 (g) The name and contact information of the holder that is on 10 file with the administrator.
- 11 (2) Before the department administrator provides information
- 12 to a locator under subsection (1), the locator shall register with
- 13 the department administrator in a form and manner determined by the
- 14 department administrator and pay a fee to the department
- 15 administrator of \$1,200.00. The fees collected under this
- 16 subsection shall be used by the department administrator to
- 17 register and monitor locators under this act. The locator shall

- (4) If an owner has entered into a written agreement that
 authorizes a locator registered with the administrator under this
 act, to assist the owner in claiming the property, the
 administrator shall make payment to the owner unless, if requested
 by the owner, the administrator shall mail payment to the locator's
 address.
