SENATE BILL NO. 476

August 29, 2019, Introduced by Senator SCHMIDT and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 2000 PA 258, entitled "Career and technical preparation act,"

by amending section 4 (MCL 388.1904), as amended by 2012 PA 133.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. (1) Upon request by the eligible student, the school
- 2 district or state approved nonpublic school in which an eligible
- 3 student is enrolled shall provide to the eligible student a letter
- 4 signed by the student's principal indicating the student's
- 5 eligibility under this act.

- (2) An eligible student may apply to a career and technical
 preparation program to enroll in 1 or more eligible courses offered
 by that career and technical preparation program and, if accepted,
 may enroll in 1 or more of those courses.
- 5 (3) For an eligible student enrolled in a school district, 6 within a reasonable time after registration, the career and 7 technical preparation program shall send written notice to the 8 eligible student and his or her school district. For an eligible 9 student enrolled in a state approved nonpublic school, within a 10 reasonable time after registration, the career and technical 11 preparation program shall send written notice to the eligible 12 student and his or her state approved nonpublic school and to the department. The notice shall must indicate the course or courses 13 14 and hours of enrollment of that eligible student. The career and 15 technical preparation program shall notify the eligible student 16 about tuition, fees, books, materials, and other related charges, 17 as determined by the career and technical preparation program, in 18 the customary manner used by the career and technical preparation 19 program, and shall notify the eligible student of the estimated 20 amount of the eligible charges that will be billed to the school 21 district or department, as applicable, under subsection (4).
 - (4) For an eligible student enrolled in a school district, unless otherwise agreed between the career and technical preparation program and the school district, after the expiration of the career and technical preparation program's drop/add period for the course, the career and technical preparation program shall send a bill to the eligible student's school district detailing the eligible charges for each eligible course in which the eligible student is enrolled under this act. For an eligible student who is

- 1 enrolled in a state approved nonpublic school, after the expiration
- 2 of the career and technical preparation program's drop/add period
- 3 for the course, both of the following apply:
- 4 (a) The career and technical preparation program shall send a
- 5 bill to the department detailing the eligible charges for each
- 6 eligible course in which the eligible student is enrolled under
- 7 this act.
- 8 (b) The department shall determine the amount of the eligible
- 9 charges to be paid by the department of treasury to the career and
- 10 technical preparation program on behalf of the eligible student
- 11 under this act and shall deliver this information to the department
- 12 of treasury by appropriate electronic means.
- 13 (5) For an eligible student enrolled in a school district,
- 14 upon receiving the bill under subsection (4), the school district
- 15 shall cause to be paid to the career and technical preparation
- 16 program on behalf of the eligible student an amount equal to the
- 17 lesser of the amount of the eligible charges or the prorated
- 18 percentage of the statewide pupil-weighted average foundation
- 19 allowance, as calculated by the department under this subsection
- 20 and section 20 of the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL
- 21 388.1620, for all school districts for the state fiscal year that
- 22 begins on October 1 of the academic year of enrollment in the

- 13 district is required to pay under this act and that are not paid by
- 14 the school district. As used in this subsection, "local school
- 15 operating revenue" means that term as defined in section 20 of the
- 16 state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1620.
- 17 (6) For an eligible student who is enrolled in a state
- 18 approved nonpublic school, upon receiving from the department under
- 19 subsection (4) the amount of the eligible charges to be paid on
- 20 behalf of the eligible student, the department of treasury shall
- 21 cause to be paid to the career and technical preparation program on
- 22 behalf of the eligible student an amount equal to the lesser of the
- 23 amount of the eligible charges or the prorated percentage of the
- 24 statewide pupil-weighted average foundation allowance, as
- 25 calculated by the department under this subsection and section 20
- 26 of the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1620, for
- 27 all school districts for the state fiscal year that begins on
- 28 October 1 of the academic year of enrollment in the career and
- 29 technical preparation program, with the proration based on the

- 1 proportion of the school year that the eligible student attends the
- 2 career and technical preparation program. However, in the
- 3 calculation of the statewide pupil-weighted average foundation
- 4 allowance for the purposes of this subsection, if a school
- 5 district's foundation allowance is above the basic target
- 6 foundation allowance under section 20 of the state school aid act
- 7 of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1620, then the school district's
- 8 foundation allowance shall be is considered to be the basic target
- 9 foundation allowance. Not later than September 1 of each year, the
- 10 department shall notify the department of treasury of the amount of
- 11 the statewide pupil-weighted average foundation allowance as
- 12 calculated for the purposes of this subsection. The eligible
- 13 student is responsible for payment of the remainder of the costs
- 14 associated with his or her enrollment in the career and technical
- 15 preparation program that exceed the amount the department of
- 16 treasury is required to pay under this act and that are not paid by
- 17 the department of treasury.
- 18 (7) A career and technical preparation program shall not
- 19 charge a late fee to an eligible student, a school district, the
- 20 department, or the department of treasury for a payment that is
- 21 made in compliance with the timetable prescribed under this act
- 22 even if the payment would otherwise be considered late by the
- 23 career and technical preparation program.
- 24 (8) A school district, state approved nonpublic school, or the
- 25 department may require an eligible student to provide, on a form
- 26 supplied by the school district, state approved nonpublic school,
- 27 or the department, reasonable verification that the eligible
- 28 student is regularly attending a career and technical preparation
- 29 course under this act.

(9) For an eligible student who is enrolled in a school district and who enrolls in an eligible course under this act, if the eligible student does not complete the eligible course, and if the school district has paid money for the course or, if the eligible student enrolls in an eligible course for postsecondary credit only and the eligible student does not successfully complete the eligible course, as determined by the career and technical preparation program, on behalf of the student, all of the following apply:

- (a) The career and technical preparation program shall forward to the school district any funds that are refundable due to noncompletion of the course. If applicable, the school district shall then forward to the eligible student any refunded money in excess of the amount paid by the school district for the course on behalf of the student.
- (b) The eligible student shall repay to the school district any funds that were expended by the school district for the course that are not refunded to the school district by the career and technical preparation program. If the eligible student does not repay this money, the school district may impose sanctions against the eligible student as determined by school district policy. This subdivision does not apply to an eligible student who does not complete the course due to a family or medical emergency, as determined by the career and technical preparation program.
- (10) For an eligible student who is enrolled in a state approved nonpublic school and who enrolls in an eligible course under this act, if the eligible student does not complete the eligible course or, if the eligible student enrolls in an eligible course for postsecondary credit only and the eligible student does

- 1 not successfully complete the eligible course, as determined by the
- 2 career and technical preparation program, and if the department of
- 3 treasury has paid money for the course on behalf of the eligible
- 4 student, all of the following apply:
- 5 (a) The career and technical preparation program shall forward
- 6 to the department of treasury any funds that are refundable due to
- 7 noncompletion of the course. If applicable, the career and
- 8 technical preparation program shall then refund to the eligible
- 9 student any funds that are refundable due to noncompletion of the
- 10 course and are in excess of the amount paid by the department of
- 11 treasury for the course on behalf of the eligible student.
- 12 (b) The eligible student shall repay to the department of
- 13 treasury any funds that were expended by the department of treasury
- 14 for the course that are not refunded to the department of treasury
- 15 by the career and technical preparation program. This subdivision
- 16 does not apply to an eligible student who does not complete the
- 17 course due to a family or medical emergency, as determined by the
- 18 career and technical preparation program.
- 19 (11) A school district, state approved nonpublic school, the
- 20 department, or the department of treasury shall make available to
- 21 an eligible student copies of all correspondence in the possession
- 22 of the school district, state approved nonpublic school,
- 23 department, or department of treasury regarding the eligible
- 24 student's participation in a career and technical preparation
- 25 course under this act. Correspondence described in this subsection
- 26 shall be kept by the The school district, state approved nonpublic
- 27 school, department, or department of treasury shall keep
- 28 correspondence described in this subsection for at least 1 year.
- 29 (12) If a school district pays for books for an eligible

student for a career and technical preparation course under this
section, the books are the property of the school district and
shall must be turned over to the school district after the eligible
student completes the course.

5 (13) This section does not apply to any career and technical 6 preparation courses in which an eligible student is enrolled in 7 addition to being enrolled full-time in that eligible student's 8 school district or state approved nonpublic school; to a career and 9 technical preparation course an eligible student is retaking after 10 failing to achieve a satisfactory grade; or to a course contrary to 11 the eligibility provisions of this act. In determining full-time enrollment in a school district under this section or a school 12 13 district's full-time equated membership under the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1601 to 388.1896, 388.18971, for a 14 15 pupil enrolled in a career and technical preparation program under 16 this act, the pupil's enrollment in both the school district and 17 the career and technical preparation program shall be is counted as 18 enrollment in the school district and a pupil shall not be is not 19 considered to be enrolled in a school district less than full-time 20 solely because of the effect of the pupil's enrollment in 1 or more 21 career and technical preparation courses under this act, including 22 necessary travel time, on the number of class hours provided by the 23 school district to the pupil. In determining full-time enrollment in a state approved nonpublic school under this section for a 24 25 student enrolled in a career and technical preparation program 26 under this act, the student's enrollment in both the state approved 27 nonpublic school and the career and technical preparation program 28 shall be is counted as enrollment in the state approved nonpublic school and a student shall not be is not considered to be enrolled 29

- 1 in a state approved nonpublic school less than full-time solely
- 2 because of the effect of the student's enrollment in 1 or more
- 3 career and technical preparation courses under this act, including
- 4 necessary travel time, on the number of class hours provided by the
- 5 state approved nonpublic school to the student.
- 6 (14) This act does not require a school district or the
- 7 department of treasury to pay or otherwise provide financial
- 8 support for transportation or parking costs necessary for an
- 9 eligible student to participate in a career and technical
- 10 preparation program under this act. A school district, state
- 11 approved nonpublic school, or this state is not liable for any
- 12 injury incurred by an eligible student that is related to
- 13 transportation necessary for the eligible student to participate in
- 14 a career and technical preparation program under this act.
- 15 (15) The legislature shall appropriate funds to the department
- 16 of treasury for making payments required to be made by the
- 17 department of treasury under this act.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect October
- **19** 1, 2019.
