## **HOUSE BILL NO. 4056**

January 16, 2019, Introduced by Reps. Anthony, Slagh, Bolden, Brixie, Hood, Frederick, Ellison, Calley, Gay-Dagnogo, Cynthia Johnson, Kennedy, Garza, Brenda Carter, Hope, Elder, Sabo, Robinson, Coleman and Leutheuser and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 2014 PA 462, entitled

"An act to allow peace officers to carry and administer opioid antagonists in certain circumstances; to provide access to opioid antagonists by law enforcement agencies and peace officers; and to limit the civil and criminal liability of law enforcement agencies and peace officers for the possession, distribution, and use of opioid antagonists under certain circumstances,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 28.541).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- (a) "Law enforcement agency" means an entity of this state or
  of a local unit of government of this state that employs peace
  officers.
- (b) "Opioid antagonist" means naloxone hydrochloride or any
   other similarly acting and equally safe drug approved by the
   federal food and drug administration Food and Drug Administration
   for the treatment of drug overdose.
- 9 (c) "Opioid-related overdose" means a condition, including,
  10 but not limited to, extreme physical illness, decreased level of
  11 consciousness, respiratory depression, coma, or death, that results
  12 from the consumption or use of an opioid or another substance with
  13 which an opioid was combined or that a reasonable person would
  14 believe to be an opioid-related overdose that requires medical
  15 assistance.
- 16 (d) "Peace officer" means 1 or more of the following:
- 17 (i) A regularly employed member of a law enforcement agency
  18 authorized and established under law, including common law, who is
  19 responsible for the prevention and detection of crime and the
  20 enforcement of the general criminal laws of this state. Peace
  21 officer does not include a person serving solely because he or she
  22 occupies any other office or position.
- (ii) A law enforcement officer of a Michigan Indian tribal police force.
- 25 (iii) The sergeant at arms or any assistant sergeant at arms of 26 either house of the legislature who is commissioned as a police 27 officer by that respective house of the legislature as provided by 28 the legislative sergeant at arms police powers act, 2001 PA 185, 29 MCL 4.381 to 4.382.

- $\mathbf{1}$  (*iv*) A law enforcement officer of a multicounty metropolitan district.
- 3 (v) A police officer or public safety officer of a community
  4 college, college, or university who is authorized by the governing
  5 board of that community college, college, or university to enforce
  6 state law and the rules and ordinances of that community college,
- state law and the rules and ordinances of that community college
- 7 college, or university.
- 8 (vi) A local corrections officer as that term is defined in 9 section 2 of the local corrections officers training act, 2003 PA 10 125, MCL 791.532.
- (vii) A state correctional officer as that term is defined in section 2 of the correctional officers' training act of 1982, 1982 PA 415, MCL 791.502.
- 14 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
  15 after the date it is enacted into law.
