A bill to create the standards for responding to federal immigration holds act; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "standards for responding to federal immigration holds act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Eligible for release from custody" means that the
 5 individual may be released from custody because 1 of the following
 6 events has occurred:





- (i) All criminal charges against the individual have been
 dropped or dismissed.
- $oldsymbol{3}$ (ii) The individual has been acquitted of all criminal charges filed against him or her.
- 5 (iii) The individual has served all the time required for his or 6 her sentence.
- 7 (iv) The individual has posted a bond.
- 8 (ν) The individual is otherwise eligible for release under 9 state or local law or local policy.
- 10 (b) "Immigration hold" means an immigration detainer issued by
 11 an authorized immigration officer, under 8 CFR 287.7, that requests
 12 that the law enforcement official maintain custody of the
 13 individual for a period not to exceed 48 hours, excluding
 14 Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, and to advise the authorized
 15 immigration officer prior to the release of that individual.
 - (c) "Law enforcement official" means a state or local law enforcement agency or officer authorized to enforce criminal statutes, regulations, or local ordinances or to operate a jail or to maintain custody of individuals in a jail, and any person or local agency authorized to operate a juvenile detention facility or to maintain custody of individuals in a juvenile detention facility.
 - Sec. 3. A law enforcement official shall not continue to detain an individual after that individual becomes eligible for release from custody on the basis of the immigration hold without a judicial determination that probable cause exists to believe that the individual committed a crime in this state made within 48 hours of the initial detainment.
