A bill to amend 1976 PA 453, entitled "Elliott-Larsen civil rights act,"

by amending section 103 (MCL 37.2103), as amended by 1999 PA 202.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 103. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Age" means chronological age except as otherwise provided
- 3 by law.
- 4 (b) "Commission" means the civil rights commission established
- 5 by section 29 of article V of the state constitution of 1963.





- 1 (c) "Commissioner" means a member of the commission.
- 2 (d) "Department" means the department of civil rights or its3 employees.
- 4 (e) "Familial status" means 1 or more individuals under the
 5 age of 18 residing with a parent or other person having custody or
 6 in the process of securing legal custody of the individual or
 7 individuals or residing with the designee of the parent or other
 8 person having or securing custody, with the written permission of
 9 the parent or other person. For purposes of this definition,
- 10 "parent" includes a person who is pregnant.
- 11 (f) "National origin" includes the national origin of an
 12 ancestor.
- (g) "Person" means an individual, agent, association,
 corporation, joint apprenticeship committee, joint stock company,
 labor organization, legal representative, mutual company,
 partnership, receiver, trust, trustee in bankruptcy, unincorporated
 organization, the state or a political subdivision of the state or
 an agency of the state, or any other legal or commercial entity.
- (h) "Political subdivision" means a county, city, village,
 township, school district, or special district or authority of the
 state.
- (i) "Race" is inclusive of traits historically associated with race, including, but not limited to, hair texture and protective hairstyles. For purposes of this definition, "protective hairstyles" includes, but is not limited to, such hairstyles as braids, locks, and twists.
- (j) (i) Discrimination because of sex includes sexual
 harassment. Sexual harassment means unwelcome sexual advances,
 requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct or



1 communication of a sexual nature under the following conditions:

- (i) Submission to the conduct or communication is made a term or condition either explicitly or implicitly to obtain employment, public accommodations or public services, education, or housing.
- (ii) Submission to or rejection of the conduct or communication by an individual is used as a factor in decisions affecting the individual's employment, public accommodations or public services, education, or housing.
- 9 (iii) The conduct or communication has the purpose or effect of substantially interfering with an individual's employment, public accommodations or public services, education, or housing, or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive employment, public accommodations, public services, educational, or housing environment.
