A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 5511 (MCL 324.5511) and by adding section 5506b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 5506b. The department shall not issue a permit, including
- 2 a modification to a permit, for which public notice is required
- 3 under section 5511(3) if both of the following apply:





- 1 (a) The permit would increase the maximum allowable amount of 2 any emission.
- (b) The legislative body of the municipality where the source 3 of the emissions is located or proposed to be located submits to 4 5 the department a resolution finding that an increase of emissions 6 to the new maximum allowable amounts would adversely affect the 7 public health in the vicinity of the source and requesting that the 8 permit not be issued. The municipality shall submit the resolution 9 described in this subdivision to the department before the 10 expiration of the public comment period under section 5511(3).

11 Sec. 5511. (1) The department shall establish and maintain a list of all applications for permits submitted pursuant to sections 12 5505 and 5506. The list shall report the status of each 13 14 application. The information on the list shall be updated by the 15 department on a monthly basis. The department shall send a copy of 16 the pertinent sections of the list to the chairperson of the county 17 board of commissioners of each county. Any other person may 18 subscribe to this list on a countywide or statewide basis and shall 19 reimburse the department for the costs of copying, handling, and 20 mailing. The department shall make the list available at district 21 offices selected by the department. The department may also develop 22 an electronic data base database that includes the capability is 23 capable of making this list available to the public. This list 24 shall include all of the following information:

- (a) The name of the permit applicant.
- (b) The street address, if available, the county, and the municipality in which the source is located or proposed to be located.

- 2 (d) The date the permit application was received by the3 department.
- 4 (e) The date when the permit application is determined to be5 administratively complete, if applicable.
 - (f) A brief description of the source, process, or process equipment covered by the permit application.
 - (g) Brief pertinent comments regarding the progress of the permit application, including the dates of public comment periods and public hearings, if applicable.
- 11 (2) The department shall establish and maintain, and update 12 monthly, a list of all proposed consent order public notices. This 13 information shall be updated by the department on a monthly basis. 14 Any other person may subscribe to this list on a countywide or 15 statewide basis and shall reimburse the department for the costs of 16 copying, handling, and mailing. The department shall make the list 17 available at district offices selected by the department. This list shall include all of the following information: 18
 - (a) The name of the parties to the proposed consent order.
- 20 (b) The street address, if available, and the county and21 municipality in which the source is located.
 - (c) A brief description of the source.
- (d) A brief description of the alleged violation to beresolved by the proposed consent order.
 - (e) A brief description of the respondent's position regarding the alleged violation if the respondent requests such inclusion and supplies to the department a brief statement of the respondent's position regarding the alleged violation.
 - (3) The department shall not issue a permit to install or a

- 20 opportunity for public comment and a public hearing or public
- 21 meeting as required under this section shall be provided as
- 22 follows:
- 23 (a) Public notice shall be provided by publication in a
- 24 newspaper of general circulation in the area where the source is
- 25 located or in a state publication designed to give general public
- 26 notice, and by other means determined to be necessary by the
- 27 department to assure ensure adequate notice to the public. Notice
- 28 shall also be provided to persons all of the following:
- 29 (i) Persons on a mailing list, developed by the department,

- 3 (ii) Any other person who requests in writing to be notified of4 a permit action involving a specific source.
 - (iii) If the permit, including a modification to a permit, will increase the allowable amount of emissions, the legislative body of the municipality in which the source of the emissions is located or proposed to be located.
 - (b) The notice shall identify the source; the name and address of the responsible official; the mailing address of the department; the activity or activities involved in the proposed permit action or consent order; the emissions change involved in any significant permit modification; the name, address, and telephone number of a representative of the department from whom interested persons may obtain additional information, including copies of the draft permit or proposed consent order, the application, all relevant supporting material, and any other materials available to the department that are relevant to the permit or consent order decision; a brief description of the comment procedures required by this section; and the time and place of any public hearing or public meeting that may be held, including a statement of the procedures to request a public hearing or public meeting.
 - (c) The department shall provide at least 30-90 days for public comment and shall give notice of any public hearing or public meeting at least 30 days in advance of the hearing.

 27 the issues raised during the public comment period and public
 28 hearing or public meeting, if held, and shall make these records
 29 shall be available to the public.
